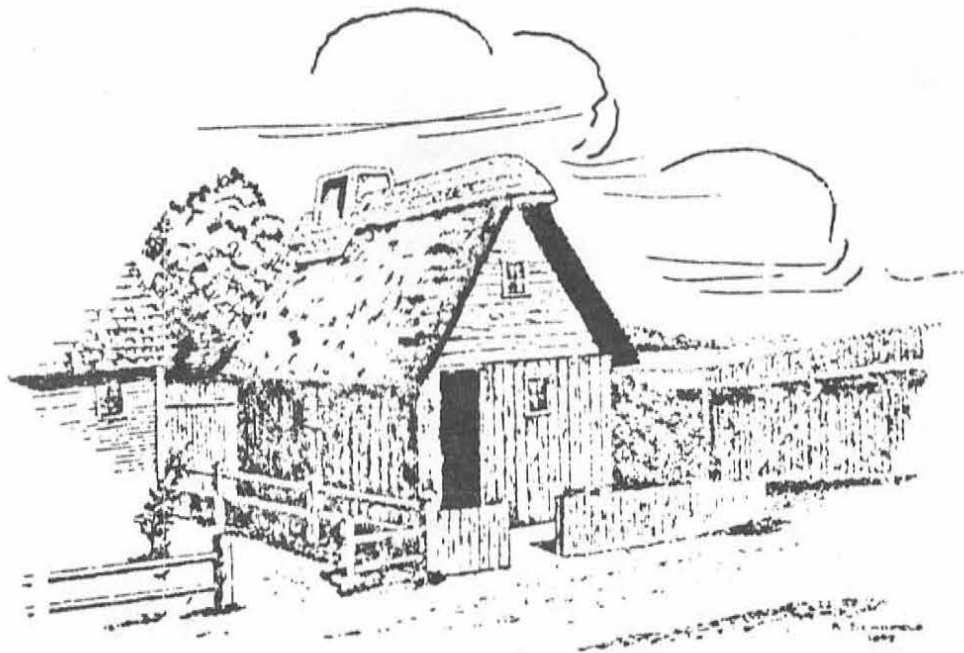

Happy New Year. May the grace and peace of God be of, in, and around your households in the New Year.

Our Kindred organization continues to be one place where those seeking to complete their lines to George Soule and Mary Becket (Bucket) can look for assistance. The resources of the Soule Kindred are available to all genealogists, amateur and professional, working on lines. I am reminded once again, after receiving mail, solicitations offering complete Soule family history, coat of arms and names of individuals named Soule for a price, all bound in a volume. The one I've seen this year just past, mailed to a hapless Soule who believed it would provide a printed record of his own line, was highly disappointed. He himself did not appear in the record, and the "History" of the Soule name and family failed to even mention a Mayflower connection. Some oversight! Nothing can replace sound, professional research.

These commercial efforts, though of some curiosity value, generally fall far short of substantive genealogical purpose, and particularly is this true to those Mayflower descendants--proven and yet to be proved--in lines back to the known two dozen Mayflower passengers with proven descendants down to the present time. No effort is offered for the female lines (terribly chauvenistic), though presenting an entire new set of problems, are, and always will be, regarded as valid as those of today who descend the entire line down through the male issue, hence retaining the Pilgrim's surname throughout their line. We invite all to utilize the services of our Family Historians in matters of lineage to George Soule.

We have been in contact with our Soule cousins in Iowa, Bud and Helen Gallentine, hosts of our 1989 Reunion. Plans and preparations are underway for our visit to Des Moines, Iowa. This city, which has undergone dramatic change in the past few years, will surprise many who have not been to this town in the recent past. We will be headquartered in the heart of downtown, convenient to shopping, dining and entertainment. See you in Des Moines in 1989. Registration material will appear in our Spring and Summer issues.

We exchanged "Soule talk" the balance of the afternoon at the buffet and at our motor inn.

