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SOULE KINDRED ANNUAL MEETING September 20, 1997

The meeting was called to order by the president, Chris Schlosser at 10:05 A.M.

Chris welcomed the group and thanked Barbra Johnston for an outstanding reunion.

She asked for approval of the minutes of last years annual meeting. Barbara Johnston moved for acceptance, Norman Soule' seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

Business from minutes of last year

A discussion of the coverlet which we received a flier about last year was discussed. The coverlets are designed for organizations. The minimum orders are 75. Since last year 12 people have contacted B J Haner, these people would order about 20 coverlets. Chris has had some ideas about a design we might want to use. The cost of the coverlets would be between \$35 and \$45. It was decided the coverlets would be mentioned in the news letter one more time. It would require 60 pre-orders in order to go ahead with buying them.

Reports

Marianne & Chet Witters, 1st Vice President. sent in a letter of resignation. Chet passed away in November and Mary Ann was not up to continuing at this time. She also wrote a letter thanking everyone for their kindnesses. Both letters will be published in the newsletter.

The Treasurers report was supplied by B.J. A move for acceptance was given by Bob Bishop and seconded by Warren Soule. The motion was unanimously approved.

B. J. supplied the membership report. On it was a net loss of 1. However, since the report was printed there have been 5 new members, making a net gain of 4. A motion to approve the report was made by Carol Soule and seconded by Barbra Johnston. The motion was unanimously passed.

Geraldine Schlosser gave the historians report. There was a similar volume of letters requesting information this year as last. She apologized for the backlog. Gerry is continuing to work on the files and is accumulating information on the 5th generation, on some of the 5th generation she has nothing. She requests that members send in information on their own line. She recommends we appoint a new historian as she will be unwilling to continue much longer. The person should have some background; familiar with our material, some genealogical research training and knowledge of source materials and how to use them. Gerry commended Louis Creiger, who has done an amazing amount of research on William the Lyalist. He would like to know if any of the members are descendants of William. B.J. moved to approve the report and Barbra seconded. Unanimously passed.

Chris said we would hold off discussing the replacement of historian until all the reports were completed.

Jim Soule Reported on Indexing. He brought copies of the Indexes. The price of indexes is \$10. There were a few requests for indexes. The index of the newsletter which Will publishes in the newsletter every January. This is the name of everybody that was in the Newsletter and a topic index of what has been in the Newsletter the previous year. The second index is based on the first five generations of Scule's. A motion for acceptance by Stanley Soule and seconded by Pat Johnston. Unanimously passed.

Willis Soule reported on the Newsletter. He needs articles from the members. Also needs birth and death announcements, Lineage's. He asked if we liked the splash of color which is available at an additional

cost of \$35 per issue. Everybody seemed in favor of keeping the color. Barbara Granum said that newspaper articles sent into the newsletter should have the date, city and state written on them. Will has started an E-Mail section which all the computer buffs were very much in favor of. The deadline for the next newsletter is **October 15, 1997**. Warren Soule moved to approve the report and B.J. seconded. The motion was unanimously carried.

B.J. Reported on the Scholarship committee. The scholarship committee recommends the following people this year will to be awarded scholarships. Emily Irene Buckholz of Waupaum, WI, Terrance Soule' of East Taun, MI and Michael Piehl of Hudchenson, MN . A motion to approve the scholarship nominations was made by Fred McBurney and seconded by Warren Soule. It was unanimously carried. Carol Godreau suggested we might want to consider book scholarships, after a brief discussion of the expense of going to college. A question was asked how the winners were selected. There is an application in the newsletter. The fill out the application, send in two letters of recommendation and proven lineage. A discussion was made as to how the applicants found out about the scholarship committee. The members are Harrison Leland, Betty Harris and B.J. B.J is chairman. A discussion of whether the organization wants more input. It seemed that the organization is satisfied with the method of handling the scholarship. The recipients will have their bios published in the January Newsletter. Chris Hill mentioned her daughter received the scholarship 4 years ago and graduated sum cum laud. and is now in graduate school. It was suggested that it would be nice to publish letters from some recipients if we could get them. There will be a list of scholarship winners published the January Newsletter.

