Editor's Corner

Happy New Year to all of us. I hope your holiday season has been satisfying and wonderful.

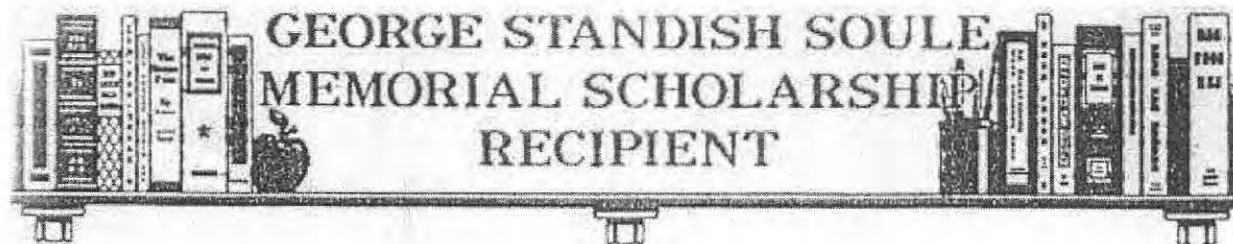
Included in this quarter's edition of the newsletter are several items that usually appear in the annual January printing. Topping the list is the naming and brief bio's of this year's scholarship winners. Congratulations to these wonderful young people for their dedication to learning and their being chosen by the scholarship committee for these awards. They each appear to have done so much in life already, and their stated goals for the future are quite ambitious. Best wishes to each of them.

Also printed in this edition is Jim Schlosser's compilation of the annual index for the 1999 editions of the newsletter. This has not been a small task to accomplish, so kudos to Jim for a job well done. For those of us with a genealogical bent, the annual publishing of the index is invaluable. This is particularly true since the newsletter is subscribed to by a number of genealogical libraries and repositories, where a number of people have access to this information. I may have mentioned this before, but after more than 20 years of searching for a marriage record for my great-grandparents, information in a 1969 edition of the newsletter, found through searching the indexes, finally opened the door for me.

Another key feature in this printing is information regarding the 2000 annual reunion in California. Maria Elana Allstott has already done a tremendous amount of work in organizing and preparing for the event. Hopefully, a good number of the kindred can make it this summer, especially as we have quite a few members residing out west.

One last item, which has to do with costs associated with the printing of the newsletter. I have received conflicting feedback from several folks regarding the e-mail postings. Some people are quite pleased with their inclusion in the newsletter, especially those without computers who would otherwise miss out on some important genealogical and other family information. Others indicate that perhaps I should cut out printing some or all of them, thus saving space and some of the costs associated with printing the newsletter (extra number of pages based on their inclusion). I am amenable to doing that, especially since this is our and not simply my newsletter, but would like to hear from as many of you as possible as to how you feel about the issue.

With regard to the increased cost of the newsletter over previous years, let me mention the following. Obviously, there has been some increase in cost due to the slight increase in the number of pages that were printed in 1999 compared to previous years. We published 224 pages this past year. The three previous years were 180, 218, and 192, however, so the difference is not that great. The more significant reason that the costs for printing the newsletter have gone up since I took over as editor a little over a year ago has in part to do with the cost of printing here in St. Louis. Our previous editor, Wil Soule, was fortunate to have found a printer in South Carolina whose costs were apparently quite a bit less than the going rate in most other places, including St. Louis. The other reason for the increase in cost has to do with the fact that the postal rates went up at the beginning of 1999 for bulk mailing such as we use with the newsletter. All told, the increase has, therefore, been consequential. I continue to look for a less expensive yet quality printer, so far without success. The postal rates, unfortunately, I can do nothing about.

Johanna was a member of the National Honor Society, the Select Chorale, and Swing Singers. She served as a member of the Student Council and Peer Listening.

