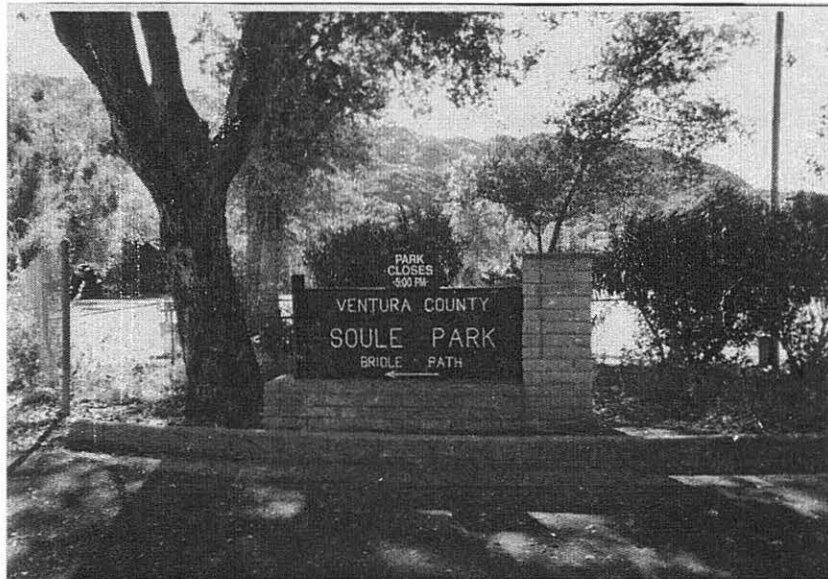

Editor's Corner

It hardly seems that another three months has passed since our last publication of the *Soule Newsletter*. I guess my parents were right (again!). The older one gets, they always used to say, the quicker time seems to flash by. Ah, well.

This month's edition of the newsletter is a little thinner than usual inasmuch as we have not received the usual volume of items from the kindred. In particular, let me re-request that anyone who has pictures, family histories, etc., especially things of a more dated nature, to please forward them to me for probable inclusion in the newsletter. I will, of course, return anything you send.

Please note that, with time flying by as alluded to earlier, that this summer's kindred reunion will be coming up sooner than we think. Included in this edition of the newsletter are items of interest for those who are considering attending. Please pay particular attention to these items.

You may recall that last quarter's newsletter had on the cover a picture of what we have often called the George Soule house at Plimoth Plantation. After seeing the picture, several kindred members wrote to say that the house was no longer there. Well, yes and no. The house is still there; it is just that it is no longer designated as the George Soule house.

I did a little sleuthing on the matter and spoke with our friends at the curator's department at Plymouth. Here's what I found out.

It turns out that, based on Bradford's and other writings, some of the houses at the Plantation can be correctly and specifically identified as having belonged to certain of the Plantation residents – those from the Mayflower and later. This includes both the location of the home at the Plantation and, I suppose, what it looked like. However, many cannot be so identified.

So, what the Plantation folks do is rotate the homes among different Plantation residents from time to time depending on whom they have for actors at the site and other factors. So, while there was a home designated as the George Soule home for a time, it now "belongs" to someone named Palmer.

There is one other item of interest concerning this "former" George Soule residence. The curator indicated to me that this particular home is now some 30 years old. Furthermore, the Plymouth folks have determined that when it was built, it was not historically correct for the architecture of the time (1627). So, they will soon take the house down and built anew. I guess George would have then been homeless in any case.

I hope you enjoy this edition of the newsletter.

