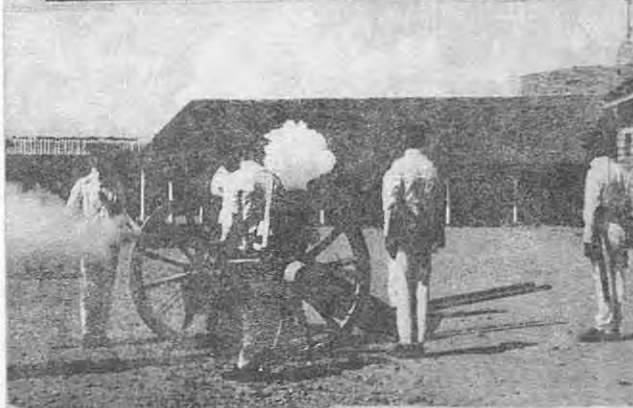
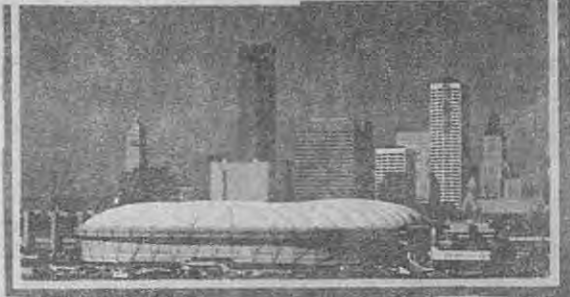

Edward Easton. A memorial service will be held at 10am on Thursday, June 21st, at All Souls Episcopal Church for Edward Easton Soule, 60, who died June 16th while vacationing in Holland. He was born February 22, 1924, in Temple TX, and moved to Oklahoma City in 1933. He attended Culbertson Grade School, Webster Junior High, and graduated from Central High School in 1941 where he was a member of the honor society, the Jeffersonian Debating Society, and president of the student council. He attended the University of Oklahoma from 1941 to 1943 and from 1945 to 1947, graduating in 1947 from the OU College of Law with a Bachelor of Law Degree. He was a member of the Order of Coif, Phi Delta Phi and Phi Beta Sigma; and was a recipient of the Bledsoe award at

the OU College of Law in 1947. He was in military service from 1943 to 1945 with the 99th Infantry Division and was captured by the German 12th SS Panzer Division on December 18, 1944, in the Battle of the Bulge. He was a prisoner of war in Germany until a third and successful escape try on April 14, 1945. Following his return to the United States, he became the first former prisoner of war to be awarded a competitive appointment to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, but did not attend due to a physical condition resulting from treatment while a prisoner of war. He has been engaged in the general practice of law in Oklahoma City since 1947 with the firm of Keaton, Wells, Johnston and Lytle, now named Lytle, Soule, Curlee, Harrington, Chandler and Van Dyke. His inception date of employment was June 14, 1938, as the firm office boy. At the time of his death, he was senior partner. He was engaged primarily in corporate law, labor relations law, probate law, and general trial

Court of the United States, the Supreme Court of Oklahoma, and numerous district courts and courts of appeals. He was a member of the American Bar Association, American Judicature Society, the Oklahoma Bar Association, and the Oklahoma County Bar Association. He was a Fellow of the American College of Probate Counsel. He was a director of Scrivners, Inc., the First National Bank and Trust Company of Oklahoma City, and the Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce. He was a former trustee of Baptist Medical Center and a former Trustee of Cassidy Highschool. Survivors, besides his wife Nancy, include his daughter, Margo Soule, of Kansas City MO., son Kent Soule of San Francisco and a brother, P.J. Soule of Oklahoma City. "Enclosed is a copy of an obituary from the Brunswick, Maine, Times Record detailing the death of Henchman Sylvester Soule of Freeport, Maine. As is often the case, some of the more important information does not find its way into such notices, and such was the case in this instance. One of Hank's proudest associations was with the Soule Kindred. His status as a ninth generation direct descendant of George Soule gave him ongoing pleasure and a link to the past which he treasured.

"To fill in a few blanks, I might add that one of his sisters, Kathryn Soule Kenney, passed away some years ago and is buried in Concord, NH. His other sister, Louise Lincoln Soule, recently celebrated her 78th birthday and continues to work full time as a travel agent. She is more interested in the present and the future than in the past, and it seems that as her son I tend to be similarly oriented."

FREEPORT — Henchman S. Soule, 75, of Beech Hill Road, died today, Sept. 12, in a Brunswick hospital.

He was born in Freeport, May 12, 1909, son of Guy and Mary Jane McChesney Soule.

He was educated in Freeport schools and was a Navy veteran of World War II.