Membership report was given for Bob Soules. About 13 people have become new members due to Barbra's efforts in conjunction with this reunion. It was suggested that we spread the word in local historical societies and libraries. Fred Mc Burney moved that report be accepted and Warren Soule seconded. Motion carried.

Elections

The current officers with the exception of the Witters, who had resigned, were nominated for their present offices. The nomination for 1st Vice President was Bob Bishop. A motion that nominations be closed was made by Warren Soule and seconded by Eugene Johnson. The motion was unanimously passed and a ballot was cast by the secretary for the offices.

Next was nominations for Board of Directors for terms to last to year of 2000. The following nominations were made: Carol Godreau

Frank Soule Jack Soule Norman Standish Barbra Johnston

Jack Soule moved that nominations be closed, Bill Blanchard seconded the motion.

A closed ballot for three candidates was made by each member. Norman Soule' and Warren Soule were counters. The new directors elected were

Motion to destroy all ballots was made by Fred McBurney and seconded by Gene Johnston. Motion carried.

New Business

At the present Soule Kindred has a Web Page under Chris's name. The discussion over whether we'd like a page under the Soule Kindred Society name,. The costs would be \$100 first year to register the name (this would cover two years registration) then \$50/year thereafter. Also a \$50 set up fee and \$50/month user fee. These fees are estimates based on the service Chris uses.

Christine Hill moved that the Board be authorized to investigate and spend up to \$1000 to get us started. Carol Soule seconded the motion. It was unanimously carried. Bill Blanchard said he would help with the start up costs in the amount of \$500.00

B.J. read a letter from Caroline Cardel, Historian General of Mayflower Society. The letter requested that we contribute \$100 toward program on the Pilgrims in Leidon to be reestablished. B.J. moved that we contribute the \$100, Chris Schlosser seconded, Frank added a stipulation that we be recognized as a contributor, which was added to the motion. Bob Bishop mentioned that we were not a member of the Leidon Group. The motion was carried unanimously.

We have run out of shirts which have our emblem on the pocket. Norm will order another batch before the next reunion.

There are two people interested in the roll of historian, Jack Soule and Rick Saunders. Barbara Granum moved that a committee to select a new historian be selected by the President. Peggy Turner seconded and the motion was carried. Interested persons are to send their resume' to Chris.

Chris asked for someone to plan next years reunion. Peg Rocke offered to plan the reunion to be held in Vero Beach, Florida. The offer was accepted. The reunion will be held in Vero Beach sometime in October of 1998.

The banquet will be held tonight and Masterson's Restaurant followed by a boat trip in the Spirit of Jefferson. We will go by bus leaving from Barbra's house at 2 P.M.

Motion for adjournment was made by Bob Bishop and seconded by Norman Soule'. Meeting adjouned at 12:05 P.M.







Dear Will,

The reunion in Madison, IN, was particularly meaningful for me for the following reason:

I joined the Indiana Society of Mayflower Descendants in 1976. On the front page of the January 1977 Sole Kindred Newsletter my lineage was on the front page. When this appeared, I had a letter from a second cousin, Henchman Sylvester Soule II which said, "I will tell you about your grandfather's second family if you ask." That grandfather's name was Edward Lincoln Soule. So by return mail, I asked.

Henchman sent me a copy of a page from a previous Soule Kindred Newsletter that Had a letter from Barbara Grannum from Carmichael, CA that was my half-first cousin. Barbara and I have been corresponding ever since and have met several times. At the Madison reunion, Mary Ann Hale came who is another half-first cousin that I had not met. Like frame the same Grandfather, Ind Auffanthe Grandmothers

In 1891 my grandmother Elizabeth Phelps Soule divorced Edward Lincoln Soule. The reasons that I have heard were - he had spent all his money and she thought he would spend all of her. She was pregnant with her fifth child, and she thought she would be pregnant for the rest of her life. He was an alcoholic, and the final straw was that he brought another woman into the house.

