MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING 8/19/89

The meeting was called to order by the President, James Soule at 8:00 PM with the following Board members present: James I. Soule, President; Geraldine Sowle Schlosser, First Vice President; Betty Jean Haner, Treasurer; Charles Jack Sowles, Associate Historian; Christine Schlosser, Membership Secretary; Julia Soule, Newsletter Editor; Jim Schlosser, Newsletter Indexer; Helen R. Galletine, Mary Soule Kelly, and Bonnie Jeanne Wochnick, Class of 1989; Norman Soule', Class of 1990; Eloise Soule Nielsen, Ben George Soule, and Margaret Soule Turner, Class of 1991.

The President announced that he had received a letter from Marian O'Connell in which she submitted her resignation as Secretary to the Board. She has become very active in the Mayflower Society and was unable to attend this reunion. He asked for a volunteer to take the minutes of this meeting and Chris Schlosser volunteered. The President called for the reading of the minutes of the 1988 Board meeting. Betty Jean Haner motioned that we dispense with the reading of the minutes as they were published in the October 1988 issue of the Soule Kindred Newsletter. Margaret Turner seconded and the motion carried.

The Treasurer presented an annual report through July 31, 1989 and an addenda listing some additional expenses presented since that date. The actual balance on hand was \$47,607.34. Margaret Turner made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as amended in the upcoming October newsletter. Helen Galletine seconded and the motion carried.

The Membership Secretary reported that we currently have 274 patron/sustaining/regular members and 78 life members for a total membership of 352. Norman Soule' motioned that we accept this report, Margaret Turner seconded and the motion carried.

The Historian reported that she has been indexing each roll of microfilm to aid anyone trying to use these. She has received some correspondence from Velma Terry and others through Betty Jean. She has responded to all letters received thus far. Betty Jean motioned to accept the Historian's report, Julia Soule seconded and the motion carried.

Julia Soule, Newsletter Editor, reported that the new thicker cover on the newsletter seems to be holding up better through the mail. She is currently mailing about 400 copies each quarter. At this time Gerry Schlosser motioned that the newsletter editor be given a money advance to cover the postage and printing expense. Ben George seconded and the motioned carried.

Under new business, several topics were brought up. There was a lengthy discussion about the disposition of the Soule Kindred archives. Gerry Schlosser moved that the archives be deposited with the New England Historical and Genealogical Manuscript Department located in Boston Massachusetts. Betty Jean seconded. Gerry felt that since we now have the microfilm available for use within Soule Kindred, these documents should be preserved for future generations and available to others. NE Historical and Genealogical Society has a very good reputation for the indexing and care of the materials it possesses. Jack Sowles strongly disagreed with this motion feeling that these are our records and they should be kept within the Kindred. He prefers to have the actual document to look at in doing research rather than using microfilm. He made a substitute motion that all archives be delivered by the Kindred to the historian and it would be his/her responsibility to maintain those records. There was no second for his motion. A vote was taken on the original motion and passed. Jim Soule, Betty Jean, and Gerry will take inventory of the Soule Kindred archives retained by Milton Terry sometime this fall. Some of the material is not of an archival nature (books) and these items would be retained by the Historian.

The next topic was Life Membership fees. Chris Schlosser moved that the life membership fee be set at \$200 starting in 1990. Betty Jean seconded and the motion carried. Betty Jean moved that the interest from these Life Membership fees be set aside exclusively for scholarships. This was seconded by Ben George. In the discussion which followed, Gerry and Chris Schlosser felt this was too limiting since one never knows when we may need to use these funds to keep the kindred functioning. Gerry presented an amendment to this motion stating that the directors may from time to time use a part or all of the interest for operating expenses as needed. This amendment was seconded by Peggy Turner and the motion carried as amended.

The next item on the agenda was ratification of appointed offices and election of officers.