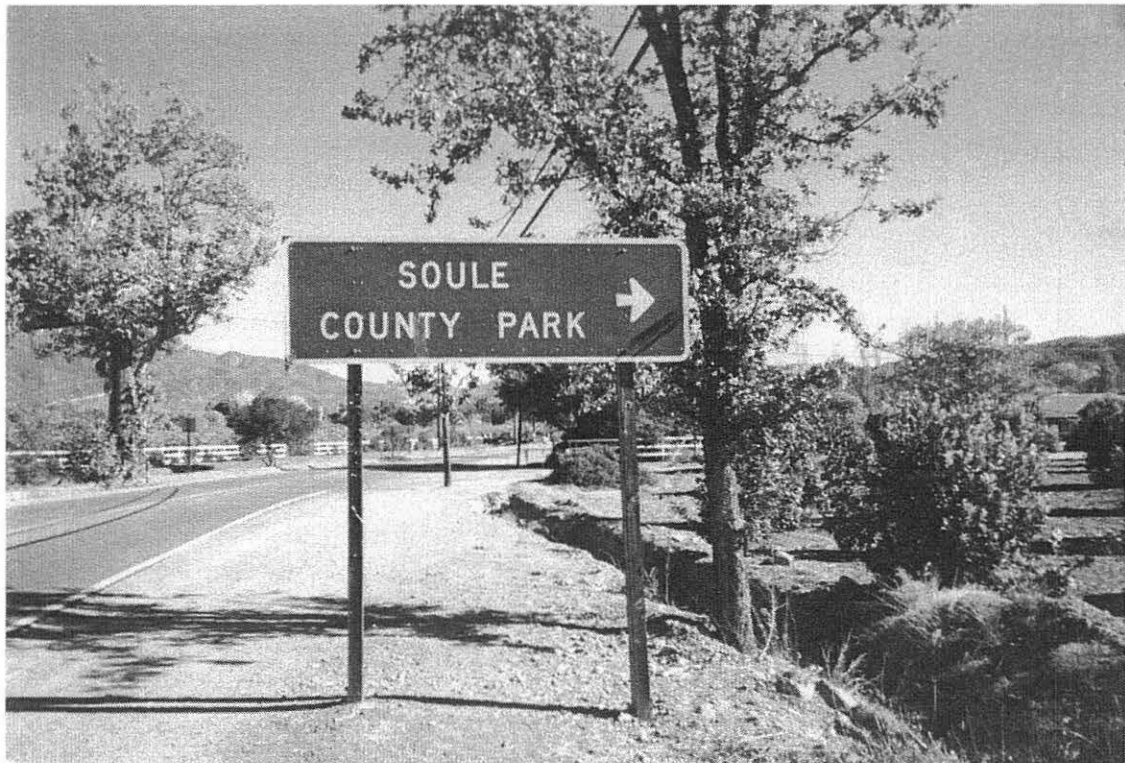
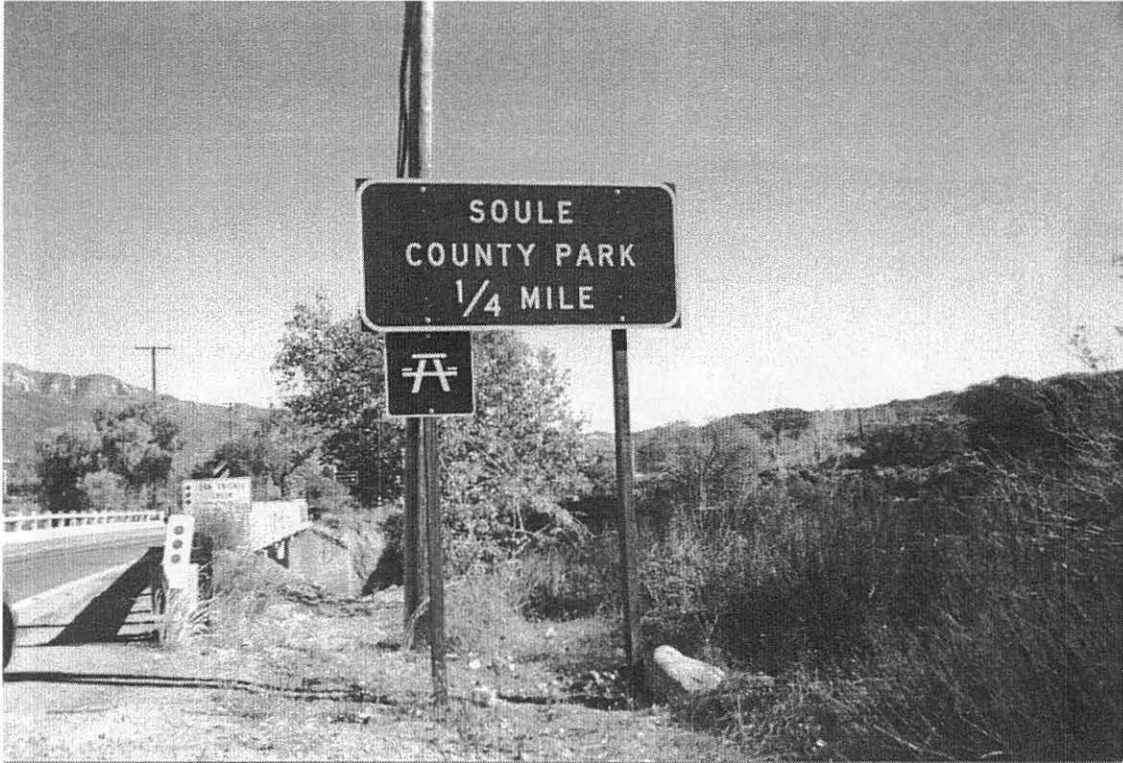