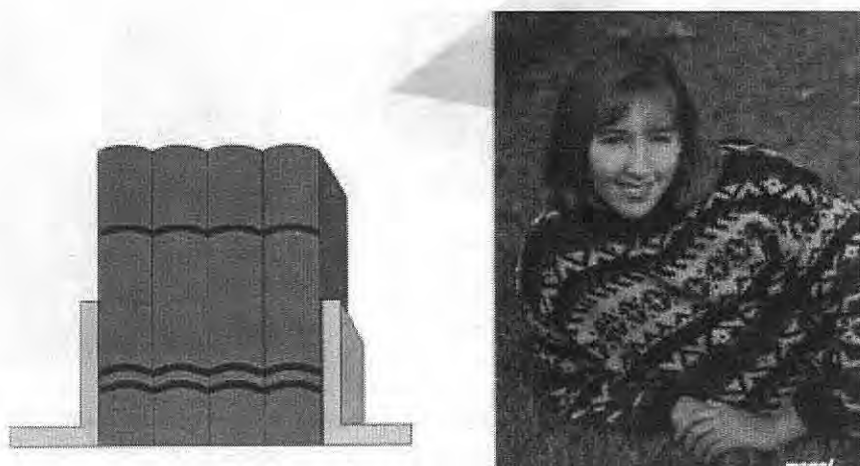

HONOLULU

Birthdays are more special these days to Aileen Riggin Soule, and not just because she's 93.

A pioneering athlete who won a gold medal in diving at the 1920 Olympics in Antwerp, Belgium, Soule is looking forward to turning 95 so she can compete in a new master's age division.

She holds six world swimming records in the 90-94 age group. But her springboard diving days are behind her.

"I don't want to tackle it anymore," said Soule, the nation's oldest living female Olympic gold medalist. "You have to be precise."

The 14-year-old girl from New York and her 17 female teammates almost didn't get a chance to compete in 1920 because officials were concerned about them

traveling with the team's 331 men.

Heavy chaperoning blunted those fears, and the young women took care of any other concerns they weren't athletically primed.

Eiheiida Bleibtrey of the United States won gold medals in all three swimming events, and the U.S. women lost only one aquatic event: platform diving.

With the 80th anniversary of those games approaching, friends in

Hawaii hope that will bring Soule recognition at next September's Olympics in Sydney, Australia.

Soule said she would be honored to attend, but not because she's hungry for recognition. Rather, she, like few others, can appreciate how far the Olympics have come for female athletes.

She does not understate her role, or that of her teammates in Antwerp, in creating competitive opportunities for women.

"I think we were responsible for giving it to them," she said. "Every little breakthrough may have been small at the time, but it added up. There was nobody to follow. We were the first ones."

Although Soule said she could be in better shape, she gives the opposite impression, running errands around Honolulu and

answering fan mail that can fill a grocery sack.

She trains for an hour three times a day in a nearby swimming pool or at Waikiki Beach, where she has lived since her second husband, Howard Soule, died in 1981. Her first husband, Navy doctor Dwight Young, died in World War II.

Soule attributes her longevity to swimming, which transformed an 11-year-old who barely survived Spanish influenza to a toned and dexterous teen-ager.

Her journey to three Olympic medals was quick.

Aileen Riggin spent her early childhood in the Philippines before moving back to New York on the recommendation of a doctor who treated her for anemia.

There, she studied ballet at the Metropolitan Opera School of Ballet and joined a girls swim team coached by Louis de B. Handley of the New York Athletic Club.

Her training partners included future Olympic medalists Helen Wainwright and Gertrude Ederle, who in 1926 became the first woman to swim the English Channel.

As Soule's schoolteacher mother marched down Fifth Avenue with fellow suffragettes, the young girls on the swim team made their statements, shedding the cumbersome stockings that were part of women's swimwear and donning one-piece suits showing their bare legs.

"At this time, Hollywood was coming out with its bathing beauties," Soule said. "We didn't want to compete with Hollywood. We wanted to be sportswomen and not associated with frippery and silly business."

Watching her male counterparts, Soule took a liking to diving and found her ballet training helped her point her toes in such a way that her 65-pound, 4-foot-10 body hit the water without a splash.

In war-impooverished Belgium, the aquatic events were held in a muddy canal — Soule remembers her fear of getting stuck on the bottom. After earning 539.9 points in the springboard competition to beat Wainwright, she received a victory trophy from King Albert.

Soule also competed in the 1924 Olympics in Paris, winning the silver in the springboard — teammate Elizabeth Becker won the gold — and the bronze in the 100-meter backstroke with a time of 1:28.2.

After Ederle's Channel swim, Soule joined her and Wainwright in a cross-country swimming and diving exhibition in 1927.

Soule traveled the world on her own in 1930, putting on diving exhibitions and teaching clinics in Spain, France, England, Sweden, Egypt, Japan and Hawaii, appearing with five-time Olympic swimming gold medalist and "Tarzan" movie star Johnny Weissmuller in Paris.