The Historian is an appointive office and upon the death of Dr. Milton Terry, Jim Soule had appointed Gerry Schlosser. Chris Schlosser motioned that we ratify this appointment. Betty Jean Haner seconded, and the motion carried.

Chris Schlosser suggested that the office of Membership Secretary be combined with the Office of Treasurer and both functions be handled by Betty Jean. This met with general agreement.

Chris then volunteered to serve as Secretary to the Board for 1990 and the board ratified this appointment.

Julia Soule presented her resignation effective next summer. Her continued appointment was ratified by the Board but we will be needing a new editor by our next reunion. Anyone interested in this position, please contact Jim Soule.

The continued appointment of Jack Sowles as Associate Historian was ratified by the Board. Jack made a motion that we add a second Associate historian but this failed for lack of a second.

Jim Schlosser will continue as Newsletter Indexer and James Tiffin as Counselor.

Gerry Schlosser motioned that we retain Jim Soule as President. Mary Soule Kelly seconded. Eloise Nielsen moved to close the nominations and the motion carried.

Ron Soule was nominated by Julia Soule to serve as 1st Vice President and was elected by unanimous ballot.

Normon Soule' was nominated by Helen Galletine to serve as 2nd Vice President and was elected by unanimous ballot.

Betty Jean Haner was unanimously elected to serve as Treasurer/Membership Secretary.

Betty Jean motioned that we re-elect the Class of 1989 for the Class of 1992. Helen Galletine removed herself from consideration. Mary Soule Kelly, Bonnie Wochnick and Stan Soule were nominated and unanimously elected for the Class of 1992.

Various other topics were discussed as follows:

- Jack Sowles felt that the membership has no voice in Soule Kindred. He would like to see amendments to the bylaws made via the newsletter rather than by the board. He also thought we need a publicity director to "toot our own horn". These topics and others may be discussed at our next reunion.

- Jim Schlosser has completed a topical index to the newsletter. The availability of this will be advertised in the newsletter and members may purchase this at a price to cover copying and postage.

- Betty Jean reported that moving the office has definitely saved money. She has answered 101 letters since taking over the office.

The final topic was the 1990 reunion. Traditionally this would be held in Plymouth in conjunction with the Mayflower triennial meeting. Stan and Nancy Soule have also graciously invited us to Montreal for 1990. A vote was taken and Montreal won by an overwhelming majority.

Jim Schlosser motioned that the meeting be adjourned. Helen Galletine seconded and the motioned carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:50.