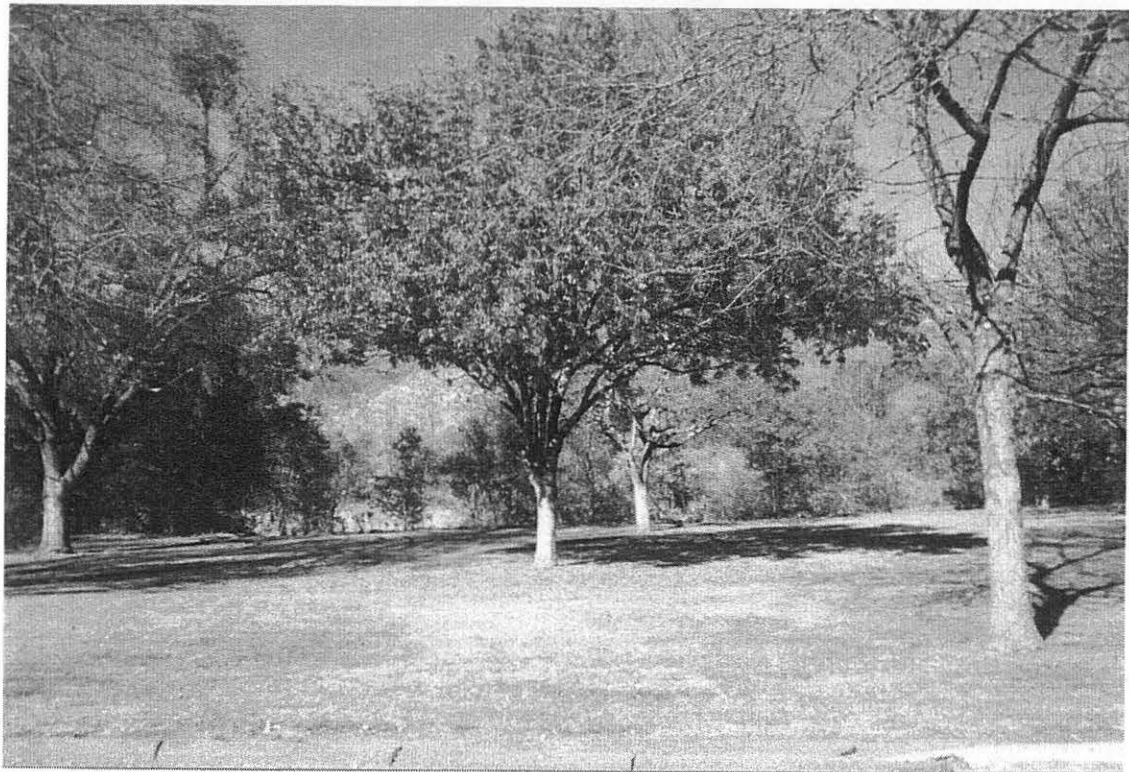
PRIZES FOR THE REUNION

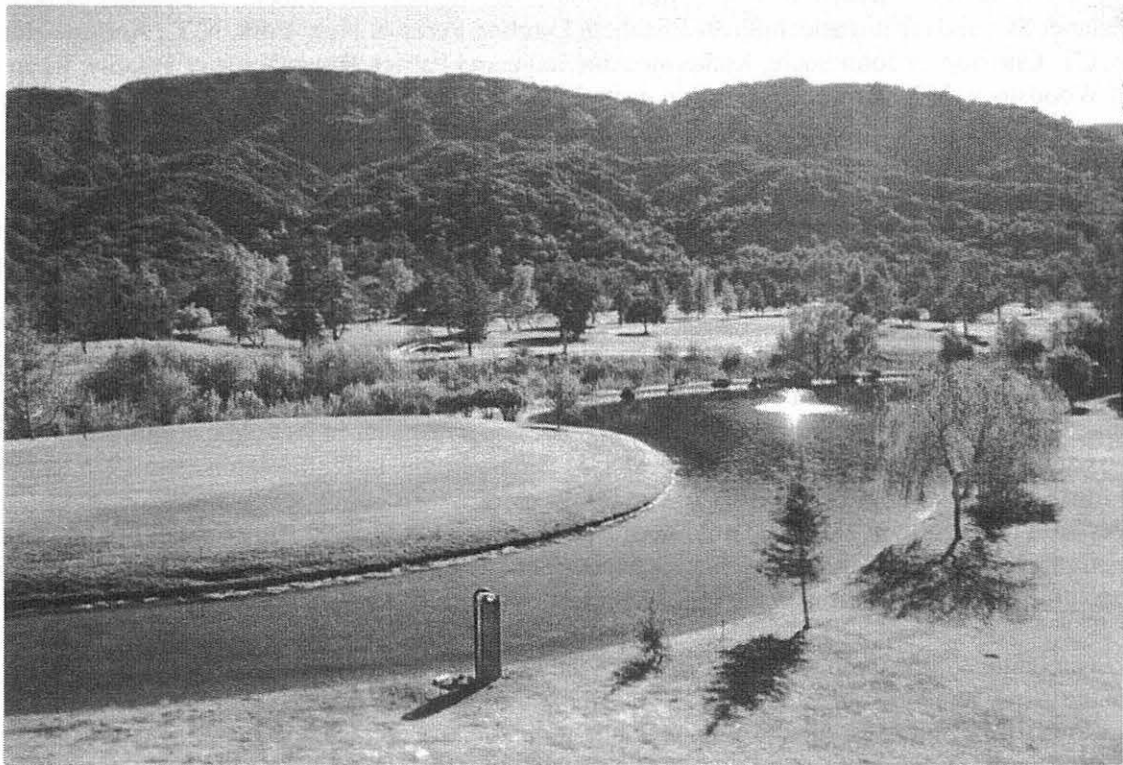

My father, Frank Flint Soule, Jr. (Soule Kindred # 2341) died 08 March 2000 after a long and painful battle with cancer. I enclose a copy of the Chicago Tribune obituary [editor's transcription below] that ran 09 March 2000. I regret that I did not pre-write the obit. There were several notable omissions.

