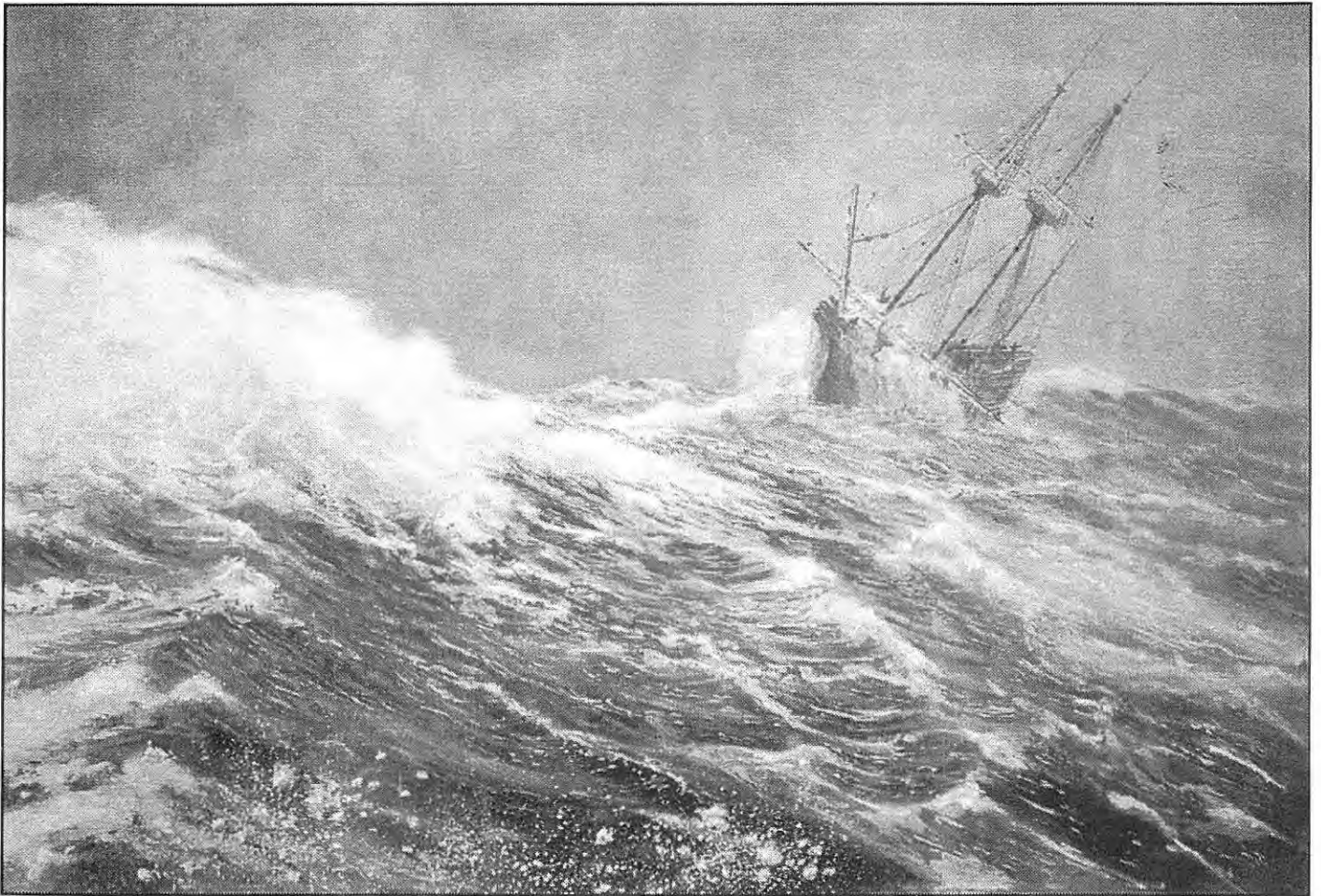

I am very pleased to report that our Quarterly newsletter has returned to the regular issue dates of January, April, July and October. Your newsletter editors are to be commended for interesting newsletters which are full of Soule research information as well as your newsworthy submissions. Please continue to submit your articles and pictures to the newsletter. In order that for us to fully comply with copy right laws be sure to source document all submissions such as newspaper articles and excerpts from published books. Also be sure to mark your information sent to our Treasurer, Ms. Betty-Jean Haner, when sending in your annual dues, as to whether it is for publication in the newsletter or not for publication. We wish to avoid any problems in this regard.