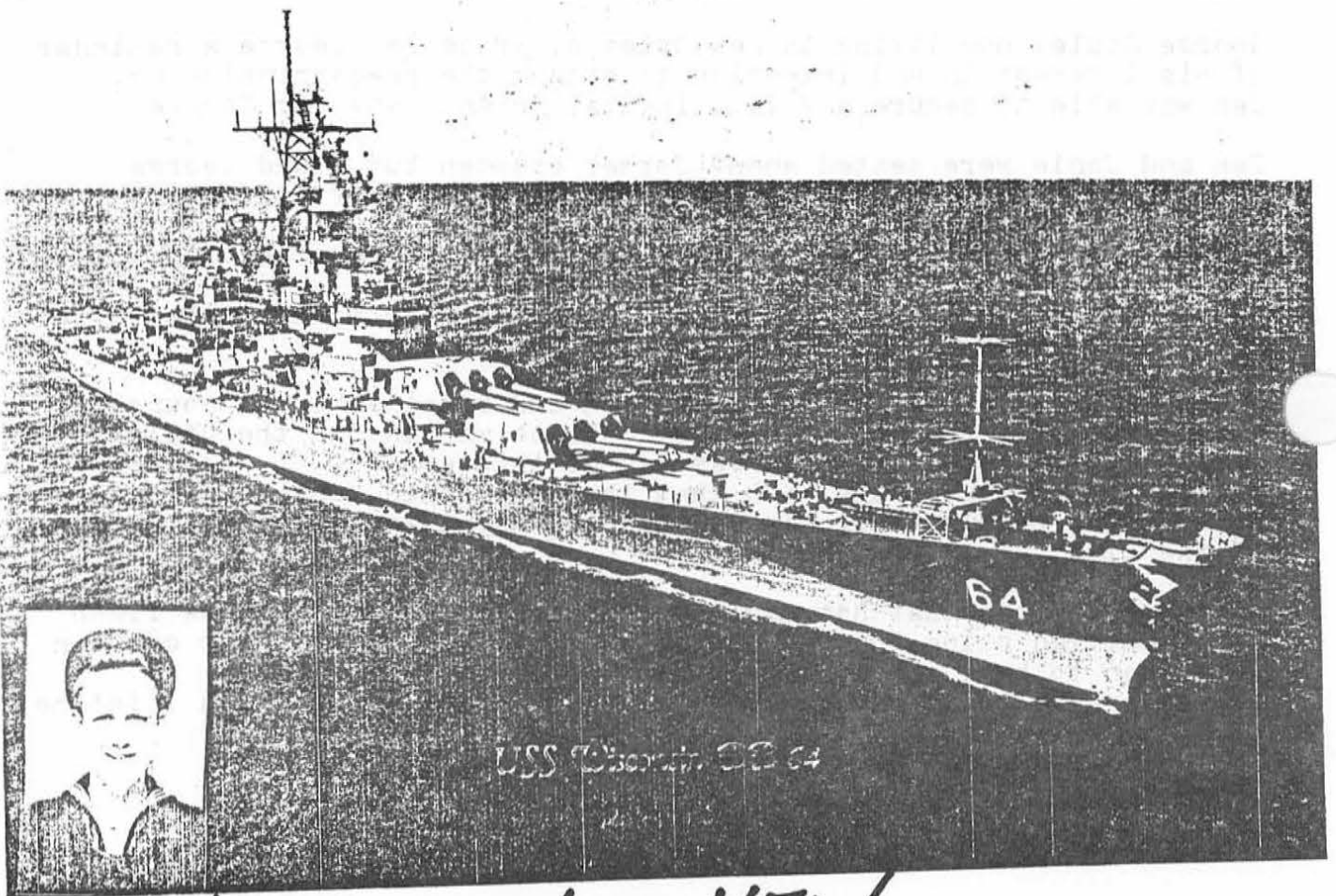

Award presented

The Longhorn Council of the Boy Scouts of America posthumously awarded to Aaron Bruce Soule of Keller the highest conservation award they can offer, the William T. Hornaday Award.

Commendations Aaron received include letters from President Ronald Reagan, Vice-President George Bush, Texas Governor Bill Clements, the Secretary of the Interior and the Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation. Some of the conservation organizations which recommended Aaron for the award are the Fort Worth Nature Center

and Refuge, the Phoenix Society — for rehabilitation of injured wild birds — and Ducks Unlimited.