He was a graduate of Phillips Academy at Andover, Mass (Class of 1940) and was a graduate of Yale University (wartime Class of 1944). He was a concert pianist and enjoyed playing the piano all his life. At Yale he entered the Naval ROTC and entered active service by July of 1943 aboard the U.S.S. Deede (destroyer escort) in the Pacific theater in WWII. He attained the rank of full Lieutenant by war's end and was in the reserves until 1955. He was an Investment Counselor from 1958 to 2000 and was very proud to be a Chartered Investment Counselor. I shall miss him very much and believe I have inherited much of his mirth and humor along with a bit of his awesome intellectual capacities. At the wake my sister pointed out that he was born on the eighth and died on the eighth. If you place 8 on its side you get the symbol for infinity, my father loved to discuss that concept.

Frank F. Soule Jr, 77, of 300 Woodhaven Drive, Hilton Head Island, SC, died Wednesday March 8, 2000. He was born in Chicago and moved to Hilton Head Island in 1979 from Northbrook, IL. He was a member of the University Club of Chicago, Skokie Country Club in Glencoe, IL, the Multiple Sclerosis Society and the Boy Scouts of America. He was a 10th generation descendant of Mayflower Pilgrim George Soule. He was professionally associated with Tilden Brothers and Grannis and Brown Brothers. He is survived by his son Frank F. Soule III of Palatine, IL; two daughters Elizabeth Soule Lunding of Westhampton Beach, N.Y. and Mollie Soule McHugh of Woodstock, VT; a sister Lois Soule Cole of Hilton Head Island, SC; and eight grandchildren, Elizabeth Lunding Perez of New York, N.Y., Andrew Hanna Lunding of Greenwich, CT, Christopher John Soule, Katherine Ann Soule and Patrick Bruce Soule of Palatine IL and James Ross Soule of Woodstock, VT. He was preceded in death by his wife Mary Ross Soule. A memorial service will be held Friday March 10 at 10 a.m. at the Seabrook of Hilton Head Island. George Hodges Soule

Delco college founder, 81

George Hodges Soule, 81, a 27-year Dupont employee and founding trustee of Delaware County Community College, died yesterday at Riddle Village retirement community in Media.

Mr. Soule joined Dupont in 1948 as a technical writer and became a manager in its public affairs department. He was administrative assistant to Lymon Ogilby, Episcopal bishop of Pennsylvania, in Philadelphia from 1975 to 1987. He was on the board of trustees at Delaware Community College for 24 years.

Mr. Soule was born in Rochester, N.H., and graduated from Springfield Classical High School in Massachusetts. He received an agricultural economics degree from Massachusetts State College, now the University of Massachusetts, in 1941. He was an information specialist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture after college and was drafted into the Army in 1942.

Mr. Soule was an editor for the Crop Reporting Board of the Department of Agriculture for two years after being discharged from the Army in 1946. He founded the Lay Auxiliary of the Interfaith Springfield Ministerium in 1992.

Mr. Soule was a member of the National Religious Public Relations Council and an active layman in the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer in Springfield.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Jean Conder Soule; sons David and Douglas; daughter Jean Tirrell; seven grandchildren and a great-granddaughter.

Friends may call at 10 a.m. Wednesday in the Parish House of the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer, West Springfield and Hillcrest Rds., Springfield, where a Holy Eucharist of the Resurrection will be celebrated at 11 a.m.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

We are sorry to inform you that one of your members, Mae Soule Fancher Jensen, passed away on September 5 of 1999. Mae was a direct descendant of George Soule (about seven generations removed) and she has been a member of your society since 1970. (editor's parenthetical note: Betty-Jean Haner indicates that Mae actually joined on Feb. 14, 1969.) Mae was suffering from congenital heart failure, and although she was not in a great deal of pain, she requested not to be resuscitated in the event that her heart stopped. Mae passed away peacefully in the morning, and her funeral was held later that week.

It is my sad task to advise you of the death of my mother Sybil Smith Cook on January 1, 2000 and her sister Shirley Soule Smith on January 6, 2000. Their obituaries which appeared in the Annapolis "Capital" newspaper are enclosed [editor: transcribed below].

Shirley, especially, was interested and active in the Soule Kindred. I believe she went to almost every reunion up to about six or seven years ago.

Shirley Smith *The Capital*, 13 Jan 2000

Shirley Soule Smith, 98, of Annapolis and a Mayflower descendant, died of a stroke Jan. 6 at her home.

Miss Smith was born in Framingham, Mass., daughter of Henry Porter Smith and Florence Soule Smith. Her ancestor, George Soule, arrived in this country in 1620. She graduated in 1922 from Wellesley College in Wellesley, Mass., where she was a member of the college crew.

She worked for more than 30 years as executive secretary for the New England Grenfell Association in Boston, Mass. In the 1920s she had been a teacher in Labrador.

She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Society of Mayflower Descendants and was past secretary [editor's note: the obituary says "president;" this was crossed out and corrected to "secretary" by Betty-Jean Haner] of the Soule Kindred of America.