She also danced in "Roman Scandals," skated in Sonja Henie's "One in a Million," and organized, coached and starred in Billy Rose's first Aquacade.

She broke through another gender barrier in journalism, writing columns on women's sports for The New York Evening Post, the London Morning Post and McCall's, among others.

In a 1931 article for Love Mirror magazine, she cheered the nation's new exercise consciousness.

"I believe the girls of our age have probably been the most benefited by all of this," she wrote. "We can thank our lucky stars that we are no longer expected to

sit by the fireside and knit, while watching our brothers get the most of the fun out of life."

Hi, Maureen: Just a few notes to give you a quick summary on the Soules, as I'm sure you will soon get a lengthy reply from the hundreds (if not thousands) of "cousins" all over the world. Are you aware that there is a family association called "Soule Kindred, inc."? They have an annual meeting, which in 2000 will be in Southern California; they give scholarships to descendants of George Soule, who came to America on the Mayflower, and they publish a quarterly journal. I've never before heard the suggestion that the family came from Spain. Our best information is that George Soule came from Eckington, England, about 12 miles from Worcestire. I was there 10 yrs ago and saw many family graves in two small churchyards, as well as the farm where the Soules lived and worked. I am a 12th generation direct descendant of Pilgrim George Soule; my branch of the family went from England to Massachusetts to New York to Michigan to California. Hester- b. abt 1602 Gloucestershire, England; d. abt 1657

Philip was a French Huguenot. He immigrated to America on the ship Fortune which arrived Nov 9, 1621. Having turned Protestant and becoming an American, he changes De Lannoye (also spelled de la Noyes) to Delano. He came to America to try to marry Pricilla Mullins who came to America on the Mayflower with her parents and brother. She had been in love with his older brother in Holland. When Pricilla's parents took her to America, Phillip's older brother married another so Philip decided to give it a try. Pricilla did not want any of his Flemish blood and married John Alden. Remember the story of Miles Standish asking John Alden to ask Pricilla if she would marry him (Miles). Pricilla said speak for yourself John and she married John.

Philip went out and fought Indians for a few years during the Pequot Indian War. He had land granted to him in Duxbury, Mass in 1624, and he later moved to Bridgewater, Mass.

Philip married Hester Dewsbury (also known as Esther) and sought admission to the Pilgrim community after joining the church.

Jean de Lannoy/Marie le Mahieu

Jean- b. abt 1570 Tourcoing, Belgium; d. abt 1604 Leiden, Netherlands; m. Marie le Mahieu abt 1601 Walloon Church, Leiden, Netherlands.

Jean moved from Belgium to Leiden in Holland, a Protestant stronghold, in Netherlands in 1599. He was named after his grandfather who had thrown his father out of the family for leaving the Catholic Church. Here his son Philippe, who founded the American Delano's, was born. Jean and his wife gave 12 large houses to the Pilgrim exiles from England under Pastor John Robinson.

Marie is the sister of Hester le Mahieu (who married Francis Cooke of the Mayflower/Hester came on ship Anne 1623). see <http://genweb.net/~blackwell/blql/cookmayf.htm>

Marie was a compassionate woman of stong conviction and deep religious faith in the Evangical Church but she felt very sorry for Puritans and gave them 12 houses that she owned as a refuge.

Jean de Lannoy- b. abt 1509; d. Oct 31, 1559; m. Jeanne de Ligne Sep 13, 1530

Jean de Lannoy's full title was Seigneur de Molembais, de Solre-le-Chateau.

Jean de Ligne- b. Barbancon; d. Sep 24, 1569

Jean de Ligne was the daughter of Louis de Ligne, Seigneur de Barbancon and Marie de Glymes.

Phillippe de Lannoy/Marguerite Madeleine de Bourgogne

Phillippe- b. abt 1487; d. Sep 12, 1543 Louvain, France; m. Marguerite Madeleine de Bourgogne Oct 20, 1508.

Phillippe de Lannoy, Seigneur de Molembais was the son of Baudouin II de Lannoy, Seigneur de Molembais and Michele d'Esne, Dame de Cavroy.

Marguerite- b. abt 1489; d. Jan 14, 1510/11; buried Solre-le-Chfteau.

