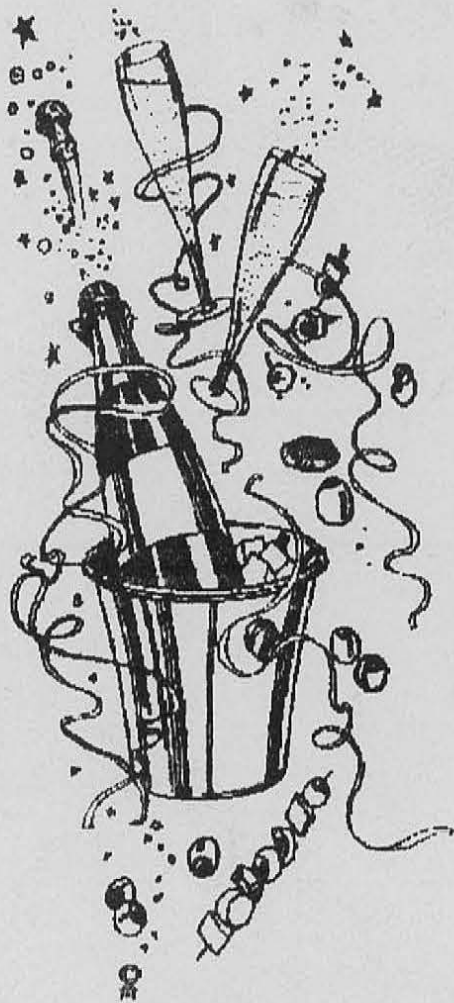

INTRODUCTION TO SOULE KINDRED

Soule Kindred was formed in 1967 by a group of dedicated people who were interested in preserving and passing information on to future generations. Through the diligence of the first President George Soule and Colonel John Soule, direct descendants of the Mayflower George Soule, a great heritage was found to have been left by our founding fathers. The Kindred is a nonprofit organization incorporated in Massachusetts in 1972.

Through the Soule quarterly publication, Soule Newsletter, information of genealogical value is disseminated to its members. Reading back copies of the Newsletter is like walking through American and European History, after all, Europe is where most of our ancestors lived. Current news items about Kindred members' activities bring "cousin to cousin" closer.

Genealogy records are available through the Kindred historian to assist those interested in tracing their family roots. The Kindred has microfilm records, going back to the Mayflower passenger George Soule, contains hundreds of names.....

Kindred membership lists are published annually, leading you to a whole new world of "cousins."

The annual Soule Family Reunion, held in a different city each year, offers an opportunity to meet your new "cousins" and make long lasting friendships.

There are no restrictive requirements to joining the Kindred. Your name does not have to be Sole, Soule, Sowle, Soules, or even begin with an "S" We have Jones, Abraham, Boyd, Edwards, Myers, Turner, and many other names in our membership.

As the new year unfolds, plans are well on the way for our 1994 Soule Kindred Reunion, August 24-28, in St. Augustine, Florida. When we went to pick out a location for our Headquarters, we were surprised to find there were only two facilities in the area that could offer us the accommodations we needed. One was a beautiful Golf and Conference Center with plenty of facilities but was on the outskirts of the city, and of course, more expensive. The other one that we accepted was the "Holiday Inn Historic Area" which is only a few blocks from most of the attractions and the Old Spanish Section. The final reservations for the Reunion and activities, plus another for the hotel, will follow in the Spring Newsletter.

Activities are tentatively planned as follows:

Wednesday, Aug. 24th: Arrival and check-in.

Thursday, Aug. 25th: Sightseeing Carriage Tour:

In the evening, a short bus ride to Anastasia State Park, for the presentation of Florida's Official State Play, "Cross and Sword." This is a drama with over 50 actors, which has received rave reviews from audiences around the world.

This is a conducted seven (7) mile train tour of the Old City with on and off privileges at over 20 scheduled major attractions. Stay as long as you like at any stop with Trains on a 15-20 minute schedule. Train tickets are good for three days.

Reception and Banquet in the Evening.

Sunday, Aug. 28th: Church Service 8:30am, at the Flagler Memorial Presbyterian Church. This will give time to return to the hotel for check-out.

