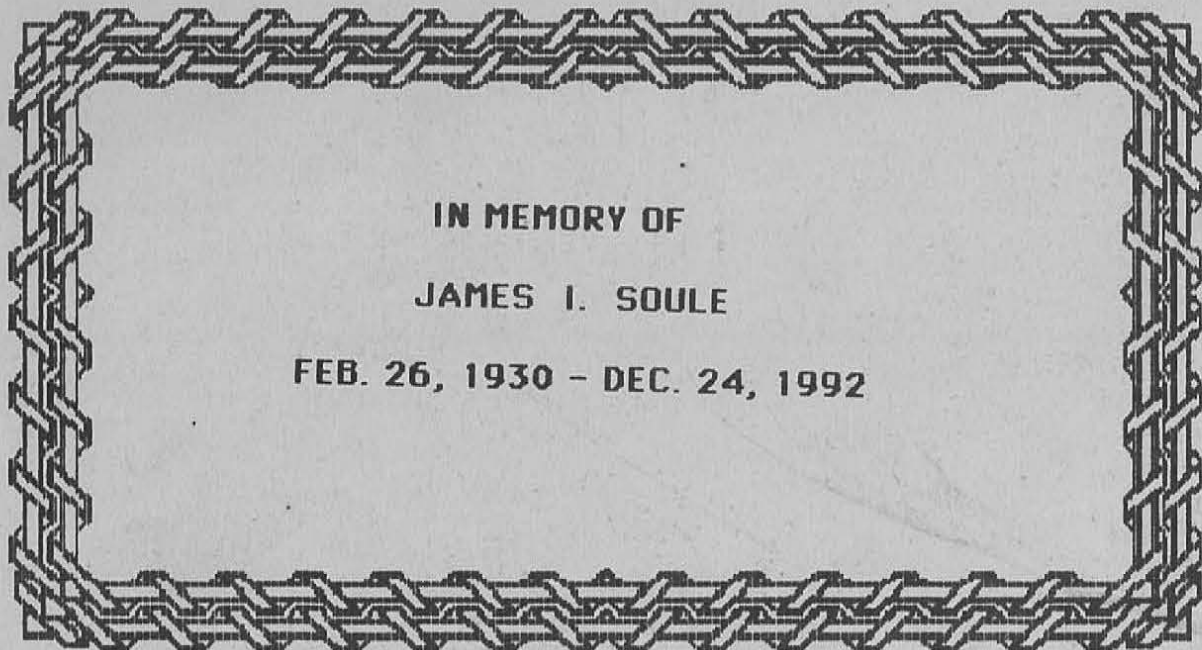

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INTRODUCTION TO THE SOULE KINDRED

The Soule Kindred was formed in 1967 by a group of dedicated people who were interested in preserving and passing information on to future generations. Through the diligence of the first President George Soule and Colonel John Soule, direct descendants of the Mayflower George Soule, a great heritage was left of our founding fathers. The Kindred is a nonprofit organization incorporated in Massachusetts in 1972.

Through the Soule quarterly publication, the Soule Kindred Newsletter, information of genealogical value is disseminated to its members. Reading back copies of the Newsletter is like walking through American and European History, which, after all, is where most of our ancestors came from. Current news items about kindred members' activities bring "cousin to cousin" closer.

Genealogy records are available through the kindred historian to assist those interested in tracing their family roots. The kindred has microfilm records, going back to the Mayflower George Soule, with hundreds of names.....

Kindred membership lists are published annually, leading you to a whole new world of "cousins."

The annual Soule family reunion, held in a different city each year, offers an opportunity to meet your new "cousins" and make long lasting friendships.

There are no restrictive requirements to joining the kindred. Your name does not have to be Sole, Soule, Sowle, Soules or even begin with an "S" We have Jones, Abrahams, Boyds, Edwards, Myers, Turners, and many more different names in our membership.

