

FAMILY HISTORIAN'S REPORT by Geraldine Sowle Schlosser

Thanks to all of you who have been sending in your family group sheets from your fifth generation ancestor down to yourself. I especially appreciate the information from those who no longer carry the surname SOULE. As some of you may know, when a SOULE woman married, Col. John Soule did not carry on her descendants in his records. These group sheets are very helpful in tracing lineages, and setting up an index to ALL descendants.

I'd like to suggest that if you-- or someone you know-- has a question about Soule lineage you would write to me. I do have the Soule Kindred records, and can let you know about what we have. It has been decided that there will be no charge for requests from Soule Kindred members. I have quite a back-log of correspondence to answer right now. It takes considerable time to gather the information to answer each letter. Please don't give up on me!

Mrs. Orville E. Russell (Elizabeth Jane Cline) has sent in a descendancy chart for Asa⁵ Soule, which goes to the 12th generation in her own line. It was prepared by her husband using Personal Ancestral File (PAF) computer program. I'm sending this to the Newsletter for publication.

I've been working on a problem to find parents for William⁵ SOWLES or SOWLE/SOULE. He is listed on p. 196 #443 in MF3. His parentage as noted there is WRONG, as Ezekiel's son William, also born 1738, died in Maine at a young age. The "problem" William lived for several years in Spencertown, Columbia County, New York. Family legend tells us that he was a Loyalist and travelled to Canada at the time of the Revolution. However, he unknowingly stopped before he crossed the border and settled in Alburg in what is now Grand Isle County, formerly Franklin County, originally Chittenden Co., Vermont. Ridlon, p. 454-55, tells us that William and his sons applied for land in Canada and "their requests were honored". I am looking for Kindred members who would be willing to do some research in the following areas: Toronto, Ontario, Canada; Spencertown, Town of Austerlitz, Columbia County, New York; Grand Isle, Franklin, and Chittenden Counties, Vermont. If you are interested in helping in this research project to find William's ancestry, please write me for more detailed instructions (no need to duplicate effort). I would also like to hear from you if you have recent documented evidence.




The Rev. Allen Scott officiated.