When making reservations at the Holiday Inn, be sure to state the code (SKA) "Soule Kindred in America." With this code the computer will automatically set up the reservation as part of our group.

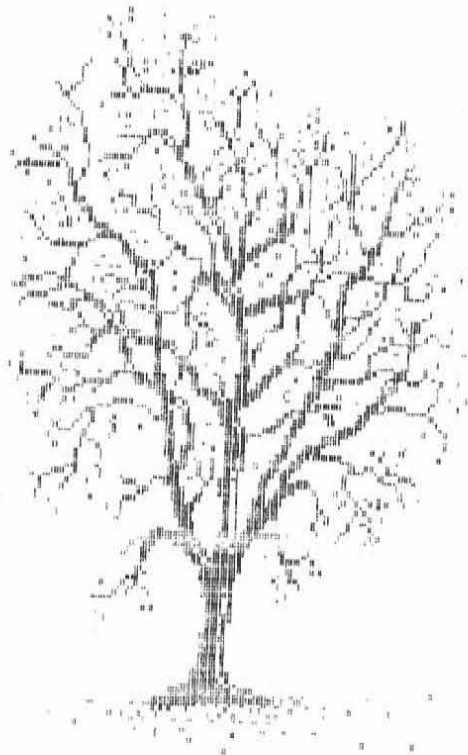

GENEALOGY REWARDS

"Congratulations! We are pleased to inform you that you are the recipient of the George Standish Soule Memorial Scholarship." Those were the words in a letter from the Soule Kindred, Inc. My daughter was thrilled to be notified that she had earned an award in the sum of \$500.00 to help defray the costs of her college tuition.

Thousands of dollars in scholarship funds are available to students who meet the eligibility criteria. With rising tuition costs and the prospect of putting several children through college, most families are seeking these scholarships to supplement their financial aid packages.

High School guidance offices house current scholarship information and applications. Yet, most guidance counselors are unaware of the scholarship funds available through lineage societies. If your research has shown proof of eligibility for a lineage society, check to determine if that society offers a scholarship program. The criteria for these applications generally includes the student's academic record, a list of extra curricular and community activities, letters of reference AND a documented pedigree to the ancestor in question.

My daughter had all of the credentials to meet the requirements for the Soule Kindred scholarship application. I was left with the task of completing the pedigree. I had concluded thirteen generations of research to prove our descendancy from the Pilgrim George Soule. In perusing my research, I discovered that my documentation was very inadequate. Fortunately, I had sufficient time to pursue further analysis and document each generation. Documentation requires the proving of birth, marriage and death of each ancestor. Most likely, this research has already been completed if you are currently a member of a lineage society. Although many of us are eligible to join a lineage society, we have not gathered the necessary data to be considered as a prospective member. If you are seeking to prove eligibility for scholarship funds through a lineage society, I suggest that you obtain documentation for each ancestor from the time you first enter a name on a pedigree chart. Proving an ancestral line for admittance into a lineage society often paves the way for membership into other similar societies.

Scholarship funds provided by lineage societies are a little known source for tuition assistance. We, the genealogists, have the opportunity to take advantage of these funds. Become aware of what is available to you as we educate our future citizens of America.

For more information regarding patriotic and lineage societies refer to the excellent articles written by John C. LaPiana in Heritage Quest, issue #13, pp. 76-80 and issue #16, pp. 20-23.

To us the Soule Kindred, Inc. scholarship was a needed financial reward. In an even greater way, it was a reward of personal satisfaction--- knowing that I finally had the persistence to document our ancestral lineage to George Soule of the Mayflower.

**Olan Soule, 84,
voice of radio,
TV characters**

LOS ANGELES—Olan Soule, who used his chameleon voice to portray villains and superheroes on radio, television and in movies, has died. He was 84.

Mr. Soule died Tuesday of lung cancer at his daughter's home in Corona.

He appeared in about 7,000 radio shows and commercials, 200 television series and 60 films.

The wiry, bespectacled Mr. Soule was the lab technician in "Dragnet" on radio, television and in two feature films with Jack Webb. He was the voice of Batman in the animated "Super Friends" television show until 1984.