Well! He went to Texas, married Georgia May (Barbara and Mary Ann's grandmother) and had seven more children. The Texas family never knew about the New England family and visa versa. He died penniless.

I thought my grandfather, Edward, had died when my father was a little boy. When I was a teenager, I asked by father how old he was when his father died. He told me he died just two years ago - I never knew about the divorce. It was never mentioned.

GENEALOGICAL PITFALLS - OLD MEANINGS OF WORDS by Mrs. Robert M. Sherman

It is difficult to persuade those who have not used original documents that spelling was a rather casual affair from 1620-1820. Words and even names were spelled the way they sounded to each writer. In a single deed, a man's surname may be spelled several different ways. Indeed, not until about the Civil War did there suddenly appear to be a "right" and a "wrong" way to spell words, and relatives started feuding over the "correct" way to spell their family names.

Even the terminology expressing family relationships was not as precise as today and the genealogist who applies only modern meanings to the term's cousin, in-law, junior, and spinster can draw some very wrong conclusions.

Here are a few examples of the use of these terms, taken from the Colonial period:

Cousin — although we usually apply the term rather strictly today to the children of our aunts and uncles, in the early days of our country, cousin often meant nephew, niece, or an even more distant relative. Perhaps this sort of meaning survives today among persons who share the same remote immigrant ancestor, or merely descend from fellow passengers on the Mayflower and yet address each other as "cousin."

In-law — a relationship produced by law, rather that by nature. Thus a man's father-in-law was either his wife's father or his own mother's new husband. It is rather plain when a 14 year old boy chooses as guardian his "father-in-law," that step-father is meant. The term's son-in-law, etc., had the same dual usage's.

Junior — one of the most misleading of all terms, for although we limit its use today to the man whose father bears the same name. 200 years ago it meant merely the younger man in town bearing that name, be he cousin, nephew, grandson of senior, or even no relation at all. As middle names were virtually unknown until the 1800s, and towns often had several families of the same name, those who also carried the same first name were bound to become difficult to distinguish. They lessened the confusion for themselves (but not for us) by labeling the elder man Sr. and the younger, Jr. When Sr. died or moved from town, Jr. stopped using the title. When a third of the same name appeared in town, this again altered the order. Visualize, if you can, the town of Wallingford, Conn., where five men, all bearing the name John Hall, lived at the same time. They were called, from the eldest to the youngest, Sr., Jr., 3rd, 4th, and 5th without regard to their family relationship. If 3rd died or moved from town, 4th and 5th then became 3rd and 4th and so on. One may even find deeds where a man refers to himself as "Jr., formerly 3rd." Could there be a more confusing situation?

The author has seen a will in Plymouth, Mass., where a man named Samuel referred to his sons Benjamin, Jr., Samuel, Jr., and David. Samuel Sr. may well have had a brother in town also named Benjamin, thus Samuel's son must be called Jr., to avoid legal confusion.

Spinster — even more experienced genealogists say this meaning has not faced them. So perhaps it is a Massachusetts phenomenon. However, the author has found enough examples using the term to mean "a woman who spins" rather that the popular "an old maid" (both are Webster definitions) to proved that it is not an error. We had spent some time checking wills and deeds searching for various female Mayflower descendants who had married, and found documents describing women of those very names as spinster. At first we passed them up, but finally found proof that these were the women we sought. Here are two examples we have collected:

Plymouth (Mass.) Co. deeds 36:144, "Adam Hall and Sarah Hall, wife to the said Adam and we Mary Sherman and Abigail Sherman ... the above said Adam yeoman and Sarah, Mary and Abigail spinster," sell land to Cornelius White, Jr. of Marshfield, 28 March 1744.