PAGE OF REMEMBRANCE FOR JIM SOULE

Ron Soule, past president of Soule Kindred, has shared some of his memories of Jim with us. "It was with great sorrow and a sense of personal loss that we in the Kindred learned of the death of James I (Jim) Soule, Past President and, for many years, the driving force behind the Soule Kindred in America. Jim passed away on Christmas Eve after a courageous but losing battle with cancer.

Jim loved to tell the story of how he met Colonel John and began his involvement with the Kindred. Sometimes he would preface the telling of the story with "I may have told you this story before..." then he would give you that unique smile of his and continue "but I'm going to tell you anyway." That was Jim's story, and we will not attempt the re-telling here.

That early association with Colonel John came as a result of Jim's efforts to trace his family tree, and he readily embraced the concept of the larger family represented by the Soule Kindred and the support provided to others "finding their roots." His knowledge, intelligence and organizational skills were evident in the first Minneapolis Reunion and the Kindred recognizing his talents, made sure that he became active in the leadership. He served as First Vice President in 1986 and 1987, and then served as President from 1988 through 1991. Under his leadership the Kindred flourished - membership increased, records were placed on micro film, closer ties were forged with other genealogical organizations, the Kindred organization was refined. But perhaps most important was the improved ability of the Kindred organization to serve the individual needs of so many Soule "cousins" Jim would always be the first to give credit for these accomplishments to the Kindred's Officers and Board of Directors, but he had a way of motivating, inspiring and directing the energies of the Soule Kindred Officers that insured success. He was the force behind our success.

We don't suppose that Jim was perfect, but a person's greatness or goodness is not to be measured in terms of perfection. He was kind, gentle, intelligent and honorable - a principled man who loved his family, his fellow man, and his God. Many of us can only dream of achieving that level of perfection.

He will be fondly remembered and sorely missed."

Your editor would like to add a few words for Jim.

I had only known Jim for about three years. His kindness, impish grin and "little boy" innocence are all Jim Soule. The joy in his life, even through his sickness, the faith in his God, these are the things I will remember most.

FAMILY HISTORIAN'S REPORT

HAPPY NEW YEAR to all of our readers!

As we begin a new year, I'd like to look back on the past 26 years of Soule Kindred-- and highlight the work of your historian. It began long before the organization, when Col. John Soule began collecting Soule information in the 1930's. He made a card file of names with the surname SOULE (or variations), where he listed the lineage, if known, and vital statistics (birth, marriage, death). He used the Ridlon Soule genealogy, and perused census enumerations and military records. He began family records in his "red books". He worked closely with the Historian General of the Mayflower Society to help prove lineages.

In the 1970's he began compiling all his information into the *Mayflower Families, V.3*. Because most of his material dealt with the SOULE surname only, he needed help in editing the daughters. He called on Dr. Milton Terry for this. The book was published in 1980 just before Col. John's death, and Dr. Terry became historian.

In addition to gathering information and researching problems, Dr. Terry compiled our Ancestral Index. This is an index of over 7000 SOULE names in our files, and enables us to trace back lineage by following parent numbers. It is the most useful tool we have in tracing our ancestors.

As newsletter editor (and also a genealogist) for 6 years (1982-1987) I became familiar with many branches of our membership, as well as helping Dr. Terry with some research on "problems". So after his death, I was chosen to take over the job. As caretaker of the archives, I have spent a great deal of time on organizing our files-- a job not yet completed. I continue the indexing of SOULES and also descendants with other surnames. A Supplement and corrections to the original index was published in the Summer 1992 Newsletter. I also published an index to Soule descendants with other surnames. We hope to publish a supplement to both of these in 1995. In the meantime, I can check my card file for names that you haven't been able to find. In addition to all this "housekeeping", I answer requests for information. Please be patient with me. My New Year's resolution is to reply to Soule Kindred correspondence in a more timely manner!

Perhaps some of you recall Dick Phillips' letter in the Summer 1992 issue suggesting a computer database for our records. I've written him about it, and hope that we can get something started. It will take a lot of data entry, so we will need volunteers. If you have a PC (IBM compatible) and would like to help out, contact me.