Mr. Soule (pronounced soo'-lay) began his career in 1926 and performed for 11 years on the daytime radio soap opera "Bachelor's Children." From 1943 to 1949 and for its final season in 1952-53, he was the male lead in plays on the prime-time radio series "First Nighter."

"Because of my build and glasses, I've mostly played lab techni-

cians, newscasters and railroad clerks," Mr. Soule once told an interviewer. He weighed less than 135 pounds.

Mr. Soule was Tut on "Captain Midnight" and choir director John Masters on "The Andy Griffith Show." He appeared on such shows as "I Love Lucy," "The Jack Benny Show," "The Burns and Allen Show," and "Dallas."

Among Mr. Soule's films were "North by Northwest," "Days of Wine and Roses," and the "The Towering Inferno."

Robert Soule dies; designed sets for Trinity

PAWTUCKET — Robert D. Soule, 66, a set designer at the Trinity Repertory Company since 1968, died yesterday.

A Trinity spokeswoman said Mr. Soule, who lived on Norfolk Avenue, died of cancer.

Mr. Soule, who was born in Bushnell, Ill., in 1926, was one of two resident designers at Trinity. Eugene Lee is the other.

The first show Mr. Soule designed for Trinity Rep was *Red Roses for Me* in 1968. His latest included last season's *Come Back Little Sheba*, and *The Good Times Are Killing Me*.

He grew up in Blandinsville, Ill., population about 900, where, at 13, he made the decorations for his own baptism.

Mr. Soule told former Trinity archivist George Goodwin that in high school he was given his own special room as a studio because he was always designing for the theater.

He performed in plays at Western Illinois State Teachers College (later Western Illinois State University), where he was also a cheerleader.

Toward the end of World War II, he was drafted into the Navy and served on an aircraft carrier in the South Pacific Theater.

After the war, he applied to the Pasadena Playhouse after seeing an ad in *Popular Mechanics* and was accepted. They "would have taken anybody with a GI bill," he told Goodwin.

It was at the Pasadena Playhouse that Mr. Soule first met Adrian Hall, who became artistic director of Trinity Rep.

In the 1950s, Mr. Soule was busy Off-Broadway designing as many as three shows a week. He was paid \$200 a show. In the late 1950s, Mr. Soule reconnected with Hall, who was artistic director of Stella Holt's Greenwich Mews Theatre.

While his work covered a wide range of styles, Mr. Soule considered himself an old-fashioned "show-biz" designer of the 1950s. He loved the Victorian period.

He loved tassels, shades and colored lights. He told Goodwin that "theater to me is magic."

Mr. Soule lived in Providence for 20 years before moving to Pawtucket last April. His parents were the late Phillip and Veda (Houston) Soule.

He leaves two brothers, Wayne and Waddy Soule, both in Illinois.

A memorial service will held at a later date.

Fritz Soule dies; teacher, coach loved kids, jokes

Frederick (Fritz) Soule was a teacher, coach and athletic and recreation director whose teasing demeanor and lively sense of humor could not conceal a deep concern for youth.

Soule, 67, died Friday at home in Mound of cancer diagnosed last April. He retired in 1986 after 30 years of teaching and coaching, which culminated in 15 years as athletic director at Mound-Westonka High School.

"He loved kids, and if there was anything he could do for kids, he'd do it," said Fred Hanley, a teacher at Mound-Westonka and former head football coach.

"He was the kind of guy who was fair . . . and he was just a great guy to work for. [He] took care of his coaches but looked out for his kids, too. He was just a super guy to be around."

Soule was born in Minneapolis and later moved to Mound, where his high-school wrestling prowess earned him a berth in the Minnesota Wrestling Hall of Fame. In World War II, he was a sonar operator stationed on the West Coast.

He used GI Bill money to attend St. Cloud State Teachers College. He taught in Owatonna, then worked as an insurance adjuster.

He started working at Mound in 1956, teaching social studies and English, said his son, Billy, of Hamel. He also coached baseball and wrestling and taught swimming.

