

# Texas or Massachusetts?

As I read the papers turned over to me by Past President Chris Schlosser, I learned of a long standing uncertainty arising from Soule Kindred having been incorporated in 1972 in both Texas and Massachusetts.

It is clear that the 1973 annual meeting of the Kindred was in favor of merging the two corporations, but nothing could be found on legal action taken to do so.

Inquiries were sent to the non-profit corporations divisions of both states. Texas reported that the corporation was voluntarily dissolved April 8, 1974. Massachusetts reported that the corporation's Charter had been revoked November 17, 1986.

Along with this information, Massachusetts sent forms for "revival" of the corporate status, including filing of reports for the previous 10 years. This is in process.

#### Meet Our 1999 Reunion Host

Our 1999 Reunion host, Norm Standish, is a descendant of four Mayflower passengers, George Soule, Edward Doty, John Alden, and Miles Standish.

He is retired from a 32-year career as a researcher and executive in organic chemistry, initially for Standard Oil of Ohio and later, after their merger, with British Petroleum. His specialty was in organic chemistry fields such as polymers, which took him into such practical fields as fiber glass and Corvette auto parts.

For most of his youth, he lived in Lanark, IL in the large Queen Anne-style home of his parents. It was an area which originally attracted many Mayflower descendants.

He became an undergraduate at Beloit College but was drafted for the Korean War a year later. He served mostly in Japan, with duties in Crypt Analytics, a specialty of abstract research without reference to either a known language or code.

After military service, he enrolled at Purdue University where he earned both Master of

Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in organic chemistry.

While at the University, he met and married his wife, Ingrid, and they started a family of three children.

Norm has pursued hobbies in photography, wood working, pottery, hand bookbinding, and marbelized end papers. He remains active in professional and historical organizations and three years ago took third place in national croquet competition.

After the death of his parents, Norm inherited his parent's home and later restored and redecorated it as a Bed and Breakfast under a resident manager. It is furnished largely with antiques that he purchased in England. It will be the headquarters of our Reunion August 11-14.

# SOULE KIN ELECTED TO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

A George Soule descendant, Jerry Rhome, who was quarterback for Southern Methodist University in Dallas in 1961 and The University of Tulsa in 1963 and 1964, has been named to the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. John F. Hanson, chairman, announced Rhome's honor among the 1998 Division I players and coaches.

Jerry's ancestry to George Soule has been developed by his sister, Joann Rhome Herring of Soldotna, Alaska (Quilter2@alaska.net) who is "super proud of Jerry".

A 1964 First Team All-America selection, Jerry Rhome was awarded the Walter Camp Trophy as the nation's most outstanding football player. He capped his senior season by earning recognition as the Player of the Year by the Academy of Sports Editors, Knute Rockne Club Player of the Year and Washington Touchdown Club Player of the Year.

A two-time First Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection, Rhome was runner-up in the 1964 Heisman Trophy balloting. Twice named the team's Most Valuable Player (1963, 1964), he was elected to the Tulsa Athletic Hall of Fame and had his number 17 jersey retired.

Rhome's National Football League playing career then lasted from 1965-71 with the Dallas Cowboys, Cleveland Browns, Houston Oilers and the Los Angeles Rams.

He returned to the University of Tulsa to be the Offensive Coordinator from 1973 to 1976. In 1977 he became an NFL coach with the Seattle Seahawks and has been in the NFL as a coach ever since. # Soule Kindred in America - Historians Office

# for the Year 1999

# Priority 1: Re-establishment of the Soule Kindred Historian - Associate Historian.

The first idea I have for to the re-organization of the Historian's Office, is to re-establish the Office of Associate Historian. This office was established several years ago, then "prematurely" dis-established after the short life of one year. I have always believed that that premature dis-ruption was a mistake; and still; in light of 20/20 hindsight, believe that to be true. There is no good reason for a complete loss of continuity of operation of the Soule Kindred Historian's office such as took place after the death in office of Dr. Milton Terry (A gap of almost 2 years until the office was completely operational); or as was the case during my own selection and appointment process during the last year. I also believe that the associate historian could be a tremendous asset to the Historians office, in the relief some of the burden of "queries" which I have found to be "unbelievably large." I also believe that the appointment of such an Associate Historian should be taken with the idea in mind that the person being appointed would be in line to immediately assume the tasks of the office of Historian, should there be sufficient reason for the Historian to "stepdown." There should not ever again, be allowed, the "complete fiasco of selection" which took place during my own selection as Historian.