Dick also suggested that we print names of 5th generation descendants, and who is working on various lines. I was going to start with his: Nathan⁵ West, #756 in MF3; the Soule Kindred File # is 7787 (Susannah² Soule, William³ West, Francis⁴ West). However, we have no correspondence from anyone else descending from Nathan⁵ West. So I have picked Edward⁵ Sowl, #483 in MF3; Soule Kindred File #4221.

I'm including here an application for the Sole Society in England. I've just received the second issue of their periodical *Soul Search*, which contains several interesting articles and a report of their first annual meeting. The chief objective of the Society is "to promote and engage in comprehensive world-wide research into the genealogy and family history of families carrying the following surnames:"

- i. SOLE and spelling variations (SOUL, SOWLE)
- ii. Allied surnames: SAUL, SEWELL, SOLLEY.
- iii. Associated surnames: SEARLE, SALE, etc. The scope of their research is much greater than ours, which is linked to one individual, George Soule. Perhaps through this Society and its eventual huge database, we can discover our George's ancestry. I would like to see us support this group as individuals.

RECORDING OF FAMILY DATA

One of the objectives of Soule Kindred is the gathering of information pertaining to the descendants of Pilgrim George Soule. Mayflower Families 3 covers the first 5 generations, to about 1800. Our families did a lot of moving around in the 19th century, and you can help locate migration patterns for family groups. That is why the Family Data Chart is printed in each issue of the Newsletter. Our historian may be able to help you with that "missing link". So please keep the information coming.

We would like to suggest that you begin with your sixth generation ancestor from George Soule (or your earliest Soule ancestor, if you haven't made the connection to George¹). Fill out a form for that ancestor, and then submit forms for each of your ancestors down to yourself. This is especially important if you descend through a female line; Soule women who marry tend to become lost Soules.

We'll give a short explanation of how to fill out the form. Samples were printed in V. 20, #2 and #3-- April and July, if you'd like to refer to those.

(1) The "Generation" space in the upper left corner shows the generation from the immigrant ancestor. Please leave it blank unless you are certain.

(2) In the far upper space on the right for "FAMILY", leave it blank if the surname of "Soule Descendant" is SOULE, SOWLE, or variants, because we'll assign a code number for closely related family groups. If the "Soule Descendant" has a different surname, insert the name in the right upper space.

(3) The next two lines show the ancestors of the "Soule Descendant" back to George Soule¹. Unless you have an approved Mayflower Lineage or other positive proof, we suggest this be left blank.

(4) When writing dates, follow the genealogical style-- first the day in numbers, then the month in letters, and the full year, such as 6 Feb 1833.

(5) When listing children on the reverse side, put in as much information as you can-- such as spouse's parents, if known.

(6) List your name and address as compiler unless someone else gathers the information. We may need to contact the compiler.

(7) It is VERY important to list sources of data; if the information comes from a family Bible or other record, a photocopy of the information should be included. Other sources, such as Vital Records from towns or states, and census should be indicated.

(8) Leave "Verification" blank for our purposes.

(9) Please give as many clues as possible to facilitate further research. If you are uncertain about a date, enter it, but add "circa" or "ca". For questionable place names, add "possibly" or "probably".

The Search For Stephen and Reliance (Soule) Davis

Until my wife and I began our search for the Davis family roots in the fall of 1991, no one in my family knew that the mother of Captain Thomas Davis was Reliance^S Soule (John⁴, Nathan³, George²⁻¹).

Our search, based on land deeds, took us from Wolcott, VT. to Sidney, ME, and ultimately to Westport Point, MA, on the coast near New Bedford. In November, 1992, in Westport Point (Paqua Point on the early deeds) we found the home of Stephen and Reliance on which is a plaque that reads: "Stephen Davis, shipbuilder, 1770." The wharf that Stephen and his son Thomas owned is also marked with a plaque.

Stephen, Reliance, and their youngest son, Stephen, Jr. moved to Sidney, ME, in the late 1700's where they were joined by their son Thomas and his family. Stephen and Reliance bought land in Sidney in November of 1798, the same day that Thomas bought adjoining land. They sold that land to Stephen, Jr., in June of 1800, three months before he married Patience Springer.