"He announced all the football, wrestling, baseball and basketball games at Mound for years," his son

said.

He began the Mound Athletic Association, a football program for fifth and sixth grades, and Upper Tonka Little League. He ran Region 6 high school baseball, the Minnesota State High School League baseball tournament, coached American Legion baseball and directed South Hennepin Legion baseball, his son said.

Soule "liked to tease people." He was a quick wit and a favorite sports-dinner emcee, his son said.

Soule joked in a 1982 news report about catching sunfish — small stuff by most people's standards — his favorite.

"I enjoy fishing, so it doesn't make any difference what we fish for," he told companions at an outing. "I can get just as big a kick out of not catching walleyes as not catching crappies or bass."

Soule also loved to watch baseball and to read, his son said. He favored autobiographies and biographies, and Billy Soule estimated his father had read "probably 2,500 books in his lifetime."

His son said that as athletic director, "He'd go to every game — every football game, every basketball game, every wrestling match . . . he was really dedicated to the youth of Mound, providing opportunities for them to be able to compete. That was his biggest thing."

He also provided opportunities for unconventional fun. Graydon Royce, a former student and wrestler, said Soule would call on his old friend, pro wrestler and promoter Verne Gagne, to come wrestle with the ninth-graders in the spring.

"He'd get Verne to come along with us when we'd go to the district wrestling matches," said Royce, an editor at the Star Tribune.

"We'd stop at some roadside dive on the way back and Verne would buy us all hamburgers and milkshakes. At the wrestling banquet, he'd thank Verne for taking us to the classiest place in Shakopee, and we'd all break up in laughter."

Other survivors include his wife, Marilyn; another son, Jay, of Chaska; a daughter, Betsy, of Mound; a brother, Jack, of Watkins, Minn., and a sister Mary Lou, of Mound.

A memorial service will be at 3 p.m. today at Bethel United Methodist Church, Mound. The family prefers memorials instead of flowers.

Older generation not robbing young

The letter by Jon Hanson, age 22 (*Argus Leader*, Feb. 26) was headlined "National debt is matter of old robbing young." The debt referred to is the \$4 trillion gross federal debt, not the national debt, which is \$28 trillion against assets of \$36 trillion.

The \$4 trillion is 14 percent of the national debt, and 69.5 percent of GNP. The younger generations better start worrying about their credit card debt.

We "old people," in our teens and 20s in 1946, had a gross federal debt of 128.7 percent of GNP from World War II, which after adjusting for income/inflation increases and a population increase from 141 million to 252 million, would be closer to \$8 trillion in today's economy than \$4 trillion. My generation of old people paid off that debt. The present federal debt at 69.5 percent of GNP is small compared to the 128 percent of 1946.

Quit listening to the doomsday deceivers who keep trying to deceive you, Jon. The last thing they have in mind is the welfare of you young people. And where do you get the notion that today's debt was contracted to benefit us old people?

The taxes and debt contracted after we old people paid off the World War II debt was not for our benefit. It was to build universities, schools, roads, water systems, and all the rest so you young people of the generations after ours could have a better nation than we old people had in the depression of the 1930s.

If that is "robbing" the young by the old, then we old people ought to take back all we built and make you kids pay for all of it instead of just \$4 trillion of it. Instead we pass it to you young, free.

You young do not inherit just the federal debt, you inherit the whole nation from Atlantic to Pacific, and it is worth \$120 trillion. That piddling \$4 trillion is therefore a 3.3 percent "mortgage."

RECORDING OF FAMILY DATA

By Geraldine Soule Schlosser, Soule Kindred Historian

One of the objectives of Soule Kindred is the gathering of information pertaining to the descendants of Pilgrim George Soule. Mayflower Families 3 covers the first 5 generations, to about 1800. Our families did a lot of moving around in the 19th century, and you can help locate migration patterns for family groups. That is why the Family Data Chart is printed in each issue of the Newsletter. Our historian may be able to help you with that "missing link" So please keep the information coming.

We would like to suggest that you begin with your sixth generation ancestor from George Soule (or your earliest Soule ancestor, if you haven't made the connection to George¹). Fill out a form for that ancestor, and then submit forms for each of your ancestors down to yourself. This is especially important if you descend through a female line; Soule women who marry tend to become lost Soules.