In light of these ideas, and the experience of having dealt with her on a "direct genealogical research" basis for quite a while: I've taken the action of designating Mrs. Ruth Hall, of Toledo Ohio., as the first Associate Historian of Soule Kindred in America. She is a highly motivated and capable researcher; has been a member of Soule Kindred in America for several years and carries with her, the experience of having administered and acted as the moderator, of the "SOULE-L Newsletter.", of internet/email computerized research; as well as several years of research in her own and her husbands, Soule family research. Her contributions to the overall goals of the Soule Kindred Historians office through her administration of her SOULE-L Newsletter will continue as she deems proper.

# Priority Two: Soule Kindred Index; Soule Spouses Index; and Soule (Other Surname) Indexes.

For years, the Soule Kindred in America, has had and informal program of indexing all the "Known" descendents of George Soule - Mayflower Pilgrim, their spouses and known descendents of other surnames than Soule/Sowle/etc\*\*. I believe that as conceived, this program was (and remains) a highly effective tool of genealogical research of the George Soule family lines. The last known upgrade of these documents, was in

1992. I believe upgrade of this" highly valuable research tool" should be given a much higher priority than it has had during the past several years. I believe that an at least annual upgrade to these documents should be undertaken. I believe that there should be a much higher priority given to their "computerization." and that they should become immediately available to any/all computer researchers desiring to own them at a "reasonable cost." (My definition of reasonable cost, is the same cost as their hard paper equivalents.)

NOTE: \*\*\*(and all their spelling derivations.)

# Priority Three: Soule Family Researchers Network; Data Bank

Several years ago, I submitted to the Soule Kindred in America; a document which contained ideas for what, for lack of a better name, I called the Soule Family Researchers Network: Data Bank. It contained ideas for how that data bank might be instrumented and administered. I asked for "sanction" of the project by Soule Kindred (merely "Sanction"). I was summarily refused! Such a data bank as I envisioned in that request, already exists in small part.

Soule Kindred has over the past several toyed with the idea of "computerization" of the Soule Kindred archives. Up to a point, that project also had a start toward becoming reality and exists today, as the present Soule Kindred Index; Soule Spouses Index and Soule (Other Surname) Indexes.

Ideas submitted in the "Request for Sanction" letter, and those presented here for the "computerization" of the Soule Kindred Archives, are not incompatible ideas; In point of fact, they are directly complementary.

I believe that the ideas of the Soule Family Research Network: Data Bank and those of the "computerization" of the Soule Kindred Archives should be undertaken as a separate project of the Soule Kindred in America. They could, but would not necessarily have to be, under the auspices of the Historians Office, (which probably would be the source of most of the data.) I believe this project should be given the priority commensurate with it's importance to all Soule family researchers, and within the "educational" role of Soule Kindred as promulgated in our Bylaws. (Question: What has Soule Kindred done to educate anyone lately, other than to provide some scholarships to deserving students?)

Such a project as herein mentioned, has already begun. Some volunteers have been recruited, ideas have been solicited. More of each will be required for its completion. "Sanction" by Soule Kindred is requested! It is not considered as a requirement, only requested as a matter of courtesy and would be desireable. We herewith request the "Sanction" by Soule Kindred in America, for this project.

# Priority Four: Expansion of the Soule Kindred in America Archives Library.

There exists in the Soule Kindred in America's archives, a small but fairly good library of books pertaining to George Soule, and Mayflower subjects. That library is approximately doubled with the inclusion of the contents of my own personal library, which consists primarily of genealogies of families allied with Mayflower families, manuscripts of genealogies of other families, and a growing collection of Cd-Rom computer disks. There have been quite a few new books pertaining to Mayflower subjects, and new CD-Rom disks published in the last few years, all of which could be very complementary to the "educational" goals of Soule Kindred in America.