Baudoiuin de Bourgogne/Catherine d'Ayelle

Baudouin de Bourgogne, Sire de Falais- b. abt 1445 Rijssel; d. May 1508 Bruxelles. He met Catherine d'Ayelle and they had the child Marguerite Madeleine de Bourgogne (above). Baudoiuin married Marie de Manuel de la Cerda abt 1488.

Phillippe le Bon, Duke of Burgogne/Isabella, Princess of Portugal

Phillippe- b. Jun 30, 1396 Dijon, France; d. Jun 15, 1467 Brugge, France; m. Isabella, Princess of Portugal Jan 10 1428/29 Sluis, Flanders.

Isabella- b. Feb 21, 1396/97 Evora; d. Dec 17, 1471 Aire

Phillippe- also know as the good. His first wife was Michelle de Valois, Princess of France and daughter of Charles VI, King of France and Isabeau of Bavaria, they were married Jun 1409, Paris. She died Jul 1422. Next he married oulins-les-Engilbert Bonne d'Artois, daughter of Philippe d'Artois, Comte d'Eu and Marie de Berry. She died Sep 1425. Thirdly, he married Isabella of Portugal, daughter of Joao I, King of Portugal and Philippa of Lancaster.

Philip the Good succeeded his father, John the Fearless, as duke of Burgundy in 1419 when John was assassinated in Montereau during a meeting with the frech dauphin (later King Charles VII). Philip

passively supported the effort of the English king Henry V to usurp the French throne, but he avoided his father's deep involvement in French politics. Phippe's two predecessors had used diplomacy and dynastic marriages to extend Burgundian influence in the Low Countries, and Philip reaped the benefits of this policy. Already count of Flaners and Artois, Philip successively acquired Namur, Hainaut, Brabant, Holland, Zeeland, and Luxembourg between 1420 and 1443, employing considerable force to make good his claims. When he made

peace with France in 1435, he obtained a strategic part of Picardy. Famous for his patronage of chivalry and the arts, Philip founded the order of the Golden Fleece in 1430 and took a crusading vow at the sumtuous Feast of the Pheasant in 1454. His court reflected the splendor of the early northern Renaissance, and he was perhaps the most powerful ruler of his day.

SOULE KINDRED INDEXES AVAILABLE

A third index has been completed for about 1,000 persons who are descendants but do not have the name Soule or other spelling variations. This Surname Index was created primarily from lineages submitted recently by members of Soule Kindred. It should be used with our earlier indexes and the supplement published in the 1992 Soule Kindred Newsletter Summer edition (Volume XXVI, No. 3).

Also available are copies of the original index created by Dr. Milton Terry, listing more than 7,000 individuals with the name Soule, including codes for the source of information and a numbering system for tracing lineage of many individuals. That index includes the names of the spouse of about 5,000 of the individuals.

Those spouse names have been indexed in alphabetic order with name and code number of the individual in the original Terry index. However, you must have the Terry index to use the spouse index.

The cost of each of the three indexes is a standard \$10.00, including mailing. They are printed on 8½ by 11 inch paper.