I have submitted a copy of my own Mayflower certificate to show those who may be considering the Mayflower application process just how well done this certificate is. The documentation process is demanding, but well worth the effort when completed.

As I am a direct descendant of George Soule, though the male line, I have been asked to participate in the "Y-DNAPLUS" family tree DNA project to possibly identify the birthplace of our pilgrim ancestor. The Soule DNA project needs at least two American "Soule" descendants and two English "Soule" descendants to be able to match the results. I plan to share the results of this effort with the Soule Kindred as well as the Mayflower Society. Traditionally we have considered Eckington, Worcester, England, near Wales, as a possible birthplace. New information may lead to Tingrith, Bedford, England, south of London, as another birthplace. The George Soule born there in the 1590s had a father named William. William Soule is a common name in my line, as well as many American lines.

If the DNA results are conclusive this will greatly aid our efforts in completing the Luther Soule Foundation Family grant. We would be able to narrow our search to a specific area. I plan to work with the genealogists to develop research strategies and a plan. Mr. Norman Standish has pointed out the need to obtain advance permission from various research libraries and sources in England before we proceed.

I have been working with Soule Kindred Genealogist Charles "Jack" Sowles and assistant Soule Kindred Genealogist, Lynde Randall to develop a Soule Kindred Research network. We have Field Researchers actively working on assignments for us now in Upper New York State and the State of Maine. We are seeking researchers for Massachusetts, the Mid-Atlantic States, the Carolinas and the western states. The plan is for the Field research associates to travel to the libraries and courthouses in their area and report back with the results of their specific assignments. This is something that would be

very expensive for the two main Genealogists to do. This network will aid our members in assembling the records they need for tracing their ancestry and completing their Mayflower applications.

This issue will contain full details of our Annual reunion at Ottawa, Ontario, Canada in August 2004. Carol and Stanley Soule are to be commended for their hard work in organizing this event and delivering the information to you in time for you to plan to attend. I plan to attend the entire Reunion. I hope many of you can attend.

Please feel free to contact me with any concerns that you may have in regards to our Society. I welcome your comments and suggestions.