I believe that the Soule Kindred in America's Historians Office should be engaged in a program of acquisition of some of the newer publications available for Soule Family research and for Mayflower family research. I believe that the Historians Office should have a budget for such acquisition.

My recommendations for the first acquisitions for this purpose would be: The complete set of books published by the General Society of Mayflower Descendents"The Five Generation project" and the Mayflower Families in Progress Series.

Second recommendation should be the complete set of Massachusetts Vital Records on computer CD-Rom disk, as published by Search and Research Publications: Wheat Ridge, CO.

Third recommendation would be that the Soule Kindred get it's own computer, and it"s own copy machine.

# Priority Five: Repair of the old Soule Kindred archives Micro-fiche/Micro-film Copier\reader.

The old machine provided with the Soule Kindred archives, works well for just micro-fiche reading and will also print however the film transport does not work. I have tried to get it working by taking it to a couple of repair facilities, but to no avail. So far, I still have no firm estimate on repair costs and I believe that it should probably be returned to the original manufacturer for repair, but I have,nt accompl;ished that as yet. It should be done ASAP.

# Ventura names lawyer to lead iudicial selection commission

Gov.-elect Jesse Ventura on Monday appointed George Soule, a Minneapolis lawyer, to lead the Minnesota Commission on Judicial Selection, which screens judicial applicants for district court va-

Soule is vice chairman of the part-time commission, which the

Soule is vice chairman of the part-time commission, which the Legislature established in 1990 to reduce political favoritism in judicial appointments. He will replace Kathleen Meyerly, whom Gov. Arne Carlson appointed last year.

The nine-member panel screens applicants for vacancies on the district court bench and provides the governor with three to five names. The governor isn't required by law to pick from the list. "George was selected for his ability to see through partisan influences and select the best judge for the job," Ventura said in a news release. "Under his leadership, this commission will help me fill judicial vacancies in a nonpartisan, nonpolitical way."

news release. "Under his leadership, this commission will help the fill judicial vacancies in a nonpartisan, nonpolitical way."

Soule is only the second appointee by Ventura since his Nov. 3 election victory as the Reform Party candidate. Earlier this month, the governor-elect announced the appointment of Steven Bosacker as his chief of staff. Ventura will be sworn in Jan. 4.

Soule has been on the commission since 1992 and has served on several ad hoc committees that screened candidates for the Minnesota Court of Appeals and specially courts.

sota Court of Appeals and specialty courts. He is a founding partner and practicing civil trial lawyer at the Bowman and Brooke law firm in Minneapolis. He received his law

degree from Harvard Law School. Soule is chairman of the civil litigation section of the Minnesota State Bar Association; chairman of the association's judicial elec-tions committee; a member of the Governor's Commission on Violent Crime, and a member of the Minnesota American Indian

In 1980, he headed the independent presidential effort in Minnesota of then-Rep, John Anderson of Illinois.

Gilbert Randell Soule, a seventh generation from George (the Pilgrim) was born in America, Dutchess County, New York on July 5, 1805.

Heleft New York as a young man accompanied by two brothers. They settled in Michigan where they farmed for a time. Later he moved to Illinois where he also farmed.

While in Illinois he met and married Ester Phidelia Freeman. They lived near Galena, Illinois. She died und is buried at Galena.

Gilbert Randell was left with 5 Children, Freeman Gilbert (my Grandfather), George Alonzo, Orthia Phidelia, Adeline Jane, and Marcia Eliza.

In 1857 Gilbert Randell took his 5 Children to Kansas and settled on Eagle Creek near what is now Olpe, Kansas.

Meet at **Heritage Center**, Lanark. This will be a common meeting place with coffee, cookies, etc. during the reunion. It has a meeting room, clean rest rooms, kitchen, is handicapped accessible.

**Group Bus Tour** - Departure 9:30 a.m. - An opportunity to learn about the hardships our forefathers faced as they came to the "Northwest Territory," which later became Illinois. Our host will speak about the points of interest along the way. At **Stillman Run Battlefield**, the speaker will probably be the man who set up the memorial site and has been moving bodies of militia members there. Then our bus will follow the **Indian Trail** down the **Rock River**, stopping at a grove north of Oregon, IL, noting the dangers to early settlers of horse thieves in that area.

