**I just wanted to take this opportunity to offer my heartfelt gratitude for the scholarship you generously awarded me. This year has been one of adventure and growth, and that wouldn't have been possible without your support. The scholarship was used on books, tuition, as well as a word processor (which proved priceless) This past year, I attended a private Christian university, Azusa Pacific University, where I worked on completing the general studies requirements as well as beginning work on my major, psychology. I intend on staying at APU for the remaining three years required for a Bachelor of Arts degree, as well as a possible additional four in order that I may receive a graduate degree in Marital and Family Therapy. My studies have been going well. I am enrolled in the Honors Program at Azusa Pacific which entails rigorous course work in the class subject area. Among my favorite subjects this year were Personal and Social Adjustment (Honors), Astronomy, Exodus/Deuteronomy (Honors), and Human Growth and Development. I received straight A's on both semester report cards, so I suppose I am proceeding well in my academic studies.**

**Azusa Pacific University not only requires a student's academic commitment, they also require community involvement as well. This past year I served my community as a Campus Life Christian Youth Helper at a local junior high, as a Junior High Youth Group Helper, and also by going on a week-long mission trip to Mexicali. **I just wanted to thank you again for your support and generosity for the scholarship. It is partly because of you that I was able to have the opportunities I did this past year. (My fathers savings account is eternally grateful!) Thank you for the outreach you have to the young students of America, and may God Bless your organization in the future.**

## Reunions

### SOWLE REUNION

Descendants of James and Patience Macomber Soule of Vermont gathered in Firemen's Park on Aug. 5 for their sixth reunion since 1980. Four of James' and Patience's sons "went West" in the mid-19th Century -- one to New York, one to Iowa and two to Wilton township in Wisconsin. Attendance was about 70. Those coming from out of state were:

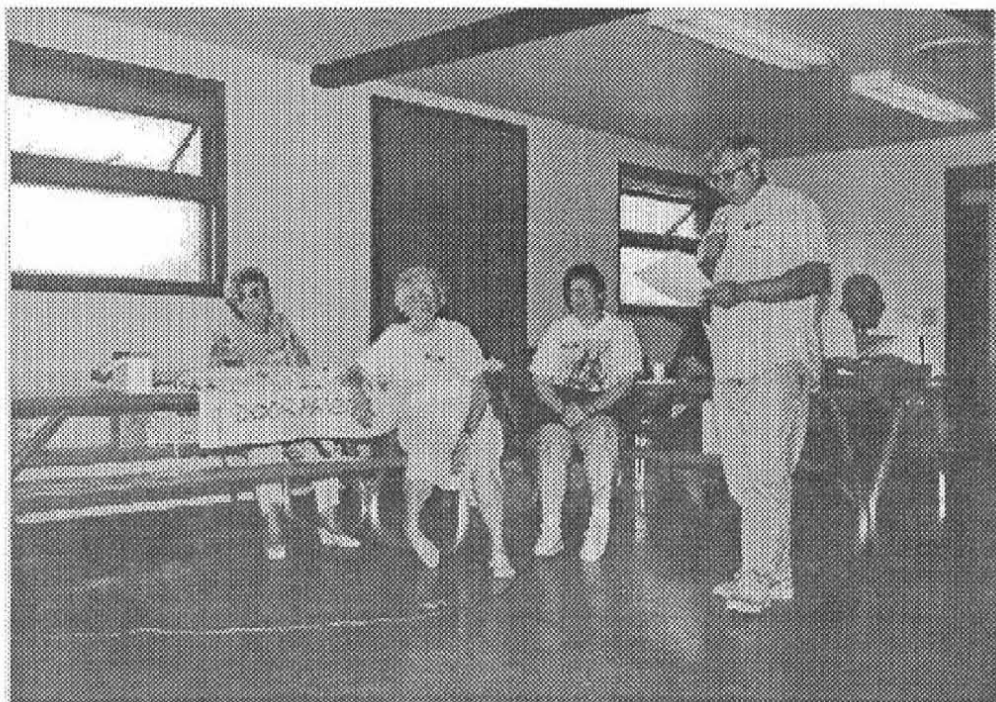

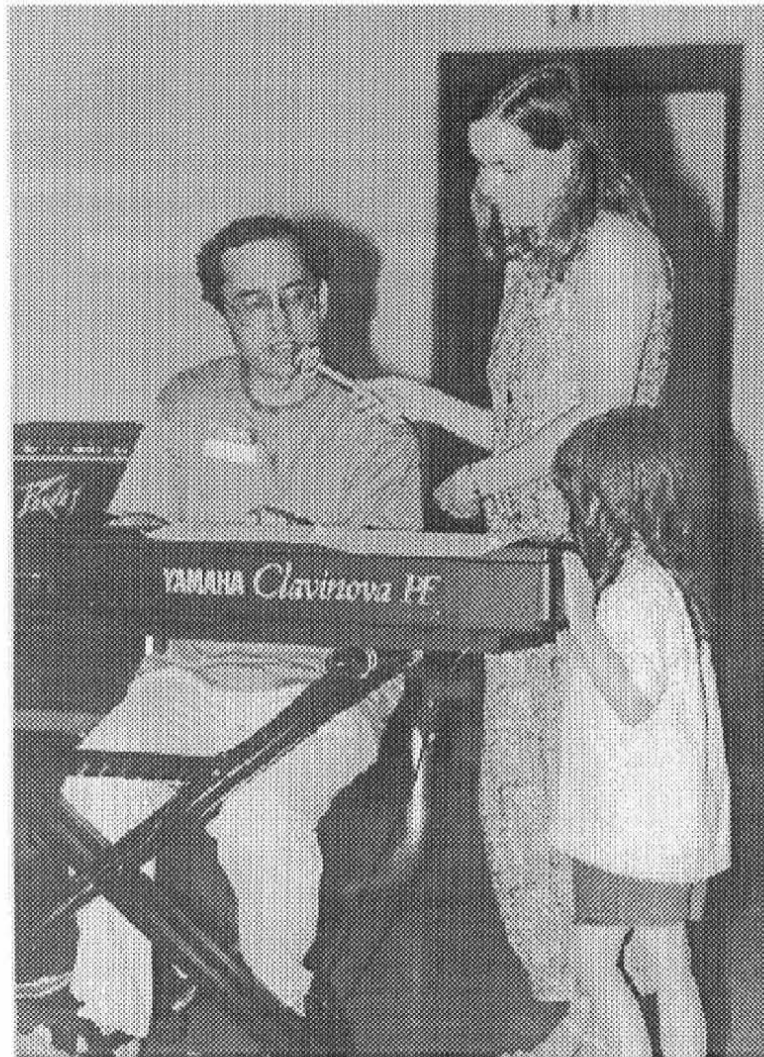

ANNUAL REPORT 1995

The past year has been about the same as other years for the historian's correspondence. I received about 46 letters or phone calls requesting help or offering information. I have written approximately 38 letters in response. There is a back-log of unanswered letters, for which I must apologize.

In addition to the correspondence, there is other work that takes my time-- filing new information, and the never-ending job of trying to put the files in order. I estimate that I could easily spend 50 hours a week just working on Soule Kindred. My wish is that some young member interested in family history could work as my assistant to learn our filing system, and be trained in the historian's work. I had a request from a veteran of the 596th Signal Air Warning Battalion planning a reunion, and looking for two "lost" Soules. These two men were not members of the Kindred, nor did we have any information on them in our card files, so I couldn't help.

I was able to help a woman who had a query in the Newsletter regarding her great-grandmother. I realized that she (the grandmother) was a first cousin of my great-grandfather, so I could give her a lot of detailed information on the ancestry. And she was able to help me with a branch of the family that I had lost track of. This sort of experience is what makes genealogy fun.

I'll close this report the same way that I did last year's. I hope that I'll have a more productive year in 1995/96.

# Women athletes? Olympian settled question 75 years ago

As Title IX battles drag through the courts and congressional hearings, it's clear women are in for a long struggle as they seek equal opportunities in sports.

If any of them need inspiration to make that long haul, maybe they can glean it from the story of 89-year-old Aileen Riggan Soule, who ought to be a household name.

Soule is America's oldest living Olympic gold medalist and — long before Deion Sanders started commuting from the gridiron to the diamond — she was the first athlete to medal in two sports at an Olympics.

But she nearly didn't have the chance to win those medals in swimming and diving.

Soule barely survived the epidemic of Spanish influenza that killed more than a half-million Americans in

1918-1919, then followed a doctor's advice to take up swimming. "I really nearly died," she says. "I was a delicate child, and I had anemia as well."