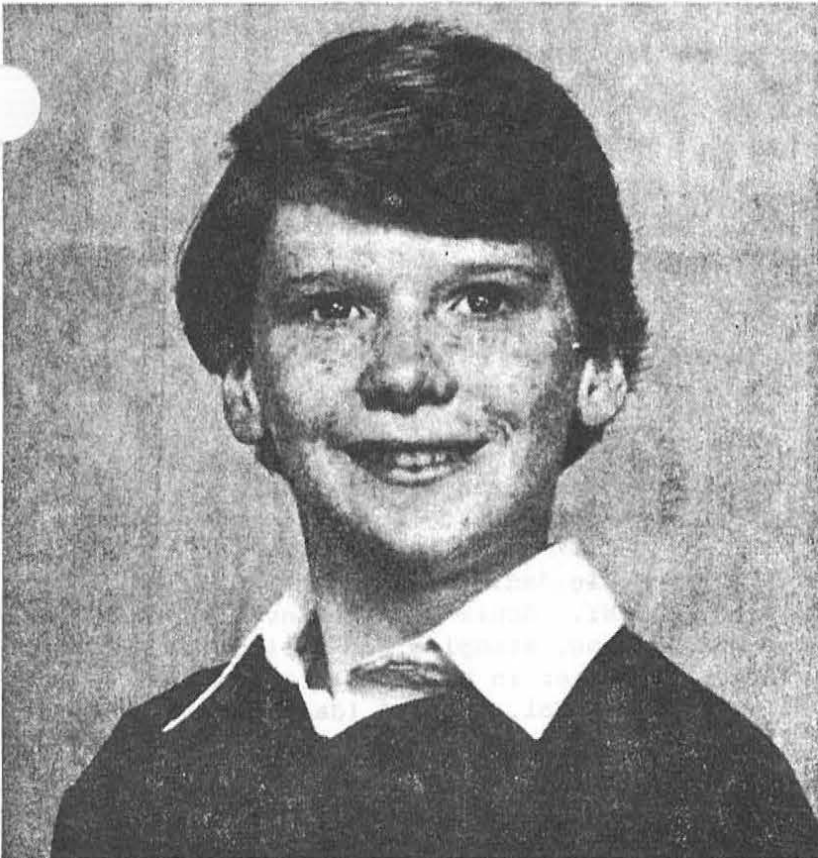
Aaron Bruce Soule, the son of Ron and Debi Soule of Keller, died June 20, 1987. He is the first Scout to receive such an award in the Longhorn Council of the Boy Scouts of America and is the only individual in the United States to have ever received the award posthumously.

Established in 1914 by naturalist William T. Hornaday, the William T. Hornaday Award recognizes outstanding achievement in the protection of the environment and wildlife.