Next stop - **lunch at the Colonial Inn**, Grand Detour, IL, one of the area's finest dining spots and within walking distance of the **John Deere Museum** where the plow was invented that broke the sod of the Prairie. The President of the Lee County Historical Society will speak there on the history of the river crossing at **the Lincoln statue and reconstructed log cabin**. Final stop will be Morrison, IL, where a **Soule descendant** will talk on the family history in that area. Return to Lanark about 5 p.m.

#### Friday, August 13, Stage Coach Tour - Bus, lunch and dinner, \$45

Meet at the Heritage Center at 9:30 a.m. First stop - Lena, IL, to see an early stage coach stop, now a wool spinning center. Learn about the diary of a woman who took the stage coach from Chicago to Galena, IL in the early 1800s. Second stop - Winslow, settled by Pilgrim descendants from Plymouth, MA and also the place where Philadelphia Cream Cheese was developed. Comments by the Mayor. Box lunch at the artesian water well. Third stop - a tour of the Warren Cheese Factory in Warren, IL. Fourth stop - reconstructed stockade at Elizabeth, IL, built for settler protection during the Black Hawk Indian War. Fifth stop - a lead mine. Final stop - a stage coach center where all will ride by reconstructed stage coaches to a site on the Apple River for a trail-side barbecue dinner much like those of early passengers. Return to Lanark about 8 p.m.



SOULE, Carolina Augusta, minister and author, was born in Albany, N.Y., Sept. 3, 182; daughter of Nathaiel and Elizabeth (MArselis) White; granddaughter of Nathaniel and Abigail (Steele) White, and of Gilbert (a native of the south of France) and Sarah Van Benthuisen M. rselis, and a descendant of the Van Benthuisens, earliest settlers (Holland) of Albany, and the Whites and Steeles (English), earliest settlers of Hartford, Vt. She was graduated with honors from Albany Female academy, N.Y., in 1841, and was principal of the female department of the Clinton Liberal institute, N.Y., 1842. Shw was married, Aug. 28, 1843, to the Rev. Harry Birdsall, son of Clement and Mary (O'Dell) Souls, of Dover, N.Y., who died, January 30, 1852, leaving her with five children. She engaged in literary work, and was editor of The Rosebud, an annual, 1854-55; corresponding editor of the Ladies' Repository, Boston, 1855-63, and owned and edited for eleven years The Guiding Star, a Sunday-school publication in New York. She was ordained to the Universalist ministry in 1880, and was pastor at St. Paul's Universalist church, [p. 442] Glasgow, Scotland, 1879-82, and 1887-92. She is the author of: Memoirs of the Rev. H. B. Soul (1852); Home Life (1855); The Pet of the Settlement

(1859); and Wine and Water (1861). In 1903 she was residing in Glasgow, Scotland.

SOULE, Joshua, M.E. bishop, was born in Bristol, Maine Aug. 1, 1781. He was licensed to preach in 1798, and traveled with a Methodist presiding elder as a "boy preacher." He was appointed presiding elder of the Maine district in 1804; proposed a plan for the general conference of delegates and was a delegate to the conferences of 1812 and 1816. He was book-agent and editor of the Methodist Magazine, 1816-20, was elected a bishop in 1820, but declined the election, being opposed to the election of presiding elders by the bishops. He was pastor of churches in New York and Baltimore, 1820-24; and was again elected bishop in 1824, serving till 1842. He was sent as a delegate from the United States to the British Weslevan conference in 1842, was a delegate to the conference held in New York in 1844, when a division of the church was caused by the disagreement of Bishop James O. Andrew and Bishop Soule, the two followings being known as the Methodist Episcopal church, north and south. Bishop Soule became senior bishop of the southern division, with his residence at Nashville, Tenn. He visited the general conference held at Pittsburg but was not officially recognized as a delegate. He retired from the active duties of his office in 1853, and died in Nashville, Tenn., March 6, 1867.