But by 1920, even though she was only 14 years old and weighed just 65 pounds, Soule qualified for the Olympic diving team. Still, in the same year when American women finally had won the right to vote, U.S. sports officials still weren't sure they were ready for female Olympians.

"There was so much controversy about women in competition," says Soule. "There were letters to the editor saying that we would get too muscular and wouldn't be able to have children."

Eventually, the selection committee relented, but then Soule had to endure another debate about whether the team should include a 14-year-old.

Soule was no stranger to arguments about the progress of women, since her mother was a suffragette. "But she wasn't violent," Soule says. "She was an envelope stuffer."

Then came the two-week voyage to Antwerp, Belgium, aboard a dilapidated transport ship from World War I. The ship carried 400 male Olympians down in the hull and 15 women, up on deck.

"Now, that was fun," Soule says.

Once in Antwerp, Soule discovered her diving competition would take place in one of the city's murky canals. Soule worried that a deep plunge might leave her stuck in the muddy canal bottom. But she emerged with a gold medal in the springboard, part of a virtual sweep by American women in aquatic events. That helped blunt resistance to female Olympians, and they received a Manhattan parade upon returning home.

Four years later, she was back at the Olympics, in Paris, where she won a silver in springboard diving and a bronze in the 100-meter backstroke. That was where she met Johnny Weissmuller, Hollywood's favorite Tarzan, with whom she later starred in a touring aquatic show. "Johnny was the sensation of Paris," Soule remembers. "Women were lined up around the block to see him."

Soule broke ground in other areas, too.

First, the women swimmers' success helped popularize the one-piece bathing suit that once seemed so risqué. Then, the *New York Post* made Soule its first female sportswriter, though strict rules on amateurism prohibited her reporting on swimming.

Soule also was the subject of the first underwater and slow-motion photographs ever taken, by Grantland Rice, the sportswriter who named Notre Dame's Four Horsemen. And she appeared in a film with the world's first figure skating sensation, Sonja Henie.

Not a bad life, and one that will be showcased in Avon's "The Olympic Woman" exhibit in Atlanta next summer.

But it doesn't stop there.

Soule, who lives in Honolulu, eventually returned to masters swimming and set six world records for her 85-89 age group.

Next year, when she joins the over-90 group, she probably will set some more. But she's superstitious about discussing the future. "I'll try for that," is all Soule says, cautiously. "If I'm still around."

**How Do You Pronounce Soule, Sowle, Soule', Etc.?**

There is frequent conflict on how to pronounce the surname of George "Pilgrim" Soule. In my opinion families are entitled to pronounce it in whatever way family tradition dictates.

In the case of George Soule's fourth child, George Soule II, we have proof that he pronounced it Soul. In his will dated 25 March 1697, it is stated, "do bequeath my Body to the Earth from which it came and my soule (sic) unto God who gave it."

On a memorial marker to Johathan Soule (6) in Grove Cemetary in the village of Quaker Street, Duanesburg Township, Schenectady County, New York, the accent mark appears on the name Soule'. It is our understanding that the marker was placed there by Margaret Soule, daughter of Johnathan Soule (7). Thus, even the direct line from George Soule II appeared to have pronounced the name Soule'.

Little seems to be known about George "Pilgrim" Soule's ancestors. However, it is not unreasonable to postulate that the name did derive from Soule's who arrived in Britian from Normandy after the Conquest and that the name was later anglicized by dropping the accent mark.

You may pronounce it any way you and your family wish but in reference to George "Pilgrim" Soule it should always be pronounced soul.


I am herein enclosing a copy of an article that appeared in the San Francisco Chronicle in their food section on Wednesday September 13, 1995.

## PEAK EXPERIENCES

THE SOULE DOMAIN, Crystal Bay.

It's hard to decide whether this multilevel log cabin, built 60 years ago as a private residence and the realm of chef owner Charlie Soule since 1985, is more charming during the winter or summer. Summer gives you pleasant outdoor seating; winter obscures the neighborhood (an unattractive rear view of the Tahoe Biltmore and Highway 28).

Regardless, the charm is as real as the logs. This spacious feeling 44-seat restaurant sports a big working fireplace, Dutch doors that let in the evening breeze, pink draped tables with candles and Tahoe memorabilia. And when you start exploring the menu, you'll discover a highly personalized idiom that makes for excellent dining. Charlie Soule likes to sauté; he likes shiitake mushrooms; he can make vegetarian

and low cholesterol dishes sing; he doesn't mind doing the seafood and steaks that so many Tahoe diners require. And he's assembled a tiny but excellent wine list with some of the friendliest prices around.