We'll give a short explanation of how to fill out the form. Samples were printed in V. 20, #2 and #3-- April and July, if you'd like to refer to those.

(1) The "Generation" space in the upper left corner shows the generation from the immigrant ancestor. Please leave it blank unless you are certain.

(2) In the far upper space on the right for "FAMILY", leave it blank if the surname of "Soule Descendant" is SOULE, SOWLE, or variants, because we'll assign a code number for closely related family groups. If the "Soule Descendant" has a different surname, insert the name in the right upper space.

(3) The next two lines show the ancestors of the "Soule Descendant" back to George Soule¹. Unless you have an approved Mayflower Lineage or other positive proof, we suggest this be left blank.

(4) When writing dates, follow the genealogical style-- first the day in numbers, then the month in letters, and the full year, such as 6 Feb 1833.

(5) When listing children on the reverse side, put in as much information as you can-- such as spouse's parents, if known.

(6) List your name and address as compiler unless someone else gathers the information. We may need to contact the compiler.

(7) It is VERY important to list sources of data; if the information comes from a family Bible or other record, a photocopy of the information should be included. Other sources, such as Vital Records from towns or states, and census should be indicated.

(8) Leave "Verification" blank for our purposes.

(9) Please give as many clues as possible to facilitate further research. If you are uncertain about a date, enter it, but add "circa" or "ca". For questionable place names, add "possibly" or "probably".

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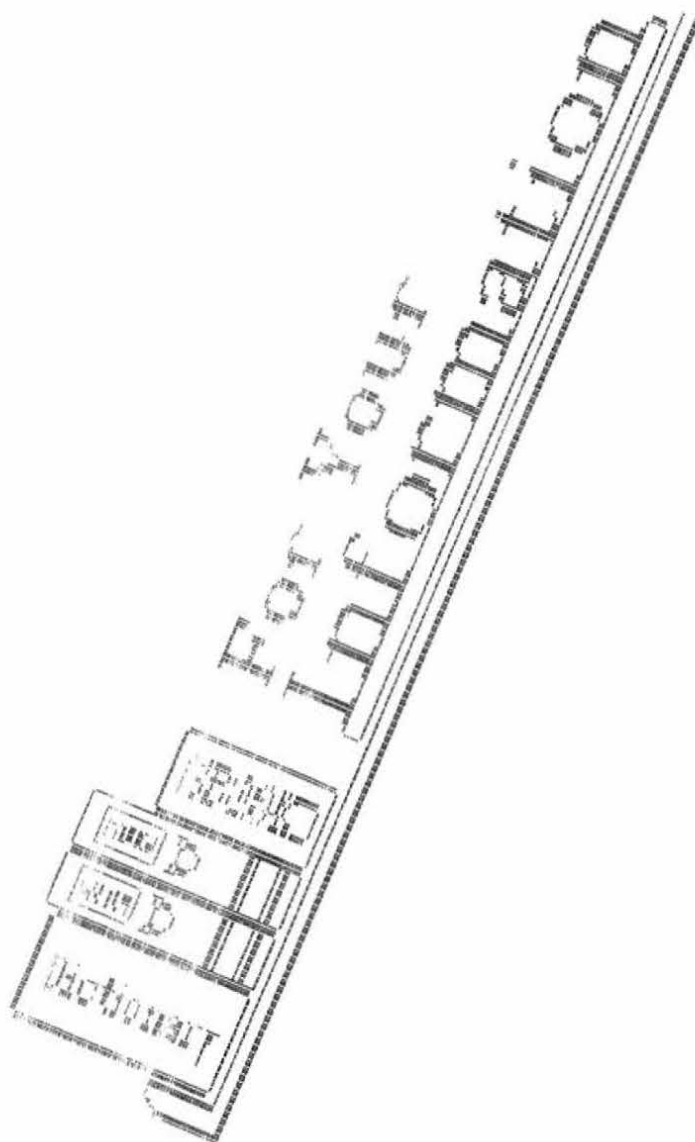
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