**SOULE FAMILY** 

The following notes were found among the mementoes of MATTIE ELLEN (BEAL) PRICE (11):

"Etta Soule, her Brother Ed (Edwin H.) Soule and his Wife Ella and their family of six children came to Western Kansas when we did and took a homestead one-half mile west of our old stone house. The children's names were: Ada, Bertie, Myra, Jesica (?), Arvie and a Son Phillip.

"Edwin H. Soule had the first post office in the area established 11 February 189 and named Macon. He also helped to establish county government for Wallace County. (Wallace County History Book, Copy-rht 1979). In 1901, the name of the Macon Post Office was changed to the Dinas Post Office and moved to another location in the area.

"The family did not stay very many years in Western Kansas before returning to Illinois. However, upon leaving they retained some Western Kansas land for a number of years. The following listings are in the Standard Atlas for Wallace County, 1908:

"Edwin H. Soule - 160 A in Sec 5-15-38 Edwin H. Soule - 160 A in Sec 32-14-38 H.E. Soule - 160 A in Sec 6-15-38 H.M. Soule - 160 A in Sec 6=15-38

Dwight Soule - Also owned land in Wallace County "Edwin H. Soule has homesteaded on the northwest onefourth of Sec8-15-38. Many settlers sold their homesteads because they could not cope with the dry climate and no money. Neighbors would buy the land for as little as \$25.00 for 160 acres.

"In later years, two or three of the girls went to Abington, Massachusetts, to visit their cousin Augusta. (Barrows) Beal Murray."

I think I was the one to post this information from the Stevens Genealogy. In addition to this source, Susan Roser's Mayflower Marriages, George Soule - Mary Soule(4), daughter of Josiah Soule (3) married Joshua Cushman on January 2, 1732/33 in Duxbury, Mass.

Joshua Cushman was a descendant of Isaac Allerton according to Susan Roser's books. It would appear that Joshua and Mary definietly had children.

I have another Soule/Cushman line that went to Vermont (Thetford).

On 30 Jan 1734/5 in Duxbury, Allerton Cushman, Jr. (b. 16 Dec. 1712) married Alethea Soule (b. 9 Jan 1713/14). Alethea was the daughter of first cousins Joseph Soule and Mary Peterson, both Soule descendants. Allerton was a descendant of several Mayflower families.

This branch moved for about one generation to Coventry, CT, then to Thetford, Vermont. Asenath Cushman, daughter of the above couple, married Joseph Downer whose roots went back to an early Newbury, MA family.

Yes, most of the Cushmans are descended from Robert through his son Thomas who married Mary Allerton. The pink four generation Soule book covers this pretty well.

Does anyone know what progress has been made in revising the silver 5 generation Soule book? Is the revision slated for publication any time soon?

Lynde Stewart Susanna2 Soule (George1) b, prob. Duxbury, abt 1642, d. prob Kings Towne, RI in or after 1684. She m. place and date unknown Francis Wast/West and resided with him in that part of Kings Towne RI which became North Kingstown in 1722/3. The place or date of birth, date of death or parentage have not been found for

When Gov. Andros took over the King's Province in 1687, he levied taxes on the inhabitants of Kingstown RI - renamed Rochester. Included in the list were Francis Wast, Sr., Francis Wast, Jr., and Richard Wast. Only Francis, Sr., had a rate, that of 2 shillings 1 pence. The children of this family have been difficult to trace.

Francis, Susannah, and Martha remained in the Kingstown RI area; William removed to Newport, RI, prob. after the d. of his first wife; Clement moved to Charlestown, RI and then disappears from RI records, perhaps moving to Dutchess County, NY; Richard returned to Plymouth and Bristol

County, living in Middleboro and Taunton. Have not found Peter, John nor Thomas. This family name has a variety of spellings in the public records; Wast, West, Waste, Weast being common variants. Some of Susanna's children are identified in the Samuel West Memorandum Book pub. in the Mayflower Descendant.