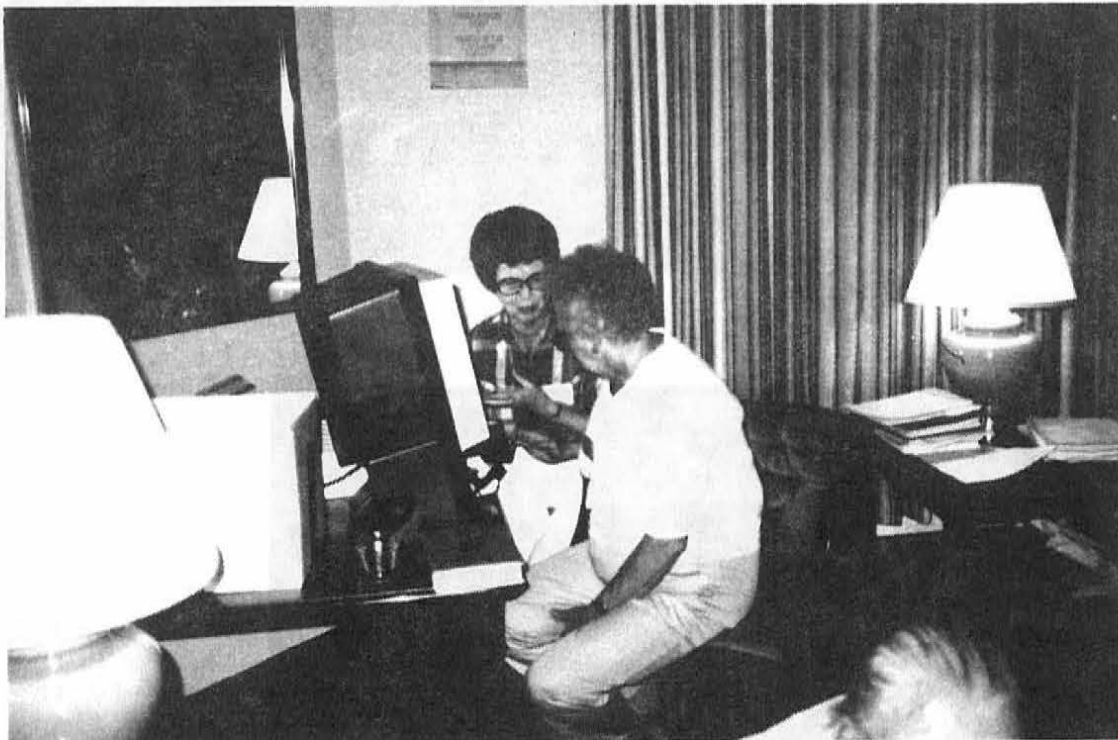

FAMILY HISTORIAN'S REPORT

by Geraldine Soule Schlosser

Have you ever wondered what the Soule Kindred Family Number is? In January, 1968, Col. John Soule gave an explanation in the Newsletter:

"This is our arbitrary method of keeping families together in our records. The first five digits identify the individual in your ancestry from the second through the sixth generation in descent from George Soule of the Mayflower. The sixth or final digit identifies the family group in order of filing (but not necessarily in order of receipt). Assignment of a "0" may indicate either "unknown" or "tenth". An "X" is used to indicate "eleventh" or higher placement. A "family group" will normally comprise an individual, his children and his grandchildren but it may cover all of the data submitted by or developed with one individual. Eventually we hope to compile and publish an index to these numbers. To indicate the system, the numbers assigned to the children of George Soule of the Mayflower and their families are as follows:

100000 Zachariah Soule & Margaret --?--
 200000 John Soule & Rebecca Simmons (1st wife)
 300000 John Soule & Esther (Nash) Sampson (2nd wife)
 400000 Nathaniel Soule & Rose --?--
 500000 George Soule & Deborah --?--
 600000 Mary Soule & John Peterson**
 700000 Patience Soule & John Haskell or Hascol**
 800000 Susanna Soule & Francis West**
 900000 Elizabeth Soule & Francis Walker

Similarly, 210000 would apply to the family of Rebecca Soule & Edmund WESTON since she was the eldest child of John Soule and Rebecca Simmons; 290000 would apply to the family of Moses Soule & Mercy Southworth since he was the ninth child of that family."

**In working with the microfilm of the records, I've discovered that this numbering system was not followed when applied to the daughters. The numbers in actual use are:

600000 Patience Soule & John Haskell
 700000 Susanna Soule & Francis West
 800000 Mary Soule & John Peterson

The number most frequently used is the four-digit number of the 5th generation descendant. Thus Jacob⁵ (#486, p. 212 in Mayflower Families 3) is 4224 (William⁴, Sylvanus³, Nathaniel²). Sylvanus was Nathaniel's 2nd child, William was Sylvanus' 2nd child, and Jacob was William's 4th child. This number can be extended indefinitely.

When I receive family sheets from Soule Kindred members

or others, one of these numbers is assigned if the lineage is known, and this is how the correspondence is filed, with a cross index to names. Of course, there are some puzzles that haven't been solved, and those are filed by name only.

Try figuring out your own number to the 6th or 7th generation. If you have trouble, and would *really* like to know it, send me your lineage with a SASE (self-addressed stamped envelope) and I'll send it to you.

Member Evelyn Brakensiek of St. Louis has informed me that the Soule Kindred Films are available from the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. She reports that the numbers are #1531547 and #1531548. I haven't verified this at my nearest LDS Library (45 miles away in Onalaska), but these are the numbers imprinted on the first two reels which I have.