Appetizers (\$5 to \$9) set the eclectic, quirky tone: You'll find scallops sautéed in basil butter; corn meal coated soft-shell crab pan fried with pistachios and almonds for a nifty contrast of texture and sweet/savory notes; or lamb ravioli with kalamata olives in balsamic sauce.

Entrees (\$13 to \$19) are just as creative. Fresh pastas come with a variety of sauces, many of them complexly flavored sautés (chicken with garlic, tarragon, roasted red pepper and balsamic vinegar; shrimp and scallops in tomato sauce).

A grilled garlic in-fused chicken breast managed to be juicy, even sans sauce, but the accompanying black bean salsa suffered from the vinegary note of pickled jalapenos.

Far more enticing was the unhappily named Vegan Sauté; not even the detailed menu description prepared us for this magical plateful of squashes, snow peas, red peppers, chiles, almonds, shiitake mushrooms and tofu. Lightly curried, with hints of coconut and cilantro, teriyaki and almonds, it was a delight.

Soule, a locally trained chef who grew up in Tahoe, says he's drawn toward spicy Asian flavors and experimentation in general. He's created a well loved Tahoe institution that promises to just get better and better.

Sarah, wife of John A. Sowle- dau. of Adam & Mary Vroman. Died Jan 21, 1844  
Age: 33yrs.; 1mo., 27 days

Concerning the Vroman Family - there are several Vromans buried in this cemetery. Concerning the ones mentioned on Sarah's gravestone:

Adam Vroman Died Sept. 16, 1860 Age: 76 yrs., 6mo.  
Nancy, wife of Adam Died Sept. 18, 1854 Age: 67 yrs., 8mo., 24da.

I hope this will be of some help to you, in case you were not able to gain any more information at the family reunion you were to attend. There is a Germaine M. Soule mentioned in a book, entitled, "Our County and Its People, by Daniel E. Water. This was printed in 1896, and concerns the history and some of the prominent people of the various town in the county. The section entitled "Family Sketches" contains the following on Germaine M.:

Soule, Germaine M., was born in Floyd, son of Nicholas and Mary E. (Burlison) Soule, who had two children: Minnie E. and Germaine M. Nicholas Soule is a native of Oneida County, son of Thomas E., who came from Connecticut about 1800 and was a carpenter by trade. Germaine M. Soule married Libbie, daughter of Earnest and Dora (Dussel) Brueckner, by whom he had two children; Nicholas G., and Almira D. In 1888 Mr. Soule engaged in the mercantile business at Floyd in which he continued for two years. He has since been engaged in farming and dealing in agricultural implements. He was elected inspector of election, appointed town clerk and in 1892 was elected supervisor. For the last two years he has been highway commissioner. He is a member of Oriskany Lodge, F&AMM, No. 799; O.U.F. of Stittville; Floyd Grange; and is president of the Patrons of Industry.

### SOULE KINDRED INDEXES AVAILABLE

A third index has been completed for about 1,000 persons who are descendants but do not have the name Soule or other spelling variations. This Surname Index was created primarily from lineage's submitted recently by members of Soule Kindred. It should be used with our earlier indexes and the 1992 supplement published in the 1992 Soule Kindred Newsletter Summer edition (Volume XXVI, No. 3).

Also available are copies of the original index created by Dr. Milton Terry listing more than 7,000 individuals with the name Soule, including codes for the source of information and a numbering system for tracing lineage of many individuals. That index includes the names of the spouse of about 5,000 of the individuals.

Those spouse names have been indexed in alphabetic order with name and code number of the individual in the original Terry index. However, you must have the Terry index to use the spouse index.

The cost of each of the three indexes is a standard \$ 10.00, including mailing. They are printed on 8 1/2 by 11 inch paper.

RECORDING OF FAMILY DATA

By Geraldine Soule Schlosser, Soule Kindred Historian

One of the objectives of the Soule Kindred is the gathering of information pertaining to the descendants of Pilgrim George Soule. Volume 3 of the book series, *Mayflower Families Through Five Generations* published by the General Society of Mayflower Descendants covers the first 5 generations of George Soule. This book covers descendants to about the year 1800. Our ancestors did a lot of moving around in the 19th century and you can help locate migration patterns for family groups. That is why the Family Data Chart on the following pages is printed in each issue of the *Soule Newsletter*. I may be able to help you with that "missing link." So please keep the information coming on the Family Data Charts.