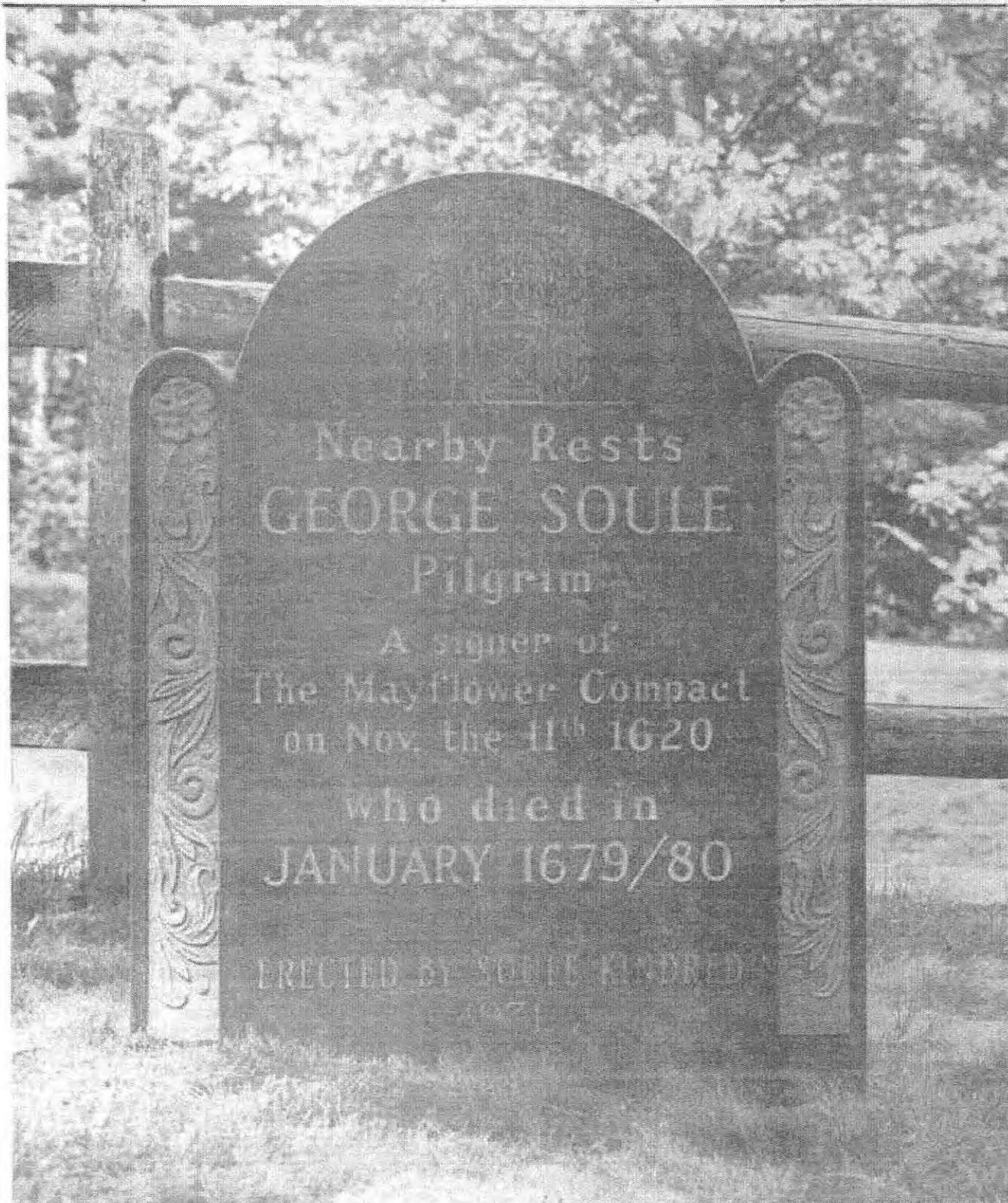