He was a member of the AmVets Post 10 and the Freeport Historical Society. He was a carpenter and had worked for several construction companies, including Gibson Construction Co., from which he retired in 1974.

He is survived by his wife, Margaret Hayward Soule of Freeport; a sister, Louise L. Soule of New York City, and a nephew.

I have a note in my files, "SARAH SOULE, first wife of SILAS DEUEL (Devol) was killed by Indians, 1770". A further note, "DEUEL women were killed or captured in the Wyoming (New York) massacre". This combination of SARAH SOULE and SILAS DEUEL is not identified in Book 3, Mayflower Families, SOULE nor included in the SOULE index. Does anybody have a reference to this SARAH SOULE and/or SILAS DEUEL?

My grandmother, Sarah Jane Wright Craigue claimed that we were descendants from someone who came over on the Mayflower. Sarah Soule, one of George Soule's granddaughters, married Adam Wright. Does anyone have the lineage from Sarah Soule and Adam Wright to the present time? This is my lineage back to Oliver Wright: Ivan Clarence Peacock b. 1917 m. Martha Rose Soule; Ella Sarah Craigue b. 1888 m. Clarence Albert Peacock; Sarah Jane Wright b. 1873 m. Algernon Squires Craigue; Oliver Wright died ca 1875 m. Hester Belknap. 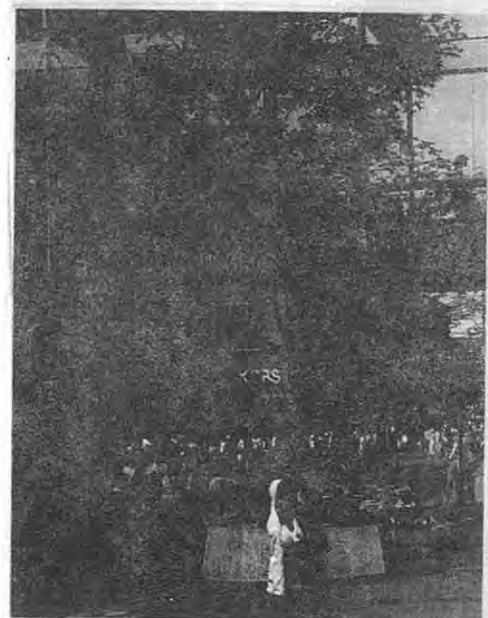

THE STORY OF GEORGE SOULE
by Mrs. Edwin S. Harris

STREETS OF LONDON 1620

Though it surprises most of us today, one of the most important streets of that time, was a center for the life of the town, a clearing house for gossip, and not a street at all. It was the middle aisle of St. Paul's Cathedral which by degrees had become less of a sacred building and rather a mixture of bank, market, and promenade. It was the rendezvous of the smart and flashy folk of the time. It was known by many of the people who visited it, as the Mediterraneo! George would'nt have missed a visit to Paul's Walk shortly after his arrival in London. St. Paul's was a huge building whose character was gossiped about even in the smallest village. "St. Paul's Walke" was a place not to be missed.

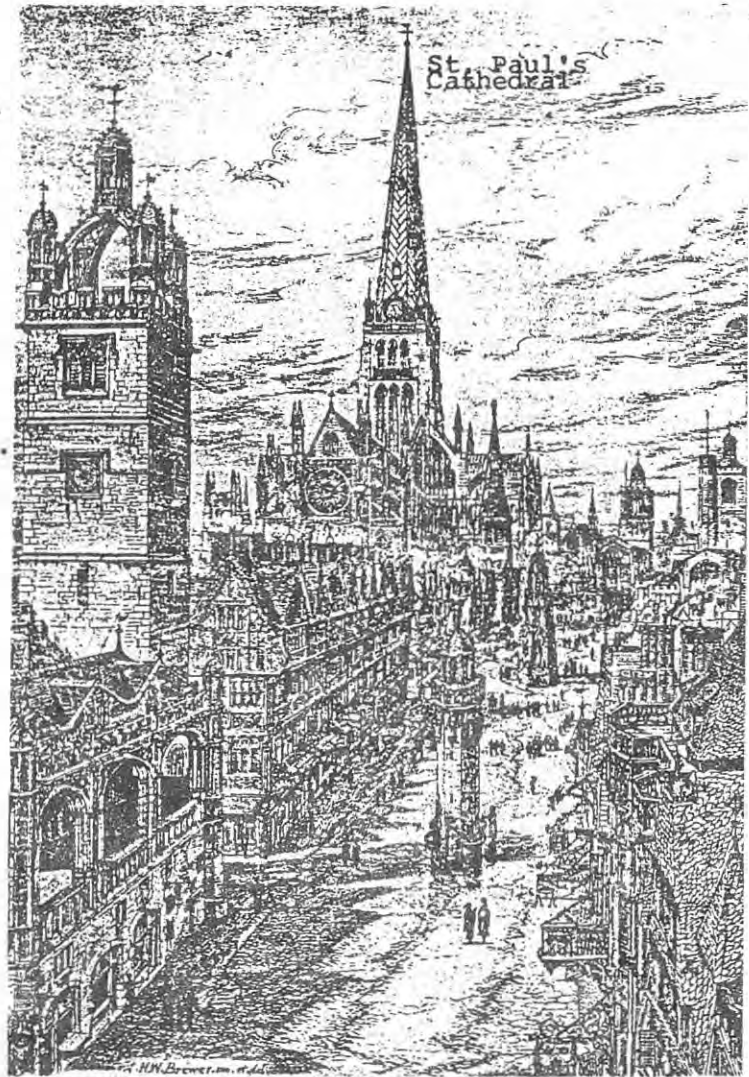
John Earle in his MICRO-COSMOGRAPHIC tells us that: (Earle, a chronicler)