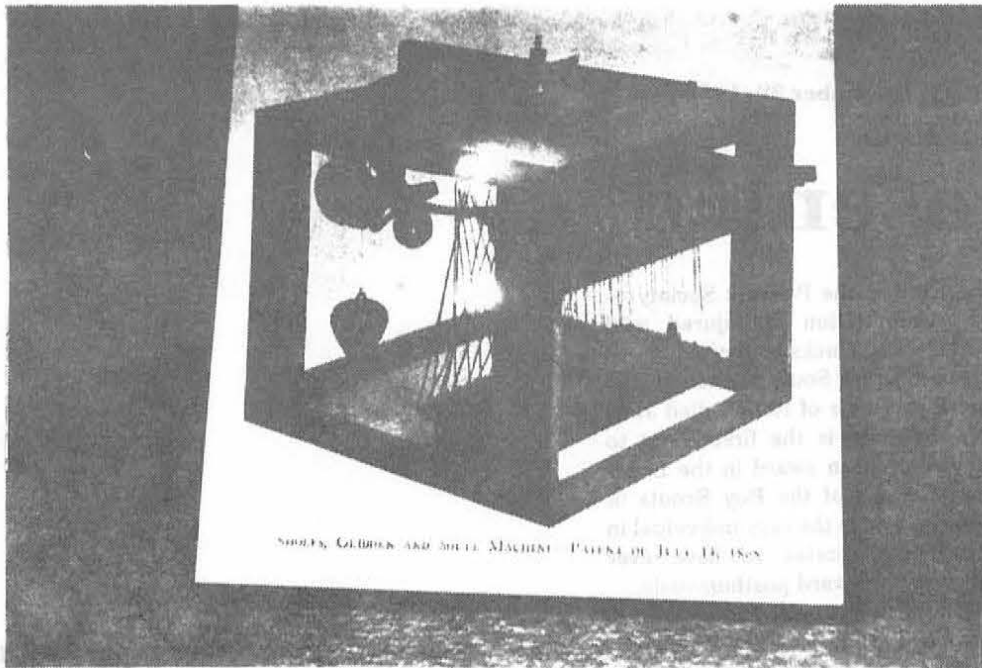

This photograph shows what is presumably the original Sholes-Glidden-Soule typewriter. Previously, in SK Vol IV, #1 (Jan 1970), the only version of the machine we had seen was a small sketch of a piano-like box.

Samuel W. Soule assisted Christopher Latham Sholes with Carlos Glidden in the invention of the first working typewriter in 1867. Soule was a scientific mechanic and suggested many practical functions for a working typewriter, including a moving carriage, a spacer, an inked ribbon and winding ribbon spools. The first Sholes-Glidden-Soule machine was patented in 1868. Soule reportedly sold his interests in the typewriter by 1873.

Soule was born to Elisha and Clarissa Willard Soule Jan. 25, 1830 in Pompey, NY, and died July 25, 1875 in Brooklyn, NY. Soule was the inventor of several machines including one for paper-cutting, stamping and agricultural implements. The report of an historical marker in Milwaukee to commemorate the invention of the typewriter is in SK Vol. XXI, #1 (Jan 1987)

Toni sent in two biographies that she found among her mother's papers on a pioneer, San Francisco editor, Frank Soulé. Our California cousins should take note--the two biographies have been forwarded to Historian Dr. Terry.

Frank Soulé was born Jan. 17, 1810. After graduating from Wesleyan College in 1838, Soulé moved South to Mississippi to teach at Halsey Academy. Soulé became the editor of the town newspaper, the Woodville Republican. His career as a newspaperman was just beginning.

Soulé's wife Mary Pierson Hand (Bridgehampton, NY) died in 1848. Soulé moved onto New Orleans (leaving son Frank, B. 1845, with a grandmother in Woodville) and became an editor on the New Orleans Mercury. It was from here that the news of California gold fields reached him, so off he went.

Soulé led a varied life upon reaching California. After spending a year at Sullivan's Camp (near one of the richest deposits of gold in the Sonora District), Soulé moved on to San Francisco in 1850. He became a temporary editor of the Alta California for a year, after which he ran for the State Senate on the Whig ticket, representing San Francisco County. In this capacity, he served as chair of the Education Committee for 1852.

During these years, Soulé collaborated on a work known as "Annals of San Francisco" with Nisbet and Gihon. Soulé's aspirations for San Francisco are detailed in this work. As he wrote of the "newly arriving men who had brought with them from the East some knowledge of printing, of journalism, and of publication, and who, when tired of mining and related business ventures, turned to the newspapers in search of opportunities for swift returns on small investments.", Soulé was helping evidence the presence of men just like himself who managed to find livelihoods in California when the uncertainties of the gold mines ran out.

In 1853, Soulé began the California Chronicle, a daily that prospered in its' heyday through 1855 and then went on the decline after opposition from city committees who disliked it's Republican slant in a time of Democratic victories. Soulé left the Chronicle in 1856, and went to Australia.

He returned, of course, and by the time Lincoln entered the White House, Soulé was the leading editor to the San Francisco Times. In 1861, his career took a swing back into government and he accepted a position in the Customs House. In 1865, just before the assassination of Lincoln, the President appointed him collector of the Internal Revenue for the San Francisco district. By 1872, Soulé accepted the editorship of the Alta California and remained there for several years before taking an appointment in the United States Mint.

Soulé died in San Francisco on July 3, 1882, survived by his second wife, Eunice Frostena Soulé, and two children, Charles and Kathleen.