Plymouth (Mass.) Co. probate 40:234. "I Deborah Reed of Weymouth in the County of Norfolk, spinster ... give to my sons Seth Reed, Noah-Reed ... five daughters ... 11 April 1804 presented as last will and testament of Deborah Reed late of Abington, widow, deceased. 3 June 1805."

Brother — may mean brother-in-law, church brother, or step-brother, etc.

Unmarried — this term may only mean that the person's spouse is dead, that he is presently unmarried. This usage continues today in land records and even occurs in the deeds conveying the Winslow House in Plymouth to the General Society.

A final word to sum up, don't draw conclusions about ancestors without knowing the facts. You may climb the wrong family tree!

From *Montcalm County* (Michigan) history book, published 1919, sent in by Mona C. Moeckel, 4249 Dexter Trail, Stockbridge, MI 49285, July 18, 1997:

"The late Irwin M. Collins was a Christian gentleman and a review of his life is justly entitled to a place in the pages of this history. He was the son of Charles E. and Adela (Bennett) Collins, and his birth occurred in their home in Lenawee county, Michigan, on May 17, <u>1871</u>. Charles Collins was a native of Lenawee county, Michigan and was born on May 24, 1855. His parents were Simeon and Phoebe A. (Soule) Collins. Simeon Collins was born on January 22, 1820, and was the son of Hiram Collins and wife, both natives of New York state. Simeon Collins was reared and educated in his native state of New York and his marriage to Phoebe Soule was solemnized there. She was born in 1827 and was the daughter of George B. and Ellen (Clement) Soule, who left their native state and settled in Steuben county, Indiana, where they farmed for many years, finally locating in Waterloo, Indiana, where they both died."

Greetings from a member of the Soule Kindred. I write to you as Newsletter editor in hopes you will print a query from me in a forthcoming issue.

My grandfather was George Hicks Sowles (later Soule), born in or near Alburgh Center VT 1846, died in Towner ND 1911. I am a descendant of his marriage (1891) to his second wife, Margaret Annette Mitchell, and I have found it easy to fill in these lines up to the present. But George Hicks Sowles had a first wife, presumably in or near Alburgh, named Isabella E. Mooney (ca. 1847-1885). Her parents were Robert G. Mooney and Catherine. My records have four children of George Hicks Soule and Isabella: Robert F. (?) 1866-1911; Mary I. (1869-1926); Guy Vassar (1872-1882); and William L. (1874-1888).

My question for members of the Soule Kindred is this: can anyone help me locate descendants of these children? Mr. David Bell of Alburgh suggests that Mooneys and Sowles (and Vassars) appear in records of Chazy, NY. There were a Renold Sowle and a Stephen Sowle there about 1900. Any other information or suggestions?



DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM "the Loyalist" SOULE (?1739-1811) OF ALBURGH, VT

Dear Gerry:

It will soon be 2 years since I started looking for William "the Loyalist" SOULE (ca 1739-1811) of Alburgh, Vermont. I'd like to tell you, and all my fellow *Mayflower Rejects*, that I've found his parents, but the proof still eludes me. Nevertheless, I haven't given up the search, <u>and - by George!</u> I'm still confident that, eventually, we shall prevail. For that matter, Gerry, I'm still betting that your hunch will turn out to be right -- that William was the son of Timothy⁴ SOWLE, (Nathan³, George²⁻¹SOULE of the Mayflower). My most recent finding points that way: In <u>Contributions to the History of the Eastern</u> <u>Townships</u>; published in 1866, Cyrus Thomas states unequivocally that William Soule was from Rhode Island. Mrs. C. M. Day used the same reference in 1869 (in the larger <u>History of the Eastern Townships</u>).

So I continue to look for clues - under rocks along the road, from Dartmouth, Mass. to Tiverton, R.I., to Connecticut, and to the "contested lands" of [today's New York] Dutchess, Columbia and Rensselaer, Counties. What a fascinating saga in America's history. What a journey it must have been for William and Anna Soule as they struggled to build a home for the seven sons. And we can only cringe at the thought of how they would have been caught up in the struggle between the federalists and the loyalists - as vicious in that region between New York and New England as in any area throughout the colonies.