".....the noise in the Cathedral is like that of bees, a strange humming or buzz mixed, of walking, tongues and feet; it is a kind of roar or loud whisper. It is the great exchange of all discourse, and no business whatever but is here stirring and afoot.....The best sign of a temple in it is that it is a sanctuary of thieves, which rob more safely in the crowd, than in the wilderness, whilst every searcher is a person to hide behind. The visitors were all men without exception, but the principals were stale Knights and Captains out of work; men of long rapiers and breeches, which bring merchants here and traffic for news."

Ben Jonson's, EVERY MAN OUT OF HIS HUMOR, has some scenes that take place in "Paul's Walke", in which the characters bring their dogs, and stick notices on the pillars for the wanting of servants. Porters and messengers claimed a sort of right-of-way through the Cathedral and some tradesmen even stabled their donkeys in the recesses. Every kind of business went on in the main walk. Money lenders and marriage brokers met their clients there, horses could be rented, and private Chaplains hired! Illiterates seeking letter writers knew to which pillar to go. Pick pockets were busy, as

confidence men looking for innocents from the country, and swaggering Captains looking out for some newly arrived man of means from whom, in return for their stories of fabulous exploits, they might get a free dinner and a bottle. The use of the Cathedral for these and other purposes continued until it lay in ruins after the Great Fire of 1666. George would have heard the news of the tragedy in New England. Christopher Wren replaced it the beautiful St.

London was a rough, raw dirty place what with filthy streets, except perhaps Cheapside which was used for Royal Festivities at times. There was bear bating, dog fights, cock fights, but also it was a place of gentler ways and pleasant vistas.

The English people have always cherished an uncomplicated love for the country. The townsmen even then reveled in the sentimental and scenic aspects of rural life and captured the trait in the town square. The London flower box is a bit of the country on a window sill.

There were touches of country in early London that helped to enliven and refresh the more drab streets that George wandered through.

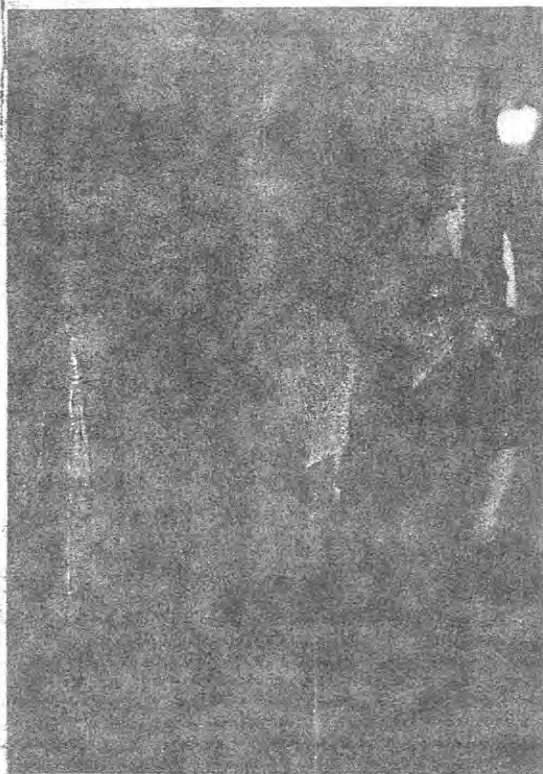
Every Sunday in Lent, the younger nobility and the citizens sons went out to the fields just north of Cheapside, and engaged in sports. There were all types of athletics including horse racing. In the summer time there were tennis, tilting at the quintain, and contests in leaping, archery, wrestling, and javelin throwing. For the girls there were dances set to different festivals of the year. In winter on the low area of Moorfields the young men enjoyed ice sports and a crude form of skating. The skates were the shin-bones of animals fixed under the boot. The well to do citizens shared with the courtiers the pastimes of hawking, hunting and rabbit catching, and of course, there was the theater, now becoming popular. In and about the churches they could witness miracle plays and something called, interludes. One interlude lasted eight days and presented the story of the Old and New Testaments from Creation onward! It seems that the leaping, wrestling and archery came in handy on that First Thanksgiving when the Indians were surprised at the ability of the English in those sports and games.