Miss Smith traveled extensively throughout her life and for many years was a volunteer reader for the blind. She had lived in Annapolis for the past 15 years and formerly resided in Florida as well as New England.

Her sister, Sybil S. Cook, died Jan. 1.

Surviving are two nieces, great-nieces and -nephews and great-grand-nieces and -nephews.

A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday at All Hallows Church, Route 2 and Brick Church Road, Harwood. Burial will be in the church cemetery. Arrangements are by Taylor Funeral Home.

Sybil Cook *The Capital*, 6 Jan 2000

Sybil Smith [editor's note: the obituary indicates "Soule;" this has been corrected to "Smith"] Cook, 94, a community activist and resident of Annapolis since 1932, died of natural causes Jan. 1 at her home.

Born in Wellesley, Mass., Mrs. Cook was a descendant of George Soule who arrived in this country aboard the *Mayflower* in 1620.

She graduated from Wellesley College in 1926 and worked for a time as a legal secretary to Boston attorney Joseph N. Welch. She was married in 1928 to Robert A. Cook. He was a retired Navy commander when he died in 1973.

Mrs. Cook was president of the YWCA of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County, the Hammond-Harwood House and the Chase Home and was a board member of Anne Arundel Medical Center. She helped to form Historic Annapolis Foundation and was a charter member of the Naval Academy Women's Club.

She was also a member of the St. Anne's Episcopal Church and of All Hallows Church in Birdsville, the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Annapolis Symphony Orchestra Association and the Naval Academy Officers and Faculty Club Auxiliary. She enjoyed singing in many chorale groups.


Surviving are two daughters, Constance Cook Schuyler and Shirley Cook Hatch, and one sister, Shirley Soule Smith, all of Annapolis; six grandchildren, and 10 great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be at 11 a.m. tomorrow at St. Andrews Chapel at the Naval Academy Chapel. Burial will be in All Hallows Church Cemetery in Birdsville. Arrangements are by Taylor Funeral Home.

Shirley, with her sister Sybil Cook and Sybil's 2 daughters, Connie Schuyler and Shirley Hatch, hosted the Reunion in Annapolis in 1991 in honor of Shirley's 90th birthday. Shirley was a Life Member and an Honorary Life Member. Sybil Smith Cook had been a member of Soule Kindred from 1969-1974 and from 1991-2000.

Frank A. Chamberlain, veteran of two wars

Frank A. Chamberlain of Williamsville, who fought in two wars and later became chairman and co-founder of Heritage Travel Services, died Jan. 23, 2000, in Buffalo General Hospital after a brief illness. He was 84.

The Hoosick Falls native co-founded the travel agency at age 72 after a 35-year career in sales, working for such companies as Reynolds Aluminum and Olivetti Equipment.

Chamberlain traced his ancestry to George Soule, who came to New England on the *Mayflower* in 1620. He was a very competitive athlete, earning varsity letters in


baseball, basketball and soccer. He was also elected class president of Hoosick Falls High School in 1932.

Chamberlain served in World War II in the U.S. Army Artillery from March 1941 to December 1945 and the Korean War in U.S. Army Air Support from October 1950 to September 1951.

He was a member of George F. Lamm Post, American Legion, and the Buffalo Yacht Club.

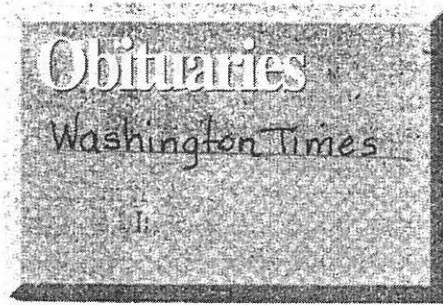
Laura Jane Soule Schmuck, 92, a social worker and volunteer, died of congestive heart failure Jan. 4 at her Bethesda home.



Names

I have long wondered about and been puzzled by some of my ancestor's names.

For many of us an ancestor's name is the only personal thing we know of them. Sometimes there are just cold, hard facts - dates of births, marriages and deaths.

A name personalizes an individual for us, allowing us to muse in imagination, seeking to reconstruct an image of our long-departed progenitor.

Two odd names of Soules in my family led me on a search. One of them is my great-grandfather, Sardine Stone Soule. He dislikes the name so much that he used only his initials, S. S. Soule, for all of his life. I finally found the answer to the origin of his name in the book "Williams History of Ohio." Sardine's father, Almond Soule, moved his family from Kennebec County, Maine to Marrietta, Washington County, Ohio about 1817. Already settled there, since 1790, was the prominent Isreal and Lydia Stone family who had migrated (along with General Rufus Putnam) to Marrietta. They had twelve children, among them Sardine and Jasper Stone, who evidently were named from the Biblical account in *The Book of Revelations*, chapter four, verse three.

Sardine Stone Soule was named after Sardine Stone and named his own son Jasper Stone Soule. Why? Was the Soule family friends with the Stone family? Did they work for them? Was it because of the prominence of the Stone family?