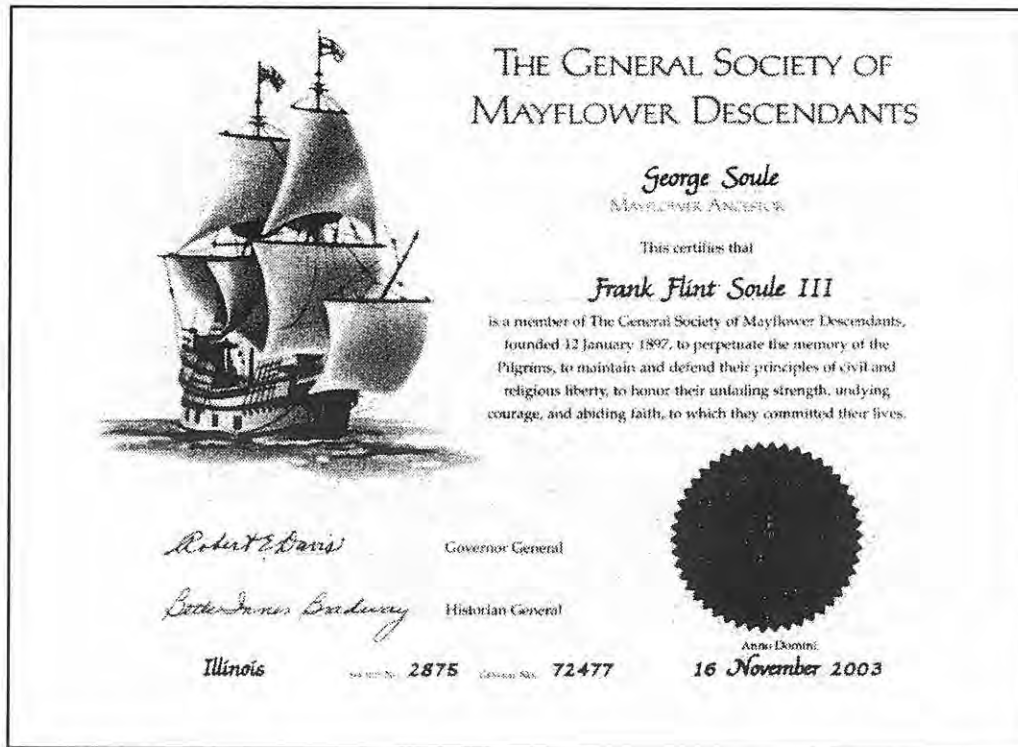

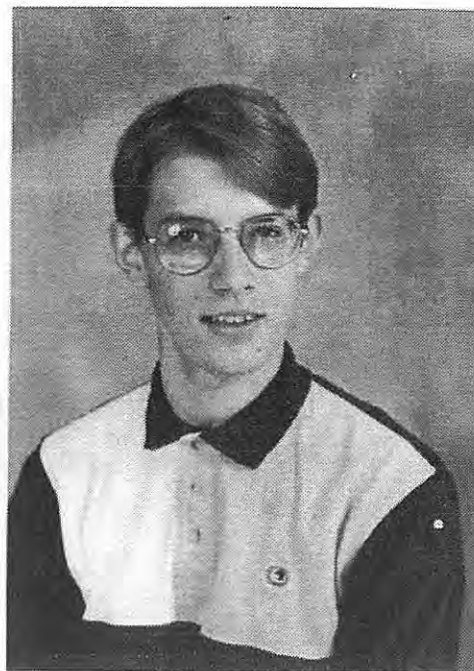
High School Educational Tours to Europe in Grades 9 and 11.

I am honored to be the 2003 recipient of the George Standish Soule Memorial Scholarship!