I would like to suggest that you begin with your sixth generation ancestor from George Soule (or your earliest Soule ancestor, if you haven't made the connection to Pilgrim George Soule.) Fill out a form for that ancestor and then submit forms for each of your ancestors down to yourself. This is especially important if you descended through a female line - Soule women who marry tend to become lost Soules.

I'll give a short explanation of how to fill out the form. An example follows the blank form.

1. The "Generation" space in the upper left corner shows the generation from the immigrant ancestor. Please leave it blank unless you are certain.
2. Leave the upper right "Family" space blank if the surname of your descendant is Soule, Sowle, or a variant. I'll assign a code number for closely related family groups. If the "Soule Descendant" has a different surname, enter the name in the upper right "Family" space.
3. In the "Ancestral Line" area enter the lineage back to Pilgrim George Soule. I suggest you leave this blank unless you have an approved Mayflower Lineage or other positive proof.
4. When writing dates, follow the genealogical style - first the day in numbers, then the month in letters, and then the full year, for example: 6 Feb 1833.
5. When listing children on the reverse side, put in as much information as you can, such as spouse's parents, if known.
6. List your name and address as compiler unless someone else gathers the information. I may need to contact the compiler.
7. It is VERY important to list sources of data; if the information comes from a family Bible or other record, a photocopy of the information should be included. Other sources, such as Vital Records from towns or states, and census should be indicated.
8. Leave the "Verified by" blank for my use.
9. Please give as many clues as possible to facilitate further research. If you are uncertain about a date, enter it, but add "circa" or "ca". For questionable place names, add "possibly" or "probably."



## SUGGESTIONS AND ITEMS TO CONSIDER IN WRITING YOUR PERSONAL HISTORY

1. Your birth: when, where, parents, surrounding circumstances and conditions.
2. Your childhood: health, diseases, accidents, playmates, trips, associations with your brother and sisters, unusual happenings, visitors in your home, visits to grandparents, relatives you remember, religion in your home, financial conditions of parents.
3. Your brothers and sisters: names, date of births, place of birth, accomplishments, names of spouses, data and place of marriage, their children.
4. Your school days: schools attended, teachers, courses studied, special activities, associates, achievements, socials, report cards, humorous situations, who or what influenced you to take certain courses or do things you might not otherwise have done.
5. Your activities before, after and in between school sessions: vacations, jobs, attendance at church, other church functions, scouting, sports, tasks at home, fun and funny situations.
6. Your courtship and marriage: meeting your spouse, special dates, how the question was popped, marriage plans, the wedding, parties and receptions, gifts, honeymoon, meeting your in-laws, what influenced you most in your choice of spouse.
7. Settling down to married life: your new home, starting housekeeping, bride's biscuits, spats and adjustments, a growing love, making ends meet, joys and sorrow, your mother-in-law, other in-laws.
8. Your vocation: training for your job, promotions, companies you worked for, salaries, associates, achievements, your own business.
9. Your children: names, dates and places of birth, health of mother before and after, how father fared, characteristics, habits, smart sayings and doings, growing up, accomplishments, schooling, marriage, vocations, accidents, operations.
10. Your civic and political activities: positions held, services rendered, clubs, fraternities and lodges you have joined, War or military service.
11. Your church activities: as a young person, through adolescence, churches attended, church positions, church associates, church certificates, answers to prayers, necessity and power of love.
12. Your avocations: sports, home hobbies, dramatic and musical activities, reading habits, genealogy travels, favorite songs, movies, books, writers, poems, etc.
13. Special celebrations or holidays you remember: Easter, Christmas, national and local holidays, vacations.
14. Your plans and hopes for the future.
15. Your ancestors: your impressions of those you knew personally, a general sketch of those you did not know: father, mother, grandparents, great grandparents, other relatives.
16. Your encouragement and counsel to your descendants: carrying on family traditions and activities: their obligation to their country, church and family: your suggestions to your progeny and others on honesty, humility, health, diligence, perseverance, thrift, loyalty, kindness, reverence, the Bible and other religious and edifying books: service to fellowmen: your belief regarding God, etc.