Spent a few minutes checking my records.... #2 Thomas who married Abigail Penniman (a Braintree name) came from the Weymouth Whites who are not in any way related to the Mayflower Whites & the marriage (but not the kids) is documented in a book called "The White Family of New England". I had sat down here at the computer several times trying to figure out a way to let you know I wasn't making the progress I had led you to believe, a while back. Every time, I tried to get started some-thing would come up and I would lose my train of thought-"Derailed" so to speak. That happened day before yesterday, when I started a letter to you, and it was during our most recent blizzard, somebody called me for an emergency load of firewood. Children cold no fire need completely out and all that stuff. I made the delivery, but lost the email and couldn't retreive it. Here I am again: Only this time with some better results. I was able to sit down again last night and do some more "Heavy Thinking" bout ol' John.

Actually, what has been happening, is that I really didn't have enough "clues" on ol' John until just recently you were able to give me the hint that his Fathers name was also John. That hint plus one that I found in the Soule Kindred Archives-Card files led me to his entire

lineage back to "Georgie Baby" of Mayflower fame. That second hint had been sitting right there where past Historians had put him and right where he belonged waiting for me to find him. Your John the father made me notice him---Finally. 2nd hint you ask? John "B's" Middle name was "Bowker."

It would also fill in some gaps in Soule Kindred Archives.

Nuff for that-Next Subject: Lincoln/Soule research. I have also not had good luck with that as yet. I took note of your recent email re: Ebenezer Soule/Sarah Oakley. This is one of the "unresolved" lines that Soule Kindred in America has worked on for several years. I worked on it myself for one of my old customers quite a while ago. It appears that you've found most everything that Soule Kindred has in our archives, however, it would require going into the files and "copying out," everything if that should be your desire. There could be quite a few pages, and I'm not going to go through that drill, unless you say "Go!" I do have a better suggestion for now.

I've gone into the index for Family Tree Maker v5.0 and made a printout of all the entries I find for Ebenezer Soule, Gilbert Oakley, and Sarah Oakley. What I think we should do is for me to make a copy of this list for you, unless in case you may have the same genealogical software. If you did, then you could make a copy of the same entries yourself. After you get copies of these entries, then sit down and "bump" all the entries against each other manually. (I don't have a search program which would handle such a "sort"). The goal of this sort would be to try to come up with a reduced size list, which in "high likely-hood" would contain all three of the individuals mentioned here. I'll do the same and then we'll compare notes. After that we'll make copies of every entry which we end up with from the Cd"s we own. All this to try to figure out who the Ebenezer you're working on really is. This may be a good trick because there were at least 4 (maybe more) Ebenezer's in Columbia Co. N.Y. at the same time you've mentioned in your query of 13 Jan. 1999.

All the above "verbage" is by way of letting you know that "I don't know who Ebenezer was---Yet!" I'm willing to take him on if you are. As Soule Kindred in America Historian, I'm also extremely interested in him. Hope we can "unravel" him, But no guarantees, O.K?

pages I've printed out. I would try to send them by an email attachment, but my prior success with that endeavor, has been zilch!

Hi Nancy:

Yep, I thought I'd get some questions about those pages I sent. They're from the "Soule Kindred Index," which I think I've made

reference to in several emails to Soule-L. The Soule Kindred Index, is actually a tabulated lineage chart of a "slew" of lineages from numerous persons who have contributed research to Soule Kindrd Archives over the past 50 years. It contains 135 pages of these Soule Ancestral Numbers cross referenced to a second column of Parent Ancestrel Numbers. Since they are in numerical order, you

can follow them back right to George Soule, who is number 2723 on page 53.

There can sometimes be a glitch; If the parent ancestral number is "0", that is where the reported and researched lineage ends. It means that with all the research that has been done, both by Soule Kindred and by the individual who was researching that line, there was a break in the lineage and no further information could be found. Sometimes a break of a generation, sometimes more. More research is needed. Soule Kindred doesn't have the answer.

You've "nuked out" the first few columns pretty well. As for the next column after the date of birth; the Ltf stands for Letter file; Cdf is card file; Mai is Mayflower Ancestral Index. Sometimes there will be a 4 digit number there which is the number of the lineage line of the person donating the name, if there is no other reference material codw which would apply. Sometimes there is a [VR:ME] or a [VR:RI] or some other [VR:xx] That means that the entry was taken from Vital Records and the State. Mostly, the codes lead me as Soule Kindred Historian, back to the Card File-Cfl; File Drawer=Ltf; or Red Book-rbk which should have the original research files of the individual concerned. We do have a pretty "jam-packed" file cabinet of research files.