Some of my cousins have suggested: "Why don't we hire a professional Genealogist?" Gerry, I think you expressed your feeling on this before. A lot of time and money has already been spent searching all the usual places for vital statistics. But I keep hoping that I'll stumble upon a clue about William and Anna Soule as I follow less obvious paths - about the lives and fortunes of others, who like them were caught in the same circumstances, in the same time, and in the same places - others <u>from</u> the Spencertown area, <u>in</u> Jessup's Corp., <u>married</u> to their children, settled in the Loyalist townships, of both the U.S. and Canada.

My problem is not <u>lack</u> of leads!!-- if anything, I've got too many of them. I just got a new one that suggests focusing more on Claverack, instead of Spencertown, for traces of Anna and the sons, in the years just before, and during, the war. Wm.'s oldest son, Timothy, is reported to have come from Claverack when he enlisted in the King's Forces in 1780. And Christian Wehr - the Loyalist Militia Captain who signed up our William 'Souls' as a Sergeant, was from Claverack also. I've learned that Wehr was forced from his home in September, 1776. It was almost a year later, August 27, 1777, when he brought his 40-man Company, with Sergeant William Souls, to join "*His Majestys Forces then at Fort Miller*". I'm curious how long William had been with Wehr? My guess is that they knew one another for some time, and that William was assisting him in recruiting, probably for months before the merger with Jessup's Corp. on Aug. 27, 1777(- else, why the *Sergeant* rank?). Every now and then, someone leaves a clue about William Soules. One of them, someday, may lead to a definite link to his past.

Meanwhile, we've learned lots about Sgt. William Soule's military service. I pretty-much know where he was, and what he was doing, throughout the war (he was in "Engineer's Work"). This picture is

developed from a few isolated records of William's personal status, telling where he was assigned, but lots of information on the location and business of the specific Regiment and Company that he was in. This gives me lots of other names of his associates to look for also.

The search has been great fun. I'm learning a lot of history and meeting some delightful cousins along the way. I am corresponding with three descendants of [Wm.'s oldest son] Timothy and Briget (Sewell) Sowles via e-mail. Soule Kindred members: Joan (Soule) Verdoorn, Jim Ingwalson, and George Alan Soule, Jr. have all contributed material on that line. We have identified 150 Direct Descendants of Timothy and Bridget Sowles!

I recently hit pay dirt on [Wm.'s 3rd son] Joseph Soule's line, at the Brome County Historical Society. Miss Marian Phelps at the Hist. Soc. had collected this information. I've charted 60 descendants on that line and I've just mailed a note to Donald Soles in W. Brome, Quebec, for help with more. He still lives on "Soles Road".

Both [Wm.'s 5th and 6th sons] John and Sylvia (Marvin) Sowles' and Lewis and Mary (Marvin) Sowles' lines are fascinating to research. 5th son John and 6th son Lewis both married daughters of Capt. Benjamin Marvin - So here's the fun part:

Loyalist Sgt. William Sowles, and Patriot Capt. Benjamin Marvin were both in the Battle of Bemis Hill at Saratoga - on opposite sides. Sowles was captured and paroled to Canada; Marvin was injured, but spent the winter with Geo. Washington at Valley Forge. These two men shared at least 12 grandchildren while both were still living in Alburgh.

I have identified about 50 descendants of John and Sylvia (Marvin) Sowles and about 150 of Lewis and Mary (Marvin) Sowles.

Finally, [Wm.'s 7th son] David and Jimima (Salmon) Soule. I did find David's baptism record (New Years Day, 1778). And I have traced him from Alburgh, Vt., to Sutton, Que., and back to Alburgh. But I've no new information about the reported move to Michigan. I'd love to hear from some of his descendants.