Sardine's father's name, Almond Soule, I believe, to be a mistaken spelling. I think it must have been Almon, a Biblical name from *The Book of Joshua*, 21:18. His parents, Asa and Olive Soule, gave all their children Biblical names, a common practice at that time.

Names cannot be looked at in the context of today. The people who founded America 380 years ago were devout Christians who read their *Bible*, knew it well and looked to it as a source of names. Biblical names were almost exclusively used up to the 1800's, some names were popular and widely used. They're found repeated many times in later families.

Sometimes the maiden surname of the mother of the child might be used as a first name. Often they would chose a name for hoped-to-be-acquired virtues - such as Constant, Charity, Honor, Mercy and so on.

Later on, Greek names from literature and mythology came into vogue.

Sons were often named for grandfathers, daughters for grandmothers, a later son for the father or brother of the father. A child may have been named for a relative in good standing or some degree of wealth.

Many names dropped a letter or substituted another letter, such as Alvah-Elva, Sheilah-Sheila.

Another name in my family which puzzled me for a long time was a great-grandmother, Sabbiah Chase. She was from a family of Biblical names, but Sabbiah is not in *The Bible*. Subsequently, I discovered that her grandmother's name was Elizabeth, who used the shortened version, Libbia. Another misspelling - the L had been mistaken for an S and another letter (h) had been added.

I've learned to really look at names, to analyze them, and to take nothing for granted.

We honor our ancestors when we use their correct names.

JOSIAH C. SOULE (2), a son of Daniel (2) and Sarah (Cushman) Soule, of Plympton, Mass., born March 9, 1774; married SALLY YOUNG of Marcham, Mass., June, 1817, and immediately removed to Warren, Ohio. He was a farmer and a man of exemplary character, well respected by his fellow-citizens. He died March 7, 1872. His wife died Feb. 15, 1889. These had ten children whose names will follow: Josiah, Isaac, George, Clarissa, Plympton, James, Julia, Harrison, Warren and Clara.

I. JOSIAH SOULE, eldest son of Josiah and Sally Soule, born in Warren, Ohio, May 3, 1819; married Nov. 30, 1843, ANN RATCLIFF of Howland, O., who was born June 3, 1822, and died April 1, 1858, in Warren, O. He married 2d, Dec. 23, 1858, MELVINA KELLOGG of Gustavus, O., who died June 4, 1871, in Warren, O. He died there May 8, 1883. He was a farmer living on the parental homestead and a man of reliable character whose death was lamented. By his first wife there were two children. By second wife, one son; their names: Frances Soule, John Soule (died in infancy), Henry Bishop Soule (an officer in the U. S. Navy).

II. ISAAC SOULE, second son of Josiah and Sally Young Soule, born in Warren, O., Sept. 13, 1820; married EUNICE P. RICKER (eldest daughter of Timothy and Mary Ricker, born near Portland, Me., Jan. 19, 1826), in February 1843. About 1838 her parents left Maine for the (then) far West, traveling from Dover to Boston by rail, from Boston to New York by water, by sailing vessel from New York, and then by steamboat down the Ohio River and up the Mississippi River to Spellman's Landing, now called Pontoosuc, to LaHarpe, Ill., June 2, 1838. He was a cultivator of the soil and a man of respectability. He died in LaHarpe, Ill., July 7, 1895, aged 75 years. His wife died there June 4, 1900. These had issue seven sons and one daughter of whom presently. Isaac Soule secured employment with a Mr. MacFarland, a tanner, to whom he was engaged for a seven years apprenticeship. Here he was married Feb. 1, 1843, the ceremony performed by John Hicks, a justice of the peace. Mr. and Mrs. Soule commenced life in a small framed house in LaHarpe, living there two years, during which their first son was born. In 1845 they located on a farm two miles east of LaHarpe, and after two years residence on this farm they returned to the old locality and in 1850 built their brick house. In company with Luther Warren, Mr. Soule crossed the plains in 1852, with ox teams, bound for the Gold Fields of California. They were four months on the road and during a part of the time they suffered greatly for the necessities of life, especially for bread. At one time a heavy snow storm prevailed, the snow being sixteen feet deep on

the mountains. The company was thirty-four days without bread. The first flour brought into the settlement cost them \$1.25 per pound. Two years were passed by Mr. Soule on the Pacific slope, after which he returned home by way of the Isthmus of Panama and New York; and he found himself rich in experience if not in gold. The children of Isaac and Eunice were named George Wallace, Charles W., Charles Warren, James Josiah, Eugene Newton, Ernest Clare, Elbert Isaac, and Mary Eunice.

(1) GEORGE WALLACE SOULE, born in LaHarpe, Ill., married Feb. 15, 1844, died in Orlando, Florida, in June, 1922. He married HARRIET C. BAINTEK, of LaHarpe, Ill., Nov. 29, 1868. She died Oct. 6, 1870. They had one daughter who died at the age of six. He married 2d, March 7, 1877 LAURA ELVA SPERRY of LaHarpe, who died Dec. 20, 1880. By this union there were two daughters, Clara Bess Soule Guymon, of Winter Garden, Fla., born March 20, 1878, and Minnie Hattie Soule, born Dec. 14, 1880, and died May 26, 1881.