I didn't mention the rbk file till last, for a reason: Col. John Soule who was the first historian of Soule Kindred (I think but not sure) Started a file of "Red Notebooks: all containing Family Group Sheets and detailing each family line from the researcher back to George Soule. It grew like "Topsy" into about 30 or more loose leaf notebooks of possibly a hundred family group sheets or more in each one. By todays research standards with computers, it's a son of a gun to research. I've not yet been able to "nuke" out his filing system in the red notebooks. Incidentally, all these files have been photocopied by the LDS church and are contained on a series of 12 micro-films rolls which are numbered 1531547 thru 1531558, in the LDS film catalogue of the LDS "Family History Library Catalogue-Surname." This may or may not mean anything to you but if you took these numbers and went to a Mormon Family History Center they would lead the librarian right to them. You could rent the film, any one or more, and have it's use available at the Mormon Family History Center nearest you.

Hope all this makes sense. Until next time.

Elisha Soule was born in Massachusetts, May 15, 1806, a son of Rowland and Mary (Phelps) Soule. In Early life he removed to Truxton, Cortland County, New York where he was married May 10, 1826 to Polly Colegrove, a daughter of William and Susannah (Brightman) Colgrove. She was born in Rhode Island, whence the family moved to New York State.

Quoted from the Barron Shield Friday March 18 1881 "Old Mrs. Edgbert of sumner is reported to be very sick, as is also Mr. B. R. Estabrook"

Quoted from the Chetek Alert Newspaper, 16th, February 1884: (microfilm at the Rice Lake Public Library)
"Obituary: Died- At the residence of her son-inlaw in the town of Sumner, Barron Co. Wisconsin on the 2nd day of February 1884, in the eighty-first year of her age, Mrs. Mary Soule Edgbert.

The deceased has known much of the trials and triumphs of pioneer life in three states. Born in the state of NY, she experienced in her childhood, many of the joys and sorrows which are common to a new country. Afterward, with her husband and growing family of children she contributed her full share towards forming and developing the present social and religious advantages of a part of Tioga County, PA. The last thirty years of her life she has resided in Wis. - surviving her husband twenty years. She combined energy and prudence in her household affairs, From early life she was a devoted Christian and a constant member of the M.E. Church, to which she was ardently attached. The patient and cheerful manner in which she met all the events which occurred in her family and community even to infirm old age, is a benediction to all her kindred associates. As the Mantle of Elijah fell upon Elisha, so shall the mantle of Christian Grace, which characterized, "mother" Edgbert, fall upon her only son, her four daughters, her twenty one grandchildren, and her score of great grandchildren; guiding them also through a safe, happy and

Hi Nancy: (Again for today's second time)

1. I've been looking back into my SK archives files for whatever information, we had communicated between us regarding Cozette Soule and Edward Holman. I think I'm even more confused now than I was before

taking a look. There are some unresolved questions in what we've covered.

A. Soule Kindred has no actual evidence of Hannah Soules' marriage to a Holman, or for that matter, to anyone. In my Soule Kindred Index her spouse is indicated thusly: [?] [?].

B. We have no evidence of anyone named Cozette Soule either. Our initial notice of these two persons was as a result of email regarding them.

NOTE: I've made a more or less "flat statement here" so let me qualify it somewhat: What I mean is that I myself have not found evidence as yet of Cozette or a husband of Hannah. The two may easily be contained somewhere in the SK Archives, I may not have yet got to it. I'm still "Green" on some aspects of the Archives. I shall however, continue to look; there, and in CD-Rom vital records.

- C. I'm wondering whether you might have "stumbled onto" an "Illegitimate birth-Kissing cousins behind the woodshed," type thing. My reason, for saying this: In your first correspondence you indicated (as you've also done a couple of times since,) that Hannah had married a Holman. If Cozette was born a Soule, to where did Mr. Holman disappear? (Oh, I know "My grandma wouldn't have done that either." :-)
- D. There is one other logical explanation for this discrepency though: What if there was a generation or two missing? I don't have the answer to any of these questions. But am keeping my eyes open. O.K?
- 2. In order for your grandchildren to apply for the Soule Kindred Scholarship program, all they have to do is apply. They do not have to be "proven in the strictest sense of the word," as they might to apply

through the General Society of Mayflower descendents. I don't know what the requirements of the General Society of MD might even be. I don't know whether they even have any scholarships.