Because some of you may want to look at these records, I'm listing a very abbreviated contents, so that you can order only the films that you need.

Reel #1 (1531547) - begins with Soule Index by Milton Terry, published by Soule Kindred. Mostly abstractions of Soules in census listings 1790-1880, alphabetically by state. Ends with RI.

Reel #2 (1531548) - Starts RI VR (Soule), Miscellaneous census searches and VR through Wisconsin, surnames related to Soule; more vital records, gravestone inscriptions, census searches by state beginning with CT through MA.

Reel #3 (1531549) Vital records MA through VT. At end of reel 5 Generation Project progress report; Col. John Soule's Red Notebooks: Zachariah, Elizabeth (Walker) with extensive notes on Francis Walker, John (Family Group #2000) and first wife, John (Family Group #3000) and 2nd wife - up to 3243313.

Reel #4 (1531550) - From Col. John Soule's Red Notebooks: Starts with 3244 Jonathan⁵ Soule, includes descendants of Nathaniel², George², Patience² & John Haskell. Last number is 6311. Some of these numbers are slightly out of order. The numbers correspond to the family numbers described above.

Reel #5 (1531551) - Red Notebooks continued: 640000-699999, first item 6600; 700000-739999 - Descendants of Susanna² & Francis West; 800000-899999 - Descendants of Mary² and John Peterson. TUB FILE begins (apparently files were used after the Red Notebooks became unwieldy). Begins with correspondence to Dr. Terry regarding his Brewster research. #5237 - Rowland⁵ (this is not the place you'd expect it); Rest of reel deals with descendants of John² and his first wife, ends with #2912. Quite a few of these were not filed in numerical order, so view with care.



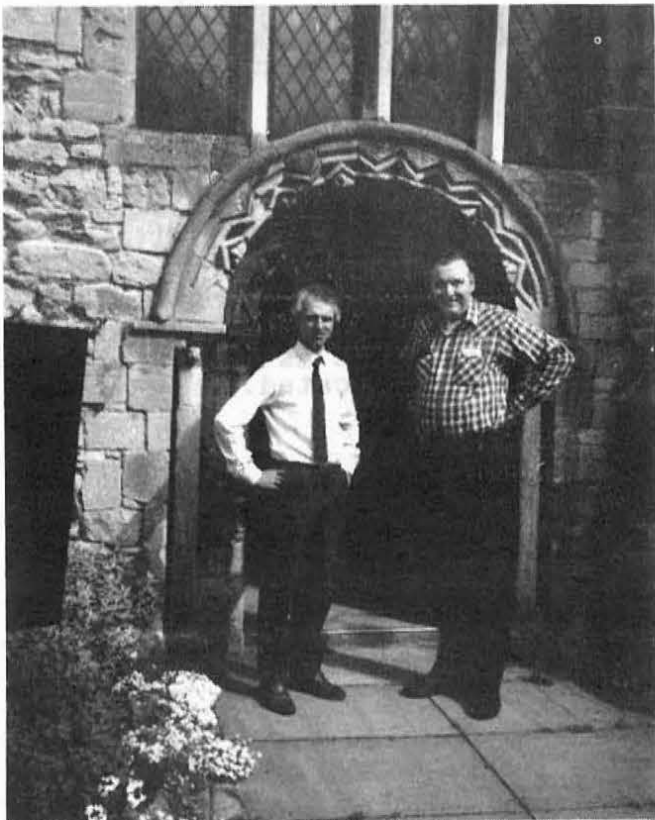

RECORDING OF FAMILY DATA

By Geraldine Sowle Schlosser, Associate Historian

One of the objectives of Soule Kindred is the gathering of information pertaining to the descendants of Pilgrim George Soule. Mayflower Families 3 covers the first 5 generations, to about 1800. Our families did a lot of moving around in the 19th century, and you can help locate migration patterns for family groups. That is why the Family Data Chart is printed in each issue of the Newsletter. Our historian may be able to help you with that "missing link". So please keep the information coming.