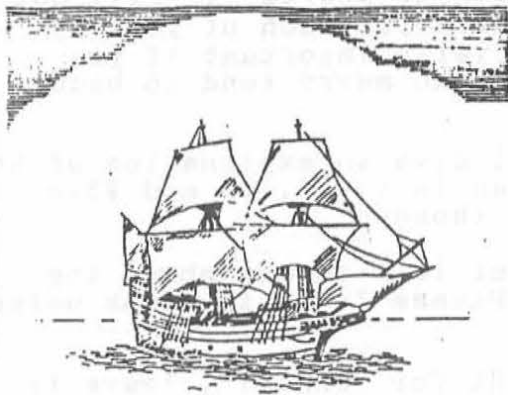

The book was published for distribution to members of Soule Kindred who visited Eckington in May 1986; Mr. Wilkes gave permission to Soule Kindred to reproduce the book for distribution in the United States. The reproduction is an 8 1/2 x 11 paper bound book of 71 pages. THE COST INCLUDING POSTAGE AND HANDLING IS \$10.00.

RECORDING OF FAMILY DATA
By Geraldine Soule Schlosser

We have been asked why the Family Data Chart is printed in each issue of the Newsletter. One of the objectives of Soule Kindred is the gathering of information pertaining to the descendants of Pilgrim George Soule. Mayflower Families 3 covers the first 5 generations, to about 1800. Our families did a lot of moving around in the 19th century, and you can help locate migration patterns for family groups. Our historian may be able to help you with that "missing link". So please keep the information coming.

We would like to suggest that you begin with your sixth generation ancestor from George Soule (or your earliest Soule ancestor, if you haven't made the connection to George¹). Fill out a form for that ancestor, and then submit forms for each of your ancestors down to yourself. This is especially important if you descend through a female line; Soule women who marry tend to become lost Soules.

For the benefit of new members, we'll give an explanation of how to fill out the form. Samples were printed in V. 20, #2 and #3-- April and July, if you'd like to refer to those.

(1) The "Generation" space in the upper left corner shows the generation from the immigrant ancestor. Please leave it blank unless you are certain.

(2) In the far upper space on the right for "FAMILY", leave it blank if the surname of "Soule Descendant" is SOULE, SOWLE, or variants, because we'll assign a code number for closely related family groups. If the "Soule Descendant" has a different surname, insert the name in the right upper space.

(3) The next two lines show the ancestors of the "Soule Descendant" back to George Soule¹. Unless you have an approved Mayflower Lineage or other positive proof, we suggest this be left blank.

(4) When writing dates, follow the genealogical style-- first the day in numbers, then the month in letters, and the full year, such as 6 Feb 1833.

(5) When listing children on the reverse side, put in as much information as you can-- such as spouse's parents, if known.

(6) List your name and address as compiler unless someone else gathers the information. We may need to contact the compiler.

(7) It is VERY important to list sources of data; if the information comes from a family Bible or other record, a photocopy of the information should be included. Other sources, such as Vital Records from towns or states, and census should be indicated.

(8) Leave "Verification" blank for our purposes.

(9) Please give as many clues as possible to facilitate further research. If you are uncertain about a date, enter it, but add "circa" or "ca". For questionable place names, add "possibly" or "probably".

Dear Julia Soule,

Recently, I ran across an item relating to a "Soule" person that was published in our local Democrat & Chronicle Newspaper along with a picture of the house that he had built for him and his family. I am sending some excerpts from the article in the paper and a picture of his house, thinking that some member of the Soule Family In America may be able to identify their heritage with this man. Some information was also obtained from the Rochester Landmark Society, and I have also some information about his son Wilson Soule available.

Asa Soule was the first on the scene with his patent medicines in Rochester, New York in the mid 1800's. He mixed together a random concoction, bottled it, and labeled "Soules Hop Bitters, The Invalid's Friend and Hope", and began advertising it nationwide. Within six years, he had made his first million dollars.

He never considered himself as a doctor or a quack, but as a business man. He also had a lot of competition, locally from Mr. Warner's Safe Cure Company.

Asa Soule was also interested in baseball, because in 1878, he backed a local team by buying the players' uniforms and equipment, the ball park was named Hope Bitters Park. however, the next year, after his team lost 12 games, the manager ran off with the money.

Asa Soule recouped his losses somehow, and died in 1890 at the age of 65.

During his lifetime, he was a colorful person in Rochester.

I hope that the above information may be of interest to someone, especially if this info has not surfaced before now.