Soule Kindred has not to my knowledge, ever required any sort of "proof" of descendency from George Soule and therefore, no" proof "as such should be required of your children or grandchildren to apply. The only "requirement" Soule Kindred has for membership, per our By-Laws, is an interest in the general educational subject of George Soule and Mayflower History I have purposely questioned this subject at a couple of Soule Kindred annual business meetings, in order to have it

clarified; However there was no specific action taken to clarify it. There was however, a long "Song and Dance." At this time there is no proof required to be a member of Soule Kindred, or to applly for the scholarships. Well, this has become sort of "Windy" as my dad and my favorite aunt used to say. I think you said that you're using Family Tree Maker. If so, the job would not be excessively difficult, only time consuming. I'm not making this a definite part of the above "rental" agreement. Just something I would like you to think about, for the future. You can let me know what you think, no strings attached-O.K?

SKDX\_: Soule Kindred Index: I highly recommend this index to all Soule/Sowle/Sole etc researchers. I think it is one of the most useful tools I use in my own genealogical research, and I wish there was a similar one for every family (Surname) that exists. (I do know of one quiter similar for the SHERMAN family.) This index actually consists of three sections, each of which is also useful as a "stand-alone section". The Soule Kindred Index itself, the Soule Kindred Spouses index, and The Soule Kindred (Other Surname) Index. They admettedly, do have some errors or deficiencies, (such as we've found with John B.) however they are a real advantage to Soule Kindred researchers. If you've been

following the progress of research in the Soule-L Newsletter, you may find it interesting to know that most of the research problems which people have been coming up with, could just as easily have been researched in the archives of the Soule Kindred in America, and by using the Soule Kindred Index as a "tool." It cuts research time down tremendously, and is an extremely good value. It can be ordered from Mr. Jim Schlosser, at 801 E. Brownell St. Tomah, WI. 54660. (Incidentally, I've resumed a policy of continuous upgrede (annually) on these publications, and there is presently one in the works. With your permission, I would like to include entries which have resulted from our mutual research into the next upgrade.)


A straight A student in high school taking mostly honors and college classes, he ranked second in his class of 184, with a grade point average of 102.86.







### SOULE KINDRED IN AMERICA, INC. EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING October 24, 1998

The Executive Board Meeting was called to order by the President, Chris Schlosser at 3:00 P.M. October 24, 1998.

Robert Bishop opened the discussion by stating that there needed to be a better economic base for the job of historian. He feels that the office should be self-supporting. In the past the philosophy of the organization has been that the office be supported by the membership, and be a beginning help for prospective, new and current members. There was much discussion about how much help should be offered, who should have access to the records owned by the organization and if there should be any cost to those desiring help. Charles Jack Sowles, the new historian, said he was doing a great deal of research when requests were being made.

There was no decision made as to the direction the organization should go along this line, but rather it was just an exploration of ideas.

Jack had asked that the organization buy a copier, however it was decided that at this time rather than invest in equipment, the organization would pay 15 cents a copy for the copies that he needed to make. There would be an advance of \$100 for his use. He would submit a statement of the fund use to the treasurer, either if he needed additional funds or before the next reunion in order that the information could be included in the treasurer's report.

The microfiche equipment is in need of repair. The president requested that Jack find out the cost for the repairs, and at the president's discretion, if the repairs would be less than \$300 the repairs should be made.

There was a policy set forth that moneys should be advanced to the host of the next reunion as needed for supplies and deposits.

Jack is to develop a plan for shelves and files to set up his office in order to accomplish the job of historian and to house the files and equipment owned by the organization. The organization will pay for the materials necessary.

Jack will be reimbursed for the cost of moving the files from Gerry Schlosser's home to his office at the rate of 30 cents a mile-\$326.00.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 4:15 P.M.