We would like to suggest that you begin with your sixth generation ancestor from George Soule (or your earliest Soule ancestor, if you haven't made the connection to George¹). Fill out a form for that ancestor, and then submit forms for each of your ancestors down to yourself. This is especially important if you descend through a female line; Soule women who marry tend to become lost Soules.

We'll give a short explanation of how to fill out the form. Samples were printed in V. 20, #2 and #3-- April and July, if you'd like to refer to those.

(1) The "Generation" space in the upper left corner shows the generation from the immigrant ancestor. Please leave it blank unless you are certain.

(2) In the far upper space on the right for "FAMILY", leave it blank if the surname of "Soule Descendant" is SOULE, SOWLE, or variants, because we'll assign a code number for closely related family groups. If the "Soule Descendant" has a different surname, insert the name in the right upper space.

(3) The next two lines show the ancestors of the "Soule Descendant" back to George Soule¹. Unless you have an approved Mayflower Lineage or other positive proof, we suggest this be left blank.

(4) When writing dates, follow the genealogical style-- first the day in numbers, then the month in letters, and the full year, such as 6 Feb 1833.

(5) When listing children on the reverse side, put in as much information as you can-- such as spouse's parents, if known.

(6) List your name and address as compiler unless someone else gathers the information. We may need to contact the compiler.

(7) It is VERY important to list sources of data; if the information comes from a family Bible or other record, a photocopy of the information should be included. Other sources, such as Vital Records from towns or states, and census should be indicated.

(8) Leave "Verification" blank for our purposes.

(9) Please give as many clues as possible to facilitate further research. If you are uncertain about a date, enter it, but add "circa" or "ca". For questionable place names, add "possibly" or "probably".

A Blossoming Affair

Daylilies and Hostas Will Be at Their Peak When

By NANCY MILLARD

Thanks to a tornado, Clarence and Marge Soules began a romance that blossomed into lilies and hostas.

Now nationally recognized professional growers and hybridizers, Clarence and Marge will open their gardens to the public July 8 and 9, when hundreds of daylilies and hostas are at their peak at Soules Garden, 5809 Rahke Road, Indianapolis.

Soules, formerly a driver for Tarbet, All-State and PIE trucking companies for 40 years, says he was heading home to Muncie when he was almost caught in a tornado on the south side of Indianapolis.

"I thought, that's where Marge Roberts lives. It's going to tear up her place. So I turned around and came back to see if she had any trouble.

"The storm missed her by a half mile. We got to talking and I asked her if she'd care to go to the Reds ball game Sunday. She said she'd go to the ball game if I'd go to church with her first.

"My wife had died and so had her husband. We'd been friends. I

asked her if she'd care if we'd go together for awhile. A person's got to make a life for themselves."

So their friendship blossomed into marriage. They live at Marge's place, where she had extensive daylily gardens. "She's recognized nationally and in Germany for the lilies she hybridizes," Clarence says proudly.

"I told her, 'We've got to get into hostas. Why? Because people need shade plants.'

"Now we've got more than 400 different hostas. We've gone hog wild." Clarence has hybridized 12 himself.

Their hosta gardens spread through the shady part of their 4 acres beneath 53 different kinds of trees. Marge's daylilies grow vigorously in the sunny, rectangular gardens at the back.

They'll be in full blossom for the annual open house at Soules Garden, 5809 Rahke Road, Indianapolis, July 8 and 9. The public is invited.

The gardens are an oasis of serenity. Under aged wild cherry trees and pines specimen hostas are interspersed with columbine, jack-in-the-box, wild ginger and Japanese painted ferns. Even a

"We started with hostas in 1978 and look for anything a little different. When I see a rare hosta, I can't help buying it," he said, admiring On Stage, "that I gave \$200 for."