Both brothers sold their land in 1814 at which time Thomas moved to Vermont. Few records exist in Sidney for that period, and we have not been able to find out what happened to Stephen, Reliance, or Stephen, Jr. The search goes on and we would appreciate hearing from anyone who might have information.

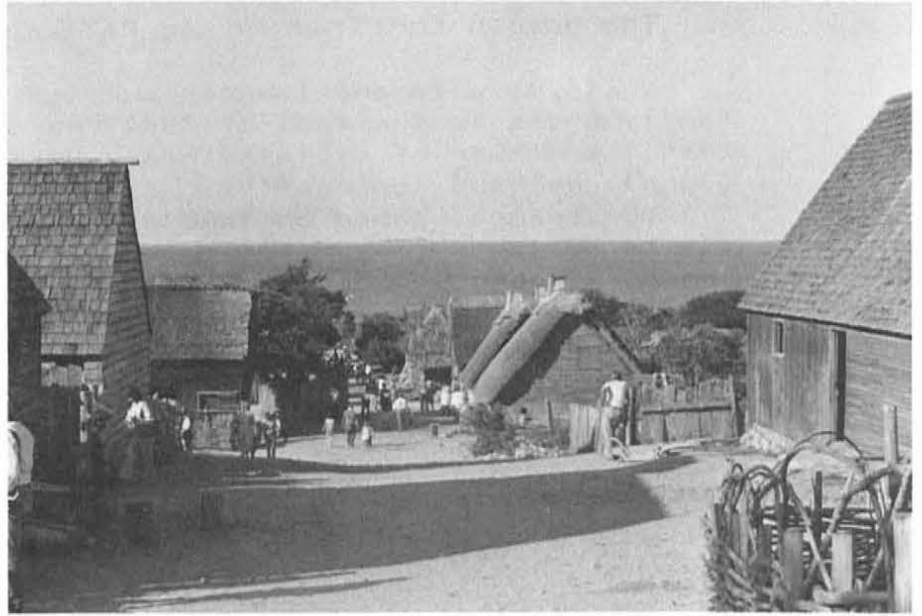
I am pleased to be part of the Soule Kindred, and I was accepted by the General Society of Mayflower Descendants in October of 1992.