(2) CHARLES W. SOULE was born May 5, 1846, and died Aug. 7, 1847.

(3) CHARLES WARREN SOULE was born March 31, 1848, and died May 16, 1871.

(4) JAMES JOSIAH SOULE, born in LaHarpe, Ill., married Oct. 17, 1850, died in Portland, Oregon, in 1920. He married MARY CATHERINE WILLIAMS Oct. 10, 1871. They had one daughter, Katie Viola Soule, of Fresno, Cal. After his first wife's death Oct. 6, 1870, he married MINNIE S. COULSON, of Edina, Missouri, July 27, 1882. They had one son, Nathaniel Coulson Soule of Portland, Ore.

(5) EUGENE NEWTON SOULE was born in LaHarpe, Ill., Jan. 8, 1861. He married CARRIE CLAYPOOL June 4, 1885, at Edina, Missouri. They had two sons and a daughter, Roy, Lee and Erma.

(6) ERNEST CLARE SOULE, born in LaHarpe, Ill., July 26, 1866, died Sept. 26, 1868.

(7) ELBERT ISAAC SOULE, of Des Moines, Ia., was born in LaHarpe, Ill., Sept. 3, 1868; married MARY E. WILLIAMS June 5, 1894, by whom two sons and two daughters. Lyle G. Soule, born

I take notice, with great interest, your recent 4 Mar. email to Soule- L Newsletter regarding Constant Sole (Soal/Soule), and the answer from Ruth Hall of the same date.

Soule Kindred in America does hold some information on Constant Sole (Actually we hold evidence of 4 possible candidates of the name Constant.) I've had to do some "Weeding out" to determine the Constant (subject of your enquiry) is actually one of those we have evidence of. That evidence I must unfortunately inform you is very sparse: Being not much more than what you have presented. I must here present our sources as I know them: They being (1)--The New York Genealogical and Biographical "Record" (NYGBR) Vol. 54 of 1923 Issue No. 1, Pgs. 9,10, & 11 in a Genealogy of the "Preston" Family, and the (2)--The Soule/Sole/Sollie/etc. Genealogy published by Rev. Gideon T. Ridlon which Ruth has cited in her answer to your question. Incidentally Ruth: The answer to your citation is "Yes." :-)

Soule Kindred's further information on your Constant Sole is not much. We don't have his father's name except to note the name of Benjamin in the NYGBR article. This can hardly be considered "proof," However, it could be a good lead.

Suggested further search ideas: 1) Rhode Island Vital Records as cited in the series of 22 books published by James Osborne Austin. We however can't narrow this down as of now, because we don't have a Volume/County reference. All we do have is the lead that he was born in RI on 1 June 1811. Nothing more positive!! 2) In SKIA's Archives card file, we have a notation on a card for Constant Soals (1811-1883)which cites: "m. Sarah White Oneida Co NY DB69:57 27 Feb.1835 Sally White, wid of Jeduthan White and heirs including Sarah, wife of Constant Soals(sic) conveys to NOLTEN...": I have no idea what the DB69:57 part of this citation represents, but must assume that it is probably some sort of citation regarding the probating of "someones" will. I have no idea whose or when! 3.) A look at any existing Histories or Biographies of the Rosendale or Fond-du-Lac County Wisconsin area, for mention of Constant Sole.

As stated at the start of this email; SKIA does not have much on this line. We would be very much interested in pursuing it further, in order to determine whether or not this Constant Sole/Soal is, in any likelihood, a descendent of George Soule Mayflower Pilgrim. If you are interested in further joint research of this line please contact me seperately by email at the below address. Also, I have a package of some of the notations listed above, and will send it to you if you'll reveal to me your snail mail address.