But Clarence's pride and joy is Fantastic with its large puckered leaves that are a soft blue-green. He hybridized it and is introducing it this season. "I crossed and bred, playing with pollen back and forth for about 5 years. I didn't think too much about it until an expert saw it. Mark Sellers, he wrote a book about hostas, was down here from Chicago. Suddenly he saw it and hollered, 'You haven't told me you got this!'

"I asked Mark when I was ready to market it, what would I charge. He said \$300. I told him I can't charge that. So I asked \$250. I've sold five of them.

"Hosta growers want the original plant, not one grown from tissue culture. Mark took a plant back to make tissue cultures. Those plants will sell for less."

Hostas have fanciful names. Quilted Skies grows beside Peek-a-boo and Love Pat. Lemonade and Heart Throb entice you to examine the "substance" (sturdy perkiness) and marvel at the velvety, perfect leaves.

Krossa Regal dominates a garden. Its large, upright leaves are a powdery blue-gray on tall leaf stems. The soft orchid flower is a bonus. Honeybells has lilac-white fragrant flowers that bloom in August.

Foliage ranges from hazy blues to yellow greens. Some have bright yellow ruffled edges. Leaves may be smooth and round, puckered and cup-like, pointed and narrow, providing textural contrasts across the gardens.

While her husband talked hostas, Marge in her big straw hat was bounding from lily

gardens to potting shed, digging, pushing her wheelbarrow packaging telephoned orders.

She's introducing seven of her own hybridized lilies this season, such as Glamour Star, a medium pink and cream blend that opens flat and round, overlapped with a chartreuse heart. The flower is crimped and ruffled. She'll have it ready in the fall; it sells for \$50.

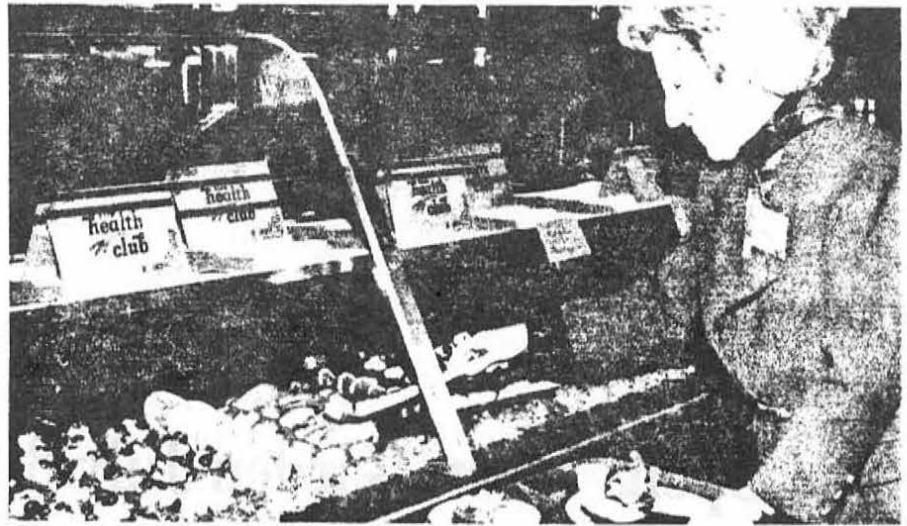
Her catalog lists about 675 different lilies, which range from \$3 to \$150 for Total Eclipse, a deep reddish black with citron throat.

Like other horticultural enthusiasts, the Soules say daylilies and hostas don't take much work. Perhaps they just don't call all that mulching, cultivating, watering, digging, cross-pollinating, grooming and caring work.

The garden seats under the trees stood empty the whole time we were there.