Gerry, I'm enclosing a 16-page listing of 420 Direct Descendants of Sgt. William and Anna (Sewell) Soule. Do you have any advice on what I should do with it? (Be nice now!). Could you print out a similar listing from your file to which I might compare this one? I don't mind doing the work; it's just that I currently have nothing to compare to. The list of William's descendants has grown too big to deal with as a whole. From now on, we can work with just one branch at a time.

Information that I have in my Randall genealogy book. Always open for corrections, omissions and additions.

Soules of Great Britain and America were of Norman descent. The family was represented at the Battle of Hastings. Soon after the battle the "pioneer families" of Sole came to Kent, England, and held lands. Many of the peasant families settled around London soon after the conquest. It appears that the American families were descended from some of the immigrants who represented the peasant class in Normandy, and had established their homes not far from London. Soles of the noble class settled in Scotland and were powerful there in the early days.

George Soule was born in Eckington, England, maybe as early as 1590. He came over on the Mayflower in 1620 as an apprentice to Gov. Edward Winslow. There are strong reasons for believing that he did not go to Leyden with the Pilgrims, but that Winslow knew him and picked him up near Loudon. He was probably esteemed for his learning and was selected to become the instructor for Winslow's children on the voyage. Soon after his settlement at Plymouth he was granted a small tract of land for a houselot. In 1645 he sold his lands to Hicks and Southworth, and founded a new home in Duxbury with Miles Standish and others. He settled at Powder Point. He served as one of the earliest selectmen and civil magistrates and as representative to the General Court in 1642, 45, 50, 53, & 54. He was one of the original purchasers of land in Dartmouth and Middleboro. He was a collaborator with Gov. Prince, Winslow and Constant Southworth in the revision of colonial law. He married as early as 1622 Mary Becket. She must have known him in England and came

over on the "Ann". She died December 1676 in Duxbury. He died February 1, 1679/80, also in Duxbury. His will dated Aug 11, 1677, John, his eldest son was appointed sole executor.

Greetings from a member of the Soule Kindred. I write to you as Newsletter editor in hopes you will print a query from me in a forthcoming issue.

My grandfather was George Hicks Sowles (later Soule), born in or near Alburgh Center VT 1846, died in Towner ND 1911. I am a descendant of his marriage (1891) to his second wife, Margaret Annette Mitchell, and I have found it easy to fill in these lines up to the present. But George Hicks Sowles had a first wife, presumably in or near Alburgh, named Isabella E. Mooney (ca. 1847-1885). Her parents were Robert G. Mooney and Catherine. My records have four children of George Hicks Soule and Isabella: Robert F. (?) 1866-1911; Mary I. (1869-1926); Guy Vassar (1872-1882); and William L. (1874-1888).

My question for members of the Soule Kindred is this: can anyone help me locate descendants of these children? Mr. David Bell of Alburgh suggests that Mooneys and Sowles (and Vassars) appear in records of Chazy, NY. There were a Renold Sowle and a Stephen Sowle there about 1900. Any other information or suggestions?

SOULE KINDRED INDEXES AVAILABLE

A third index has been completed for about 1,000 persons who are descendants but do not have the name Soule or other spelling variations. This Surname Index was created primarily from lineage's submitted recently by members of Soule Kindred. It should be used with our earlier indexes and the 1992 supplement published in the 1992 Soule Kindred Newsletter Summer edition (Volume XXVI, No. 3).

Also available are copies of the original index created by Dr. Milton Terry listing more than 7,000 individuals with the name Soule, including codes for the source of information and a numbering system for tracing lineage of many individuals. That index includes the names of the spouse of about 5,000 of the individuals.

Those spouse names have been indexed in alphabetic order with name and code number of the individual in the original Terry index. However, you must have the Terry index to use the spouse index.

The cost of each of the three indexes is a standard \$ 10.00, including mailing. They are printed on 81/2 by 11 inch paper.

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
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