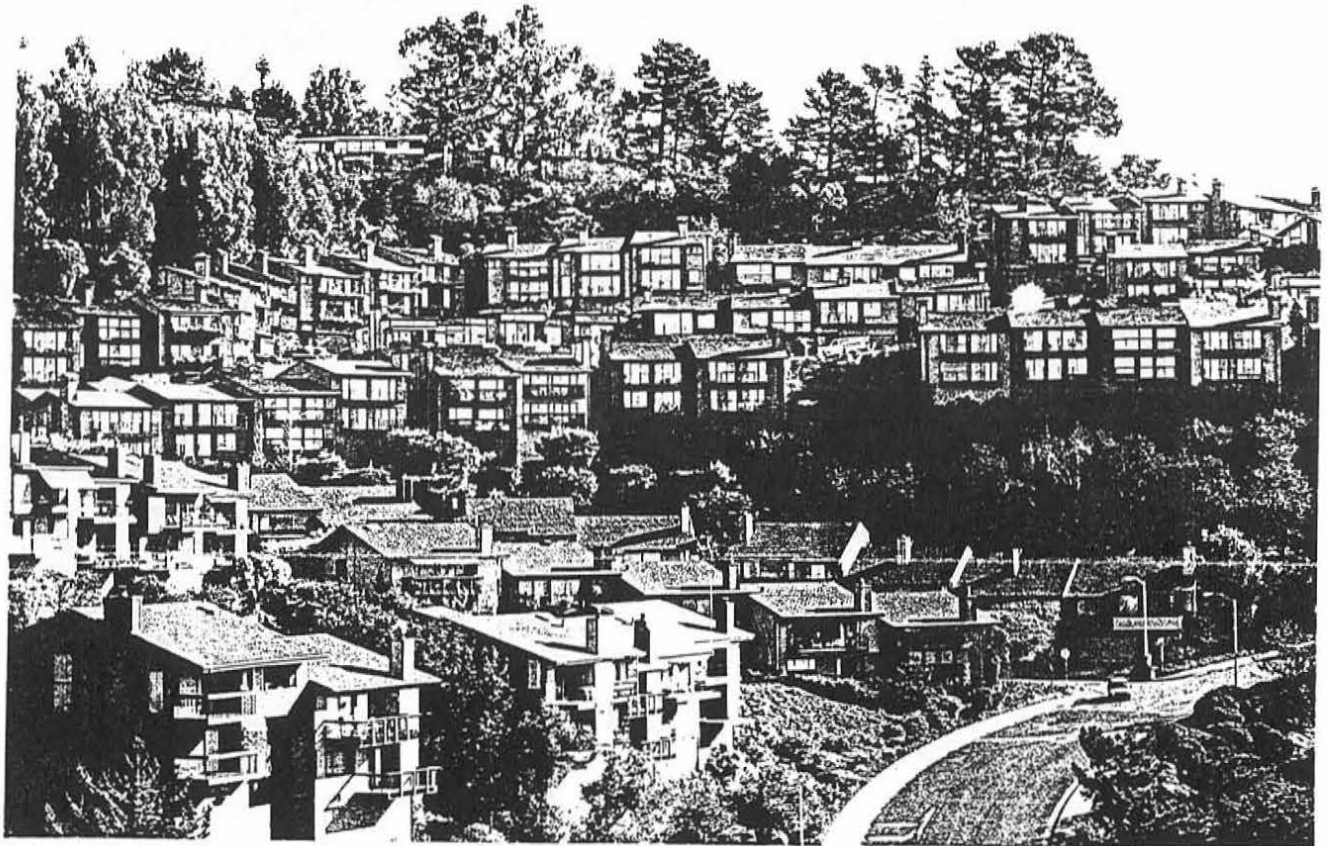
From Howard S. Soule of Oakland, California:

On October 20, 1991, a little over a year ago, the fire storm hit the Oakland hills and destroyed some 2000 to 3000 homes. I lived in Hiller Highlands which represented about 700 townhouses with a Country Club and Club House within the association area. My townhouse which was located at the end of a court, at 18 Treasure Hill. was completely burned by the fire. As a matter of fact not one townhouse in the Highlands remained after the fire. It hit so fast, without any warning, that everyone ran for their lives.

I am enclosing pictures taken of my townhouse before, after, and most recently of my place. The photo below is a reproduction of Hiller Highlands before the fire. Photos 2 and 3 were taken about three days after the fire. In photo #2, I am sitting on what's left of some of my metal furniture. Behind me all these same townhouses have been destroyed. Photo #3, as you can see, nothing was left of my townhouse except the foundations. Photo no. 6 is my new townhouse as it looks today, just one year after the fire.

Although I lost my house and all the belongings in it, I am happy I got away with my life, automobile and some personal items.

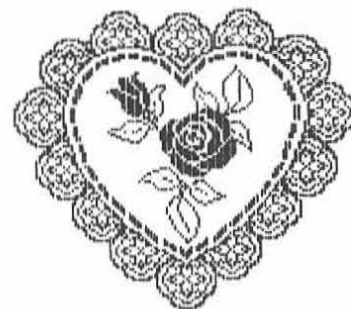

BRUNSWICK -- Louise L. Soule, 86, of 24 Baribeau Drive died Wednesday at a Portland hospital shortly after arrival there.

She was born in Freeport, a daughter of Guy H. and Mary Jane McChesney Soule, and graduated from Freeport High School in 1923.

Mrs. Soule was a representative for hotels, working in Bermuda, Florida and Nova Scotia.

Descent of Frank Soule, from George Soule of the Mayflower.