Never underestimate the effect you may have on unborn generations in helping them through the trials and tribulations of life by the written word of advice you leave your children, grandchildren, etc. If you would like them to live upright honest lives, give them the benefit of your experiences, Job, of the Old Testament, lamented the fact that his words were not written when he said, "Oh that my words were now written! Oh that they were printed in a book! That they were graven with an iron pen and lead in the forever!" (Job, 19-23) But they were written, and he then gave his beautiful testimony of the Redeemer which has been used countless times as the text of sermons in both the Jewish and Christian worlds. Your Communications to your descendants must be written. They will also appreciate your life story as a precious treasure. and bless you all their days for it.

Hints on writing your life story: tell your story plainly and with directness; write truthfully of uplifting, refined and honorable occurrences and experiences. Humor helps to make for easier reading. If you can give the whys' of your decisions and changes of activities it may help others. Illustrate with as many pictures as possible. Make several copies, or better still, print copies and give one to each of your children and grandchildren. Place copies in local and national libraries and/or historical societies.

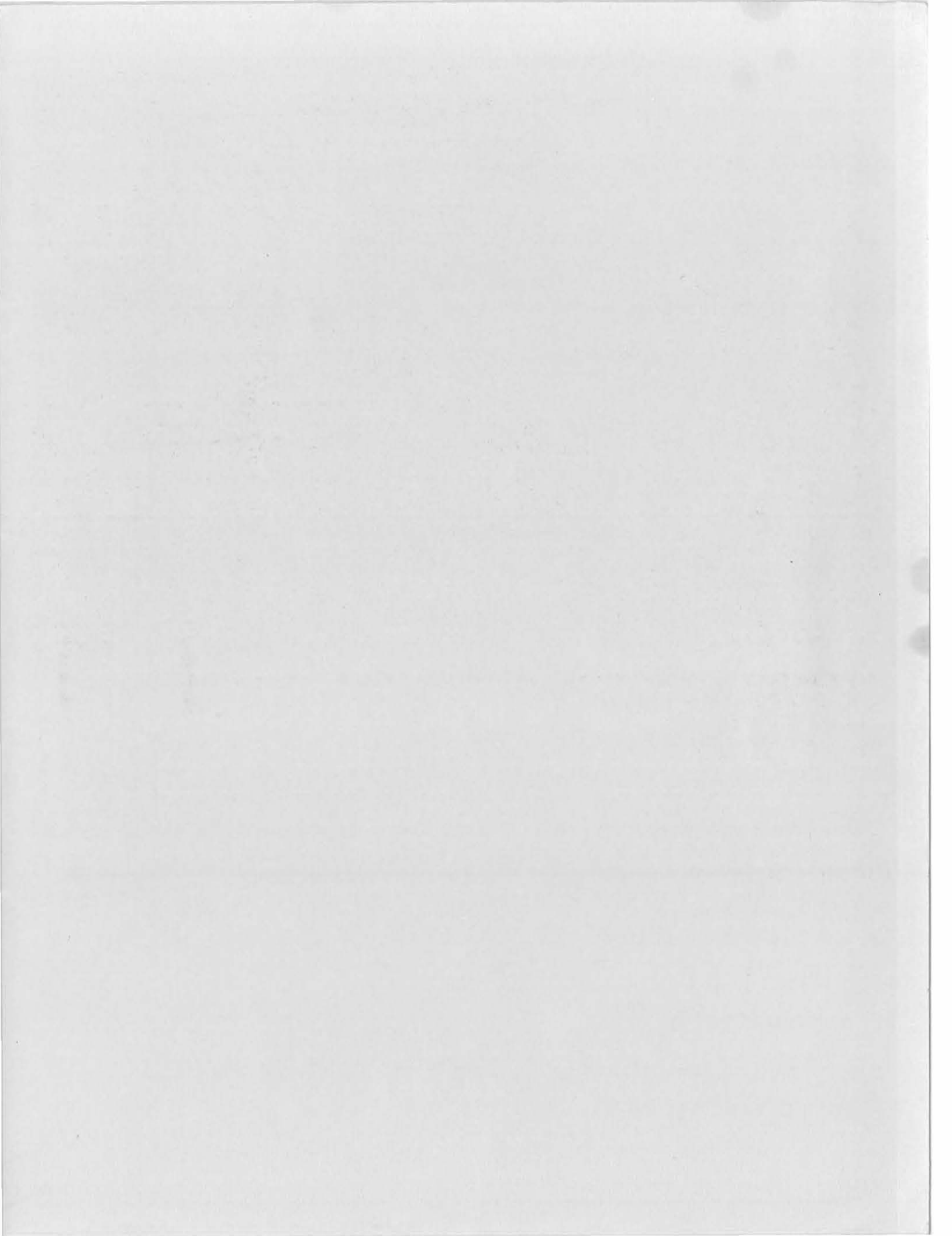

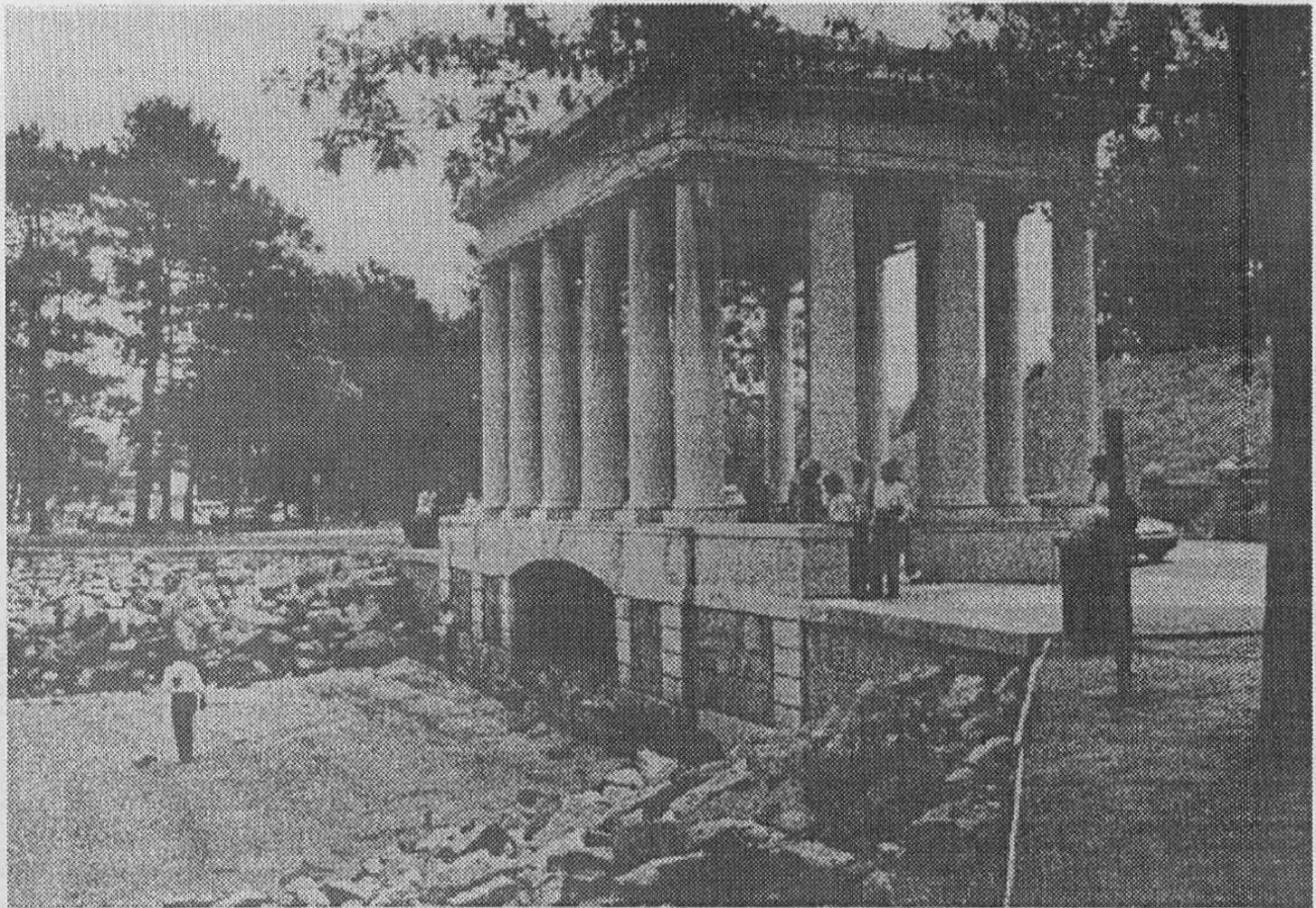