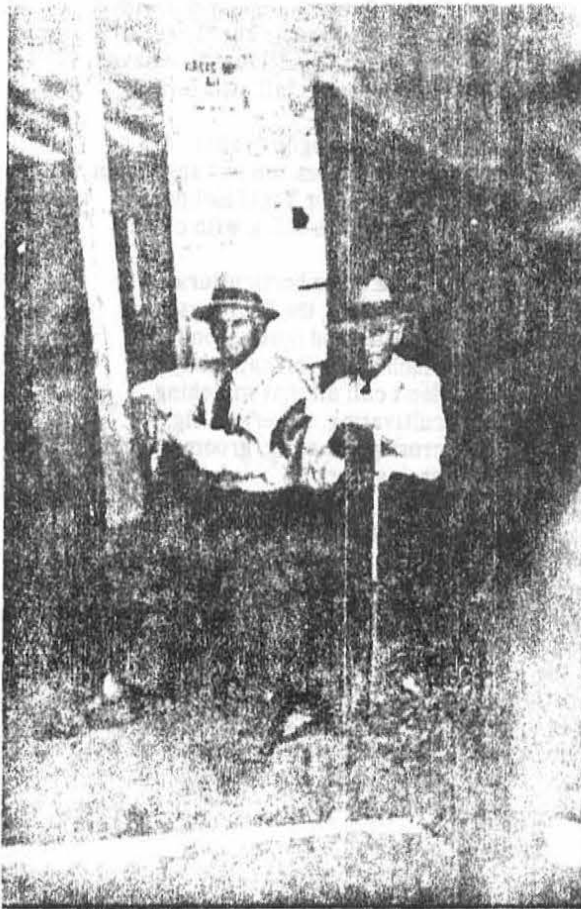

A collection of more than 5,000 nitrate negatives, 2,400 safety negatives, yearly notebooks from 1922-1959, and the photographer's partial index was donated in March, 1989, to the OHS Archives and Manuscripts Division by the Oklahoma Camera Club through its president, Jim David.

According to photograph archivist Kay Zahrai, the photographs were taken by Clayton Soule between 1933 and 1975, the bulk of them in Oklahoma and a large percentage in Oklahoma City, where Mr. Soule has lived since 1931. Soule has been a member of the camera club since 1932.

Zahrai says that in order to determine the priority of processing any collection, a number of parameters are considered, including the importance of the collection and the extent to which it can supplement and enhance the OHS collection.

To assess the historical value of the collection, Zahrai used Soule's index and her own evaluation in determining the period best represented in Soule's photographs is the 1930s, from which the OHS has relatively few photos. She says, "The Soule collection can help to supply deficiencies in the coverage of certain subjects, such as oil, agriculture, children playing with toys, and Oklahoma City street scenes." Many of the negatives are studies of clouds and ice patterns or are shots of the same scene. Zahrai estimates from her sample that about 40 to 43% of the collection should be copied.

But she adds, "We must consider more than the historical importance of the images on the negative; we must consider

first the urgency of dealing with the material of which the negatives are made."

Most of the negatives are made of cellulose nitrate, which is inherently unstable. It is highly inflammable and subject to radical deterioration, resulting in loss of images. The deterioration has a gaseous by-product, nitrogen dioxide, which is converted by the film's moisture into nitric acid. The fumes are hazardous to human health; the nitric acid is hazardous to photographic prints stored near it by causing yellowing and fading of silver images. The nitrates of the Soule collection appear to be only in the first stage of deterioration.

High priority has been given by the staff of the Archives Division to the storage and processing of the nitrate negatives. Photographic technicians have made archival contact prints from them, so that the images can be safely preserved and the nitrates disposed of. Short term storage was found in a room where the negatives will not be close to any other photographic collections. The area has fairly constant temperature (68-70) and humidity (about 50%) and is well ventilated. The nitrate negatives are now stored individually in glassine sleeves and by groups in metal and hardwood boxes.

The Archives Division plans to apply for a grant to hire two staff members and buy equipment to convert the nitrate negatives to prints and safety negatives. Special protective clothing, such as acid-proof rubber gloves, aprons, and goggles, will be required for people handling the nitrate negatives.