As George observed London he heard the sounds of many tongues, especially in Cheapside. The many shops offered not only English goods but the produce brought from abroad by foreign merchants. There was gold from Araby, spices from Italy, and armor from Scythia, gems from Egypt, furs from Russia and Norway, olive oil from Bagdad, and wine from France. Along the river these foreign merchants had their warehouses, and the street scene was as cosmopolitan as today. French, Genoese, Lombards, and Venetians and Germans, as well as Flemings were a great part of London streets.

Think of the many memories of scenes in this interesting city that George took with him to his new home in the wilderness. He was rich with tales to tell his children on cold winter nights, sitting about the cozy fire. Unless they made the journey across the wide sea, his children would never know the great stone cathedrals and aged castles as he had known them. Their's was to be a quieter life free from the strife of England in that day. But how fortunate for George Soule that he in his life time had the opportunity to witness both the teeming city and the wilderness, and gain in depth for having done so.

Florida Living Center News

Pastor Joseph Soule chaired a recent vesper program in the Fritsche Chapel and presented his daughter-in-law, Pia Soule, who was narrator for the beautiful illustrated slide presentation by Larry Soule on the tropical Island of Curacao in the Caribbean. Curacao is the largest of the six Netherland Antilles Islands which was captured by Holland in 1634.

The people from fifty different countries brought their own culture, but live in harmony and formed their new Antillean culture.

Papiamentu, a combination of many languages, is the native tongue, but the schools teach Dutch. English and Spanish are spoken by nearly everyone. This island just 35 miles north of Venezuela, is a land of contrasts with beaches coral, fisherman, high cliffs, volcanic rock and towering cacti.

Some of the more delicate cacti with beautiful flowers so fascinated the tourists that they became an endangered species. They are now protected and forbidden to be picked.

The pictures were so beautiful of many flowering shrubs and trees--the various colors of bougainvillea, flamboyant trees and many exotic flowers in the gardens. Some parts of the island are covered by beautiful shade trees, the divi-divi tree, characteristic of the Netherland Antilles grow as they are blown by the tradewinds, they always point southwest.

Most of the island's 160,000 people live in Willemstad, the picturesque capital.

The Punda, the oldest part of Willemstad, is the shopping and business area and has shops to attract the tourists with linen, china, watches, perfume, dutch cheese, etc. Open at night and well lighted, the pastel-color buildings with architectural designs borrowed from the Dutch create a most unusual picture.

Curacao boasts a natural harbor, the finest and busiest in the Caribbean where boats from all over the world dock. It also has the largest drydock in the Western Hemisphere.

The Royal Shell operates one of the largest oil refineries in the world, which, after being refined is shipped all over the world

from this terminal and others on the island. Tourism is the second biggest industry and many cruise ships stop there.

The retirement family was delighted with the pictures of Curacao and to learn that there are two hospitals on the island--one was bought by the Seventh-day Adventists in 1970 from the government.

This is a modern hospital in a beautiful garden setting. It has 35 beds, a well equipped nursery with pink and blue bassinets and an incubator. They often have 10 or more babies at one time. The operating room is equipped with the latest equipment and they do about 60 surgeries a month including various eye sur-

geries. The laboratory handles all the routine lab tests and uses a high-powered modern microscope.

The dietary kitchen serves nutritious vegetarian meals to the patients with the special diet needs in mind. For many patients, this is their first vegetarian meal and they ask for recipes and other health remedies. The employees bring their lunches to eat in an attractive dining room provided for them. There is a clinic right across from the hospital to serve outpatients with two and three doctors and nurses and secretaries.

It was of interest to know that there are 10 Seventh-day Adventist churches on the island with a membership of 2,300. Besides the native churches, there is a Dutch-speaking and English-speaking church.

The hospital patients often attend the Sabbath services which the chaplain conducts in the clinic building. Services are held in English and in Papiamentu, the native language.

This program was of special interest in that Pia Soule is the

daughter of the administrator of the hospital in Curaco, Peter Jorgensen. Pia came of missionary parents and grew up in Africa. Her husband, Larry Soule in charge of the physiotherapy department at Florida Hospital/Altamonte, is the son of Pastor Joseph Soule of the Florida Living Church. The Soule family spent many years in India.


PAST PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE