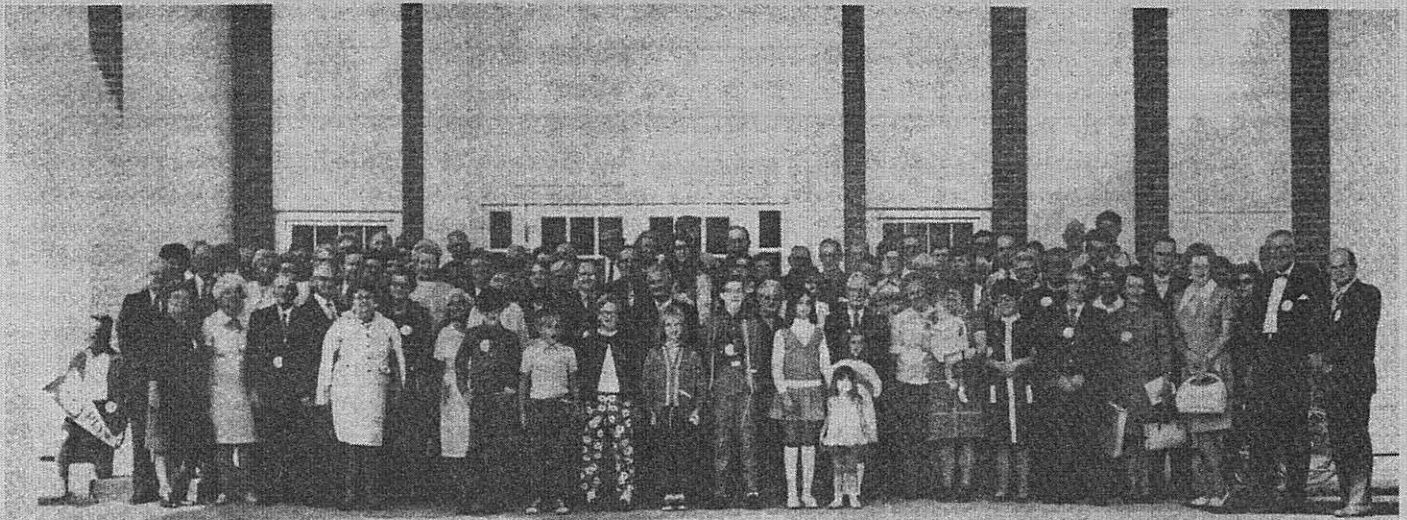

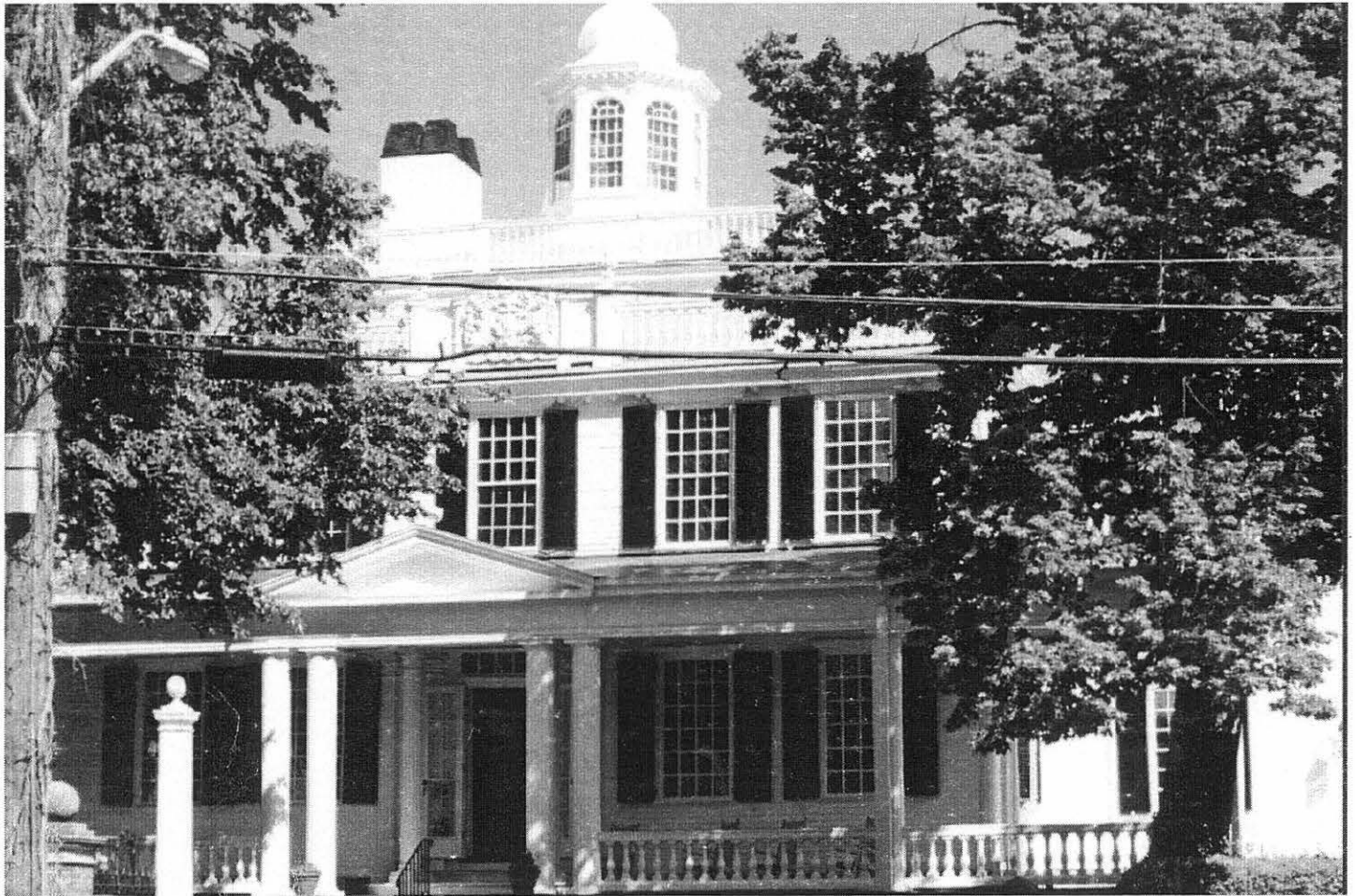