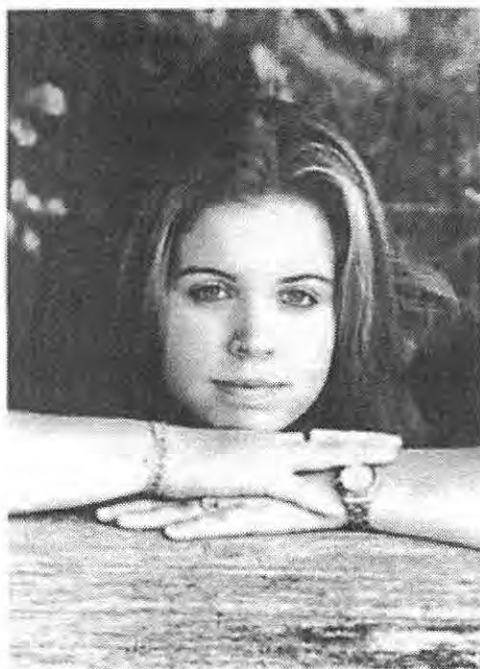

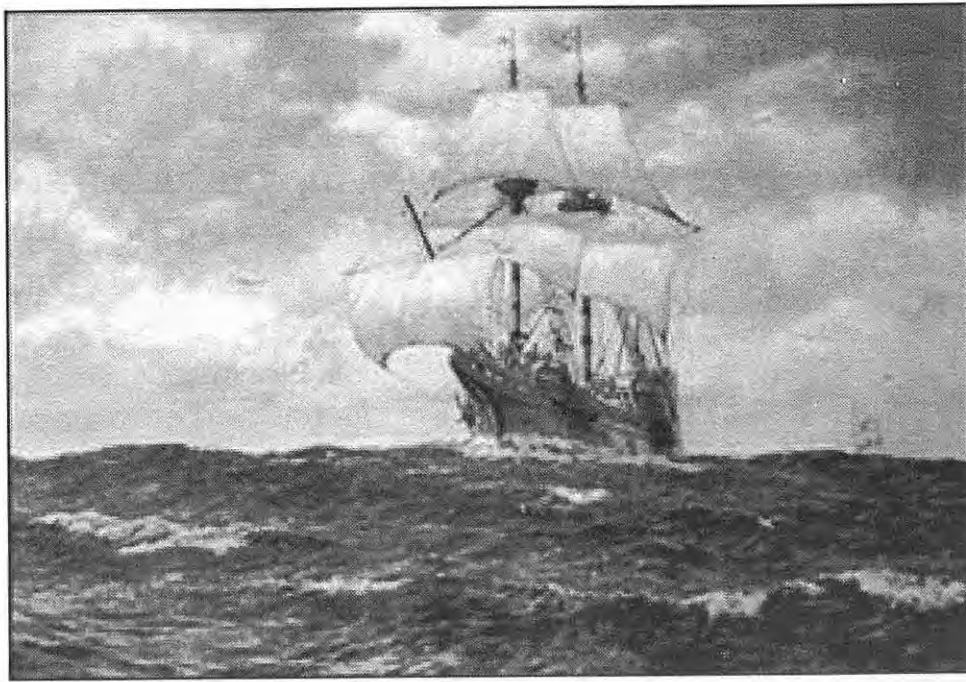

September 6 is the annual anniversary of the start of the Mayflower voyage. William Bradford described the event as follows:

“September 6. These troubles being blown over, and now all being compact together in one ship, they put to sea again with a prosperous wind, which continued divers days together, which was some comfort to them; yet, according to the usual manner many were afflicted with sea sickness.” The attached pictures are from my original painting “A Prosperous Wind”. It tries to capture the scene described in Bradford’s account and the mixed emotions of the pilgrims.

On our cover is Dr. Haywood’s latest Mayflower painting. Pilgrim William Bradford vividly described the atrocious weather conditions endured by the Mayflower. Haywood quotes Bradford, “After they had enjoyed fair winds and weather for a season, they were encountered many times with cross winds, and met with many fierce storms, with which the ship was shroudly shaken, and her upper works made very leaky; and one of the main beams in the mid ships was bowed and cracked, which put them in some fear that the ship could not be able to perform the voyage.” Haywood’s painting on our cover captures the scene described in Bradford’s account, “the moment a massive wave slams into the tiny ship with sufficient force to bow and crack a main beam. I have the ship hulling with the lower yards resting on the rails.”

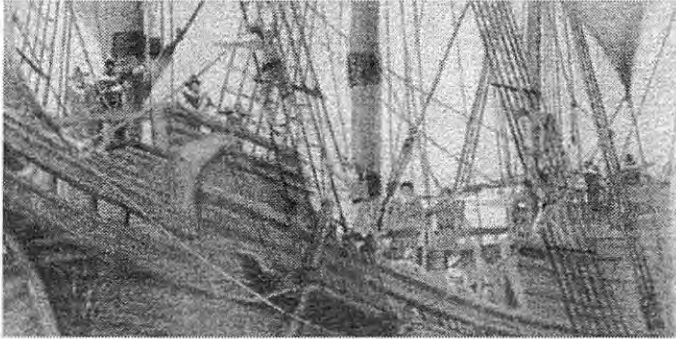

Alden had always been a tradition in her family, but "nobody had any proof." The spark that started the flame in Jean to prove her ancestry to Alden was a trip she and her husband took to Plymouth Plantation. After seeing the replica of the Alden house, the Mayflower II and reading the list of Pilgrims' names, Jean "wondered if it was true." At that moment, she made the commitment to begin researching. "It was not a search for discovery, but a search for evidence," she explained.

After approximately two years of gathering birth and death certificates, as well as transfers of property and wills, she was approved for the Mayflower Society in April of 2002. "Although it was time consuming, mine was much easier than a lot of people's."