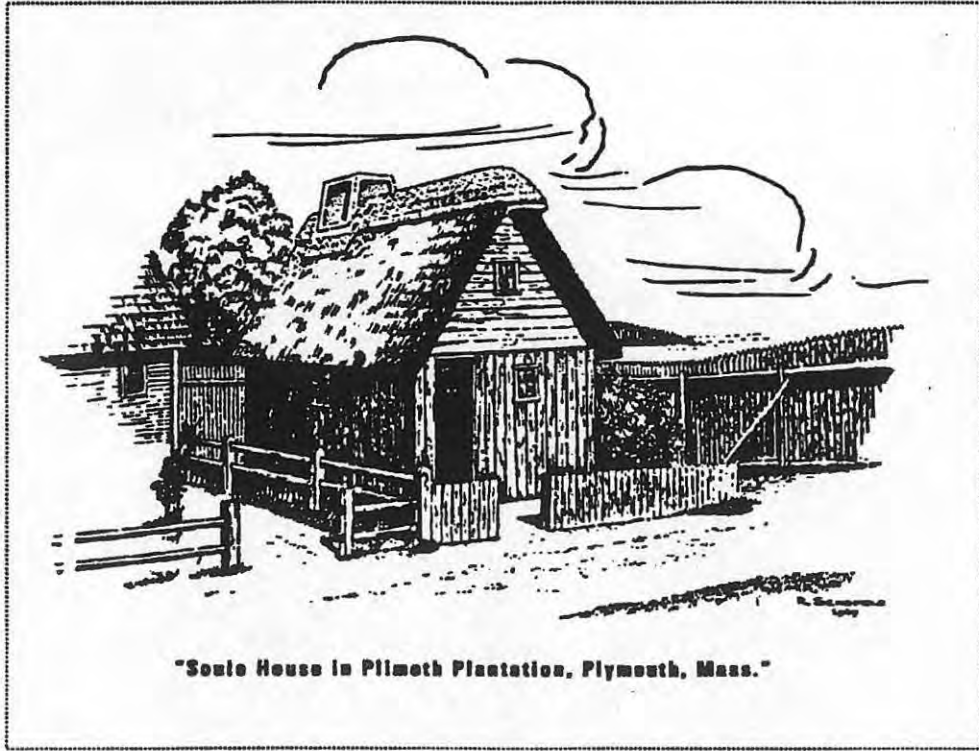

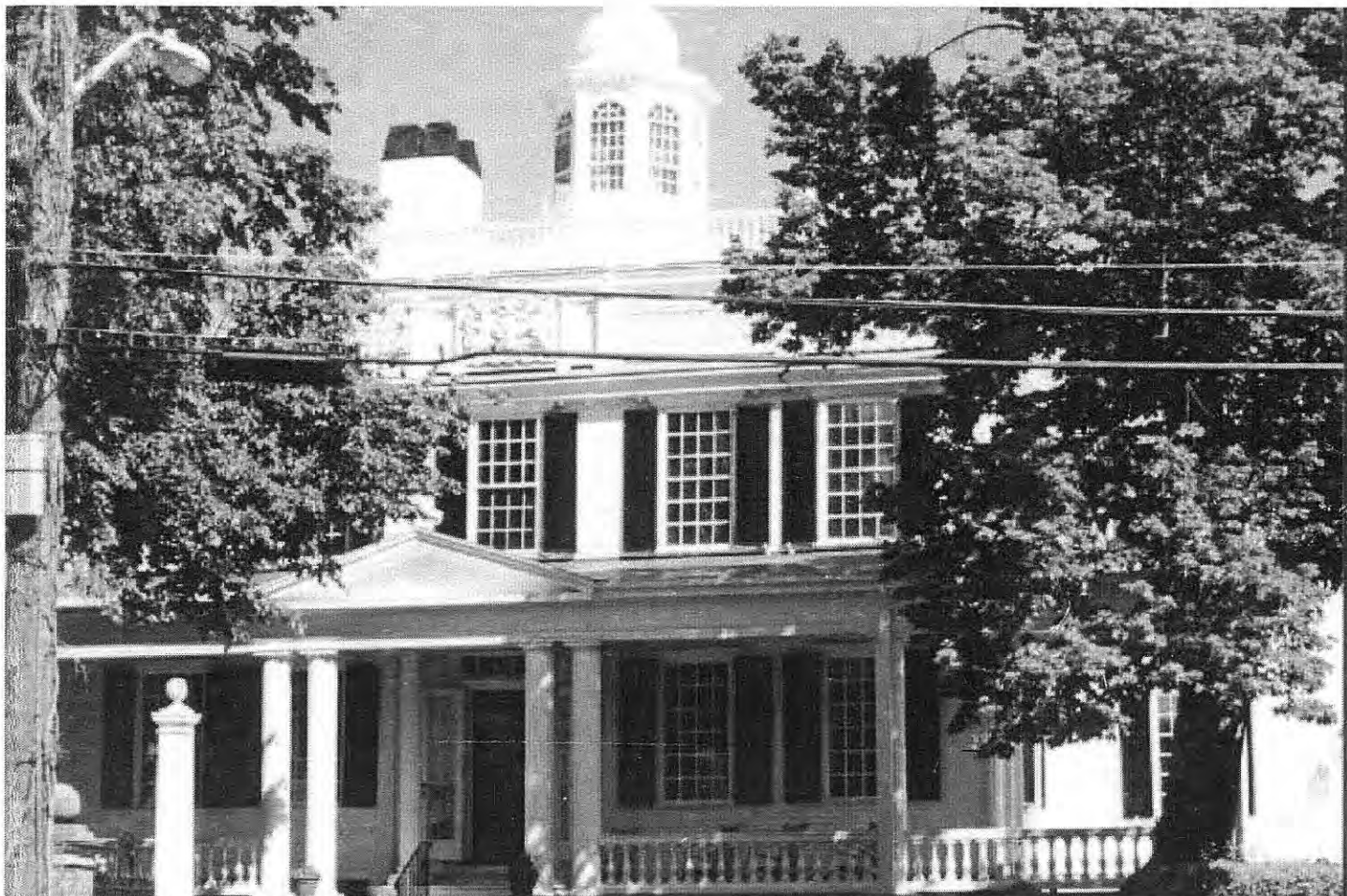