(Compiled by Dr. Chas. E. Banks, Asst. Surgeon, U. S. Marine Hospital Service.)

The Soule family of this country, with unimportant exceptions, are the descendants of George Soule, one of the Mayflower pilgrims, and the thirty-fifth signer of that famous social compact. George Soule came to this country as a miner, for we find him entered in the list of passengers as an apprentice of Governor Edward Winslow, living with his family. It is probable that he came, in common with others of that religious band from the quarter of England which is recognized as the cradle of the dissenters, the point of junction of the three counties of York, Lincoln and Nottingham. From here three towns or parishes may be seen; Scrooby, Bawtry and Austerfield. Elder Brewster came from the first, Governor Bradford from the last and "the name Soule was quite common about Bawtry" (Palfrey's hist. of N.E., 1, p.160, note.) It, however, maintained by some that the name may be of French origin, with the accent on the final syllable making it a word of two syllables. Upon this theory it is suggested that he belonged to a Huguenot family, and joined the party at Leyden. This view is entertained by this author.

In 1623 George Soule was granted, in his own right, "one acre of land on the south side of the brook to the baywards" (Plymouth colony records.) In 1633, he became a freeman of the colony and was taxed that year 9 s. for his share of the current expenses of their simple government. He had by this time married Mary Beckett who came to this country in 1621, in the ship Ann, in company with Barbara Standish, and Patience and Fear Brewster. In 1638, with Miles Standish and others, he removed across the bay to Duxbury to found that town. This place became his permanent residence, and, besides acting as one of the earliest selectmen, he represented the town in the General Court of Plymouth Colony in 1642-53, having as colleagues John Alden, Thomas Southworth, William Peabody and Starr

When Bridgewater was set off from Duxbury, he was one of the original proprietors of the town. He subsequently became one of the earliest purchasers of Dartmouth and Middleboro. The former property descended to his sons. He thus became the original proprietor of four new settlements, an evidence of his enterprise and thrift.

During the trouble with the Pequet Indians, 1637, he was a volunteer, and five years later, when the plot of Miantonomoh was discovered, he was put on the committee for "offensive and defensive war", showing his readiness to fight as well as to pray for the success of their struggles in the wilderness.

He was not a litigious man, for in a long life we find but one record of his appearance in court as a party of an action, and then it was to convince a jury of the righteousness of his case, and he obtained a verdict. This was in January 1637, when he sued Nathaniel Thomas to obtain control of some heifers.

On March 1st 1658-9, his wife, Mary Soule, was indicted for absence from church, a common charge against the saints of those times.

Without enumerating the numberless smaller offices which he filled, it will be sufficient to refer to one important duty to which he was assigned with Governors Prince, Winslow and Constant Southworth - i.e. the revision of the Colony Laws, which must have been a work requiring more than ordinary ability.

The "History of Plymouth Colony," p. 36, Article Duxbury, says, "Among the earlier settlers of this town were some of the ablest men in the colony, including John Alden, William Brewster, Governor Thomas Prince, and George Soule." An article on the Standish House in Duxbury, in Harper's Monthly 1876, thus discourses: "In this house on Captain's Hill, Standish removed after his second marriage, and here he drew around him a devoted class of friends among whom were Elder Brewster, John Alden, George Soule, and others"

He had at least eight children..... His death occurred in 1680(?), being "very aged" as the colony records state. He outlived nearly all the Mayflower Pilgrims.... A gourd belonging to him may be seen among the relics in Memorial Hall, Plymouth.