Thanksgiving carries a slightly different meaning for both Eldon and Jean since becoming members of the society. "Up until now it was just a story," Eldon said, "but it has become a story of my ancestors." Likewise, Jean has made Thanksgiving a part of her family heritage. "I bought children's books for my grandchildren and read them the story of the first thanksgiving," she said of how she has already begun to pass on the legacy of her ancestors. **END**

MADISON - Mona Berniece Roberts, age 93, died quietly, as she had lived, on Thursday evening, Sept. 11, 2003, at Meriter Hospital. Mona was born April 9, 1910, on a dairy farm in Darlington, the daughter of William and Rozella (Jeglum) Sows. She graduated from Darlington High School and attended another year of commercial training at the school. While employed in Madison, Mona met her future husband at UW Memorial Union when a mutual friend introduced them on a beautiful morning in June 1938. Mona and Earl William Roberts became good friends and then lovers, and together attended UW sporting events boxing, basketball, and football while Earl pursued a degree at the UW, taking classes in the forenoon and working as a stenographer in Wisconsin Senate from 1 p.m. until 9 p.m. Mona and Earl married on June 21, 1941, in First Congregational Church, with the Rev. Alfred W. Swan officiating. When their daughter, Linda Mona, was born in November 1944, Earl was serving as captain, U.S. Army in Germany and Rev. Swan sent him a V-mail, writing, "On my hospital visit today I saw your wife, Mona, and I recognized you as the couple I married some time ago. Mother and baby daughter doing fine. This war should be over soon and you all can come home." But when the war ended in 1945, Earl was given duty on general and special court-martials and in October 1945 sent back to Munich, Germany to serve as an occupational officer, finally returning to Mona and their 20-month-old daughter, Linda Mona, in May 1946. Mona was a loving, com-

passionate wife, mother and grandmother devoted to her family, caring for all relatives and friendly to all people. She taught her children to live in harmony with all mankind. Mona showed no favoritism as to her children and all relatives, respecting their privacy, addressing them cordially, but rebuking them when she believed it to be required, suggesting a better way to solve their problem. Mona volunteered to perform community tasks and assisted in First Congregational Church Sunday school. She was First Congregational dinner chair person for several years, doing it cheerfully. She was well known for her baking skills and generosity in sharing cookies. Her children's friends would ask them, "What is your mother making for after school today?" As her children were growing up, Mona was active in Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts activities as a leader in her home. Starting early in life to sew clothes and knit sweaters for her young nieces, Mona developed her skills by attending classes with friends and family. She worked diligently in making all of her daughters' party dresses, working well into the nights often. Mona liked to travel, to take her family to famous places, to read, to play cards, view television, and listen to radio. Also, she liked to attend Badgers home football games and see the Brewers. Mona always delighted in visiting relatives and later entertaining them in her home. Before her marriage she would leave her Madison employment and travel all night by train to help where needed. She offered a place in her home to needy people after her health was impaired. Mona is survived by her husband, Earl; her daughter, Linda (Jerome) Aumann; her son, David (Gail) Roberts; and her grandsons, Glenn Aumann and Matthew Roberts. She is also survived by her sister, Wilma Hollinger; and many nieces and nephews and other relatives. Gratiot County woman traces ancestry to Mayflower passenger

Instilled with a New England perseverance, Janet Ingalls Bell of Gratiot County's Arcada Township dug into a family history her mother had chronicled over generations and found a link to the 1620 voyage of the British cargo ship to the New World.

Now 90, Bell's multi-year search paid off with acceptance into The Society of Mayflower Descendants in Michigan, announced in November, the same month four centuries ago that Bell's forefather George Soule arrived in the harbor near what is now Plymouth, Mass.

"It took the Mayflower 66 days to cross the ocean," Bell said at her West Harrison Road home ensconced on a sofa beside a worktable covered with documents showing family history.

Compare that to the "three or four years it took us to prove a connection between George Soule and the Mayflower. We were trying to prove definitively that the connection was legitimate. The Mayflower Society wanted details."

Michigan has 473 members in the Mayflower Society, a branch of the General Society based in Plymouth, Mass. Bell was born in Concord and grew up in Lexington.

According to Society spokeswoman Beverly Pool of Holton, applicants must provide documents on their ancestors going back 11 or 12 generations. The

information must coincide with documents the Society has of the Pilgrim. The Mayflower had 102 passengers landing on Nov. 11.

Holding her mother's handwritten family genealogy in her hand, Bell pointed out the entry of Eliza Wright's marriage to John Robinson Ingalls, Bell's great-grandfather, but except for a marriage license and death notice, there was no birth record for Eliza, therefore no way to prove she was an offspring of Nathaniel Wright.

"We got stymied and was ready to give up," in spite of help from a genealogist in Jamaica Plains, Mass., whom

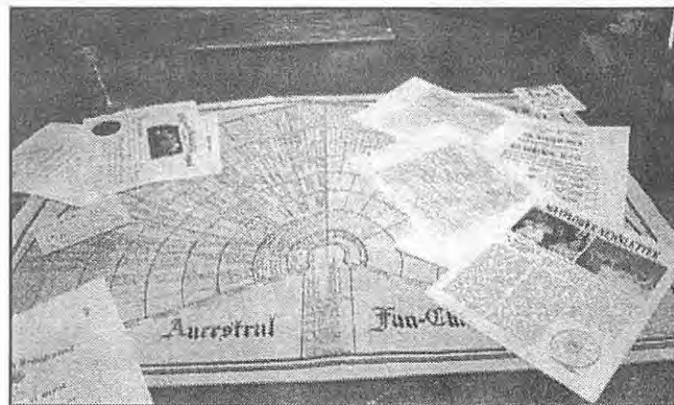
Bell hired to fill the 1824 gap. However, the search continued and the hired-genealogist unearthed a will in a Boston probate court that was the mortar needed.

"The Mayflower Society preserves history and our culture," Bell reflected. "The Pilgrims came here to practice their own religion, own ideas of freedom and to set up their own laws - it's kind of the American Way."

Bell has a ripe history of her own. Growing up in the shadow of the Revolutionary War, Concord Minutemen, Ralph Waldo Emerson and Henry David Thoreau, Bell graduated from

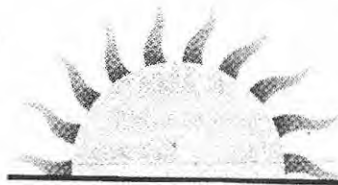

known in later years as "Mr. Democrat," though he never held elected office.

"I married a farmer and gave up city living. That's the way life brings you to different circles," she said, remembering her late husband.

The couple farmed and later sold the old Ammi Wright farm on the north end of the city that turned into a commercial strip on Wright Avenue and Alger Road. The Bells moved to the present location.

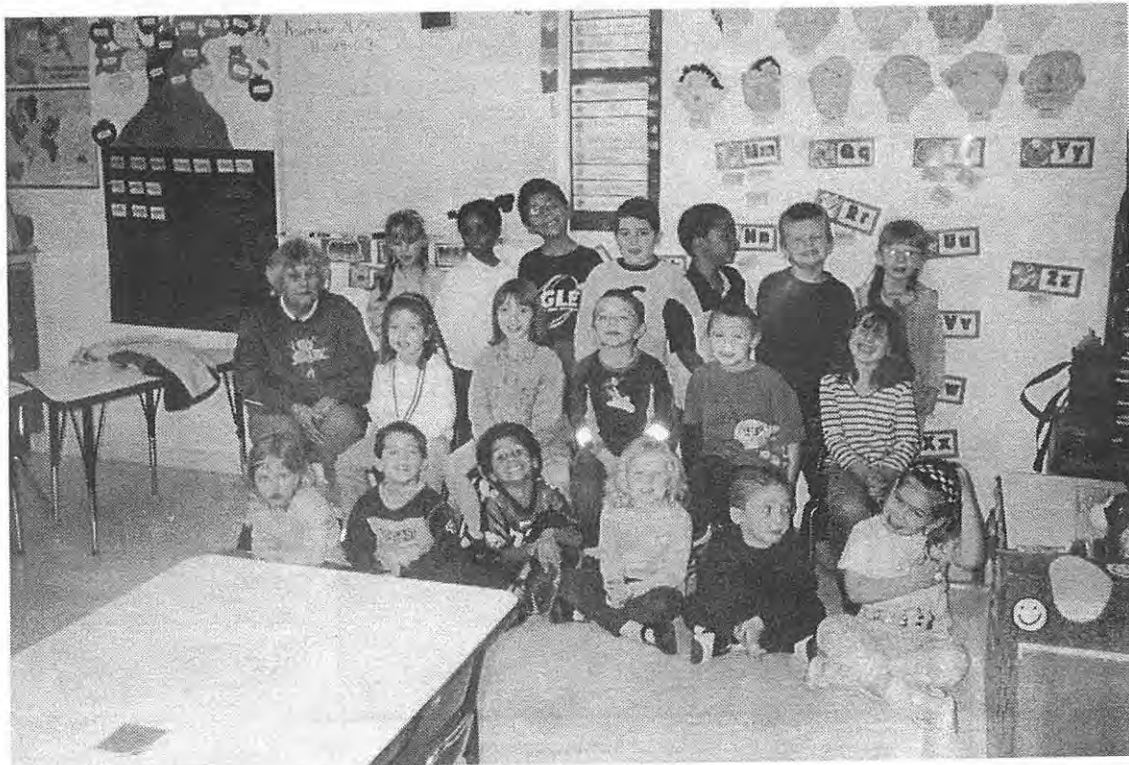


A Special Note

Soule Kindred Census Data Project

Project : FY 2004-2

Background: For several years, there has been discussion within our hierarchy and at several annual business meetings of the Soule Kindred, regarding the proposed "Electronification" of our Soule Kindred Archives. That idea has been partially instituted with the publication of our "Soule Kindred Index" and its associated Spouses Index and Soule (Other Surname) Index, on electronic CD-Rom computer media. The purpose of this article is to present to the Soule Kindred membership, ideas as to how the process of electronification might be expanded upon

Although the Soule Kindred Indices do a marvelous job of presenting pertinent facts about the descendants of George Soule; they are in no way, indicative of the total content of the Soule Kindred archives. There are several deficiencies that exist in that presentation: Two come immediately to mind: Vital Records Data and Census Data.

In several of the past Soule Kindred Newsletters, articles pertaining to Vital Records of several states have been reported, citing record of numerous of George Soule's descendants which have been previously reported by Soule Family Researchers, and proven as true George Soule Descendants. An even greater number of Vital Records have shown that there are literally thousands of George Soule's descendants which remain in the category of "Lost Soules" having never been researched or reported and therefore never catalogued into the Soule Kindred Archives.

The card files, letter files and loose-leaf notebook files of the Soule Kindred Archives contain untold numbers of pages of Federal Census records of every state in the United States, and of many State Censuses also, as these pages pertain to descendants of George Soule-Mayflower Pilgrim. In addition, the Mormon Churches Accelerated Indexing System, and several other commercial ventures have published census data on CD-Rom which contains the same census information contained within the Soule Kindred Archives. Soule Family data could easily be extracted from these sources into one electronic Data Base of solely Soule Family Census Data. Much work has been previously accomplished by some of our Soule Kindred members and further research is presently in progress.

The following eight pages will serve to present a general idea as to the Soule Kindred Census Data File. There are several premises under which these files are constructed:

1. All the surname spellings, which have been presented here are those which have been used interchangeably by census takers for Soule Family records. It will be noted that in one census the census taker may have used one surname spelling during one specific census and then he (or a successor) may have used a different surname spelling to enumerate the exact same person during a succeeding census. This sometimes occurred when there was a change of town, county or even state boundaries between censuses, or when people moved to an entirely new area.
2. These tables are merely the "Tip of the Soule Family Census Iceberg." They present only a few of the Soul/Sole* entries for each state, county and town with the several surname spellings associated with each one. They do indicate the numerical pattern of growth of Soule families and the western migration of our Soule families over the long period our countries history.
3. These tables are designed to be compatible with those of our Soule Kindred Archives, in that they will be "cross-referenced" to the Soule Kindred Indices in order to show where archives references already exist. This cross-referencing will take a tremendous amount of work.