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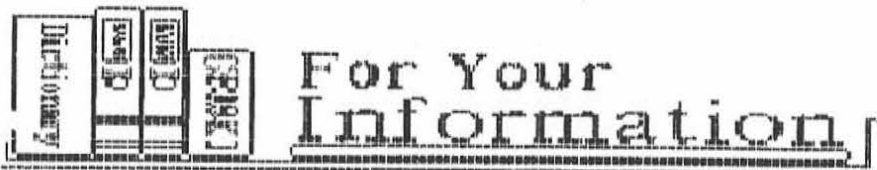
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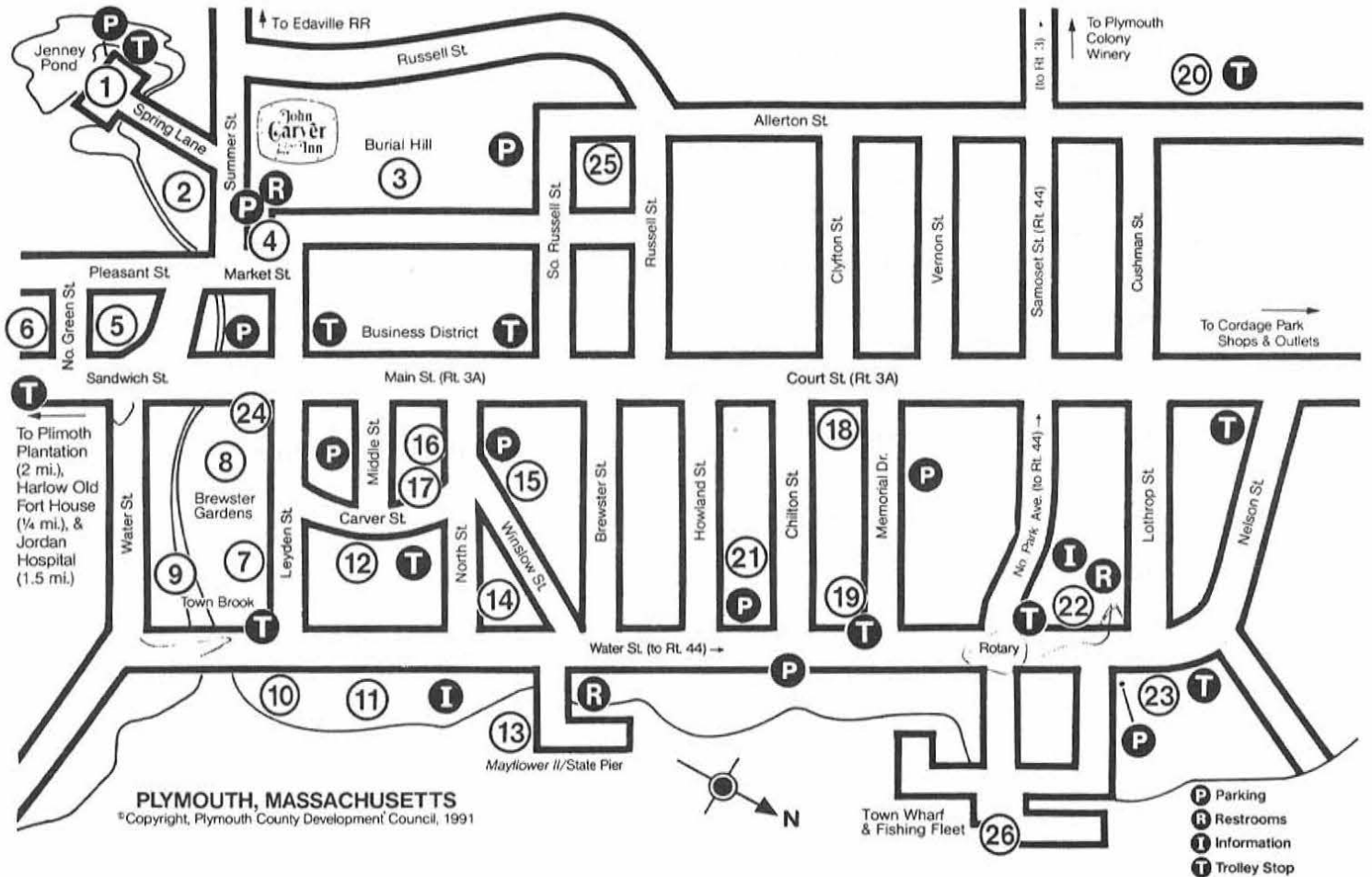
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
